BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIRST MEETING, 1983 SESSION (1) January 3, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met for the first meeting of the 1983 session as required by law, at 9:00 A.M., Monday, January 3, 1983 in the Board of Supervisors Room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Chairman Burr being absent, it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke that Supervisor Harjes be Chairman for this meeting. Carried. Chairman Harjes then opened the meeting with the following other members present: Samelson, Radke.

Minutes of the December 28, 1982 meeting were read and approved.

There being no other business to come before the Board, it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to adjourn sine die.

The Board then recessed to the Courtroom for the swearing-in of the newly elected officials by Magistrate James Gailey. Upon completion of the ceremony, the Supervisors returned to the Board room for their organizational meeting.

For the first order of business, the County Auditor asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for 1983. Supervisor Samelson nominated Donald P. Harjes. There being no further nominations, Supervisor Radke moved that nominations cease and a unanimous ballot be cast for Donald P. Harjes as Chairman of the Board for 1983. Motion carried. Supervisor Harjes then took his position as Chairman of the Board. Also present for this meeting were Supervisors: Gustafson, Samelson, Padke Raker Absent. None Radke, Baker. Absent: None.

9:30 A.M. -- The time having arrived for the appointment with County Attorney Ritchie concerning bankrupt railroad taxes owed the county. The Chicago, Rock Island, Railroad owes approximately \$10,880.51 without penalty or interest, and the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad owes \$58,361.70 without penalty or interest. The Road Island has offered to settle for 90% of their amount while the Milwaukee case is before the Iowa Supreme Court for settlement. Attorney Ritchie presented a resolution prepared by the ISAC Attorney handling this case for the county. It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to concur with the Buena Vista County Conservation Board and to reappoint James Roberts, Albert City, for another 5 year term, term expiring 12-31-87, on the Conservation Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke authorizing payment of 2/3 of the medicines bill for one person (B.S.1-11-83) for 3 months from the Buckingham Trust, at which time the case will be re-evaluated. (1st meeting in April 1983). Ayes--all.

-- The time having arrived for the meeting to reconsider the insurance program for Buena Vista County. Present were Steve Stille, Tim Pierce, Bob Elmitt, Henry Kinney and Don Elk. Steve Stille stated that his proposal is still \$19,000.00 less that ISAC's. The coverages quoted included property, general property,

errors & ommissions, nursing home professional and comprehensive auto liability. Henry Kinney said there is not a \$19,000 difference if the variations are considered. After further consideration the entire board agreed to continue with the action already taken and stay with the ISAC program. They will again review the plans next fall when the policies terminate.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke authorizing the County Auditor to have the financial Reports for fiscal year 1981-82 printed by Bireline Printer, Newell, Iowa, they being the low bidder in the amount of \$835.00 for 500 booklets. Ayes--all.

John Demers presented his bill for seed corn and chemicals for the county farm operation. It is approximately 10% cheaper than last year. The county farm will continue to be farmed on a share-and-share alike basis.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to agree to pay the Probations Officers salaries as ordered by the Judge of the 3rd Judicial District, i.e. David W. Wilson \$22,162.00 per year effective 11-1-82 and Martin L. Apelt \$23,328.00 effective 1-2-1983. Ayes—all.

The amended proposed Supervisors rules were discussed. These will be distributed to the Department Heads for consideration and discussion prior to action.

R.O.W. Resolution

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson agreeing to pay 2½ times the assessed value when purchasing land for right-of-way during 1983, with acreages figured on the basis of the average price per acre of the 40 acres of which it is a part, and agreeing to pay \$8.00 per rod for woven wire, and \$6.00 per rod for barbed wire for fence removal. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRD MEETING, 1983 SESSION (3) January 25, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the January 11, 1983 meeting were read and approved.

Tom Frederiksen and Lloyd Galbraith approached the Board in regards to the county funding of a service officer to handle the needs of veterans in the county, possibly using revenue sharing funds to do this. The request was submitted in writing and will be considered when establishing the budget.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to reappoint Ralph Walter as Buena Vista County Weed Commissioner for 1983. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the use of Buckingham Trust funds for one person (MT-1-25-83) to obtain eyeglasses. Ayes--all.

Ed Crocker, on behalf of the Izaak Walton League, requested the Board to reconsider the "slough" bill because he felt that exemptions are needed to preserve the remaining wetlands and native prairie. Kim Carnine, Deputy County Assessor said the county is already granting exemptions on land designated by this bill as qualifying for exemption and the resolution was unnecessary. It was stated that the Board's action saves a lot of unnecessary paperwork. No further action was taken.

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the Public hearing on the proposed use of federal revenue sharing funds. Four persons were present for the hearing. Three requests were received, one being for \$25,000.00 to fund a full time veterans affairs office. Carl Bjork, Albert City, requested funding for the "Young at Heart" club in Albert City. They were granted \$500.00 in this current budget which was used in constructing a new front on their building in Albert City. This is separate from the Albert City Historical Society, and will be given consideration at budget time. John B. Anderson, Chairman of the County Board of Social Welfare requested funds to be used for general relief. More money the last year will probably be needed as more requests are being received. The Albert City Historical Society submitted a written request asking for consideration in the amount of \$1,000.00. The Buena Vista Historical Society submitted their budget but did not ask for a specific amount to be granted to them for the next fiscal year. Chairman Harjes thanked the people for attending the hearing and stated the requests would be considered along with others at budget time.

Betty Ohlund, Director of Gingerbread House, requested the Board to consider budgeting funds to help subsidize tuition for low-income children where the parents' income does not meet guidelines set by the Department of Social Services. This year the county budgeted \$10,000.00 and Mrs. Ohlund requests the same amount for 1983-84. This will be given consideration.

County Engineer Don Linnan reported that there were 4 minor personal injury accidents to Secondary Road personnel reported in 1982 but that none were "losttime" accidents under the Workers compensation program.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve and adopt the "Proposed Rules for The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County" dated January 24, 1983 as presented and on file in the Auditor's office. After discussion a roll call vote was taken with the results being as follows: Ayes—Baker, Gustafson. Nays—Radke, Samelson.

This being a tie vote, Chairman Harjes voted Aye to break the tie. Motion carried.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve the Treasurer's Semi-annual report, the first and second quarter County Auditor's report, the December 1982 Child Support Recovery, and the 2nd quarter Treasurer's, Veteran's Affairs, and Recorder's reports. Ayes--all.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FOURTH MEETING, 1983 SESSION (4) February 7 and 8, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson. The main purpose of this meeting was to review the department budgets presented for inclusion in the overall county budget for fiscal year 1983-84. The budgets were discussed in detail and at length. Chairman Harjes recessed the meeting at 1:30 P.M., until the following morning for the regularly scheduled meeting, with no action being taken.

9:00 A.M. Tuesday, February 8, 1983

Chairman Harjes reconvened the meeting with all members being present. Chairman Harjes then called for a vote on the proposed county budget for fiscal year 1983-84. Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke to approve for filing and publication the county budget for fiscal year 1983-84 and to hold the public hearing on the proposed budget in the Public Meeting Room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse at 1:30 P.M., on Tuesday, March 8, 1983 and to authorize the County Auditor to have the "Notice of Public Hearing" on the proposed county budget published in the official county newspapers during the week of February 20-26, 1983. This motion carried unanimously. Chairman Harjes then proceeded with the meeting as regularly scheduled.

Minutes of the January 25, 1983 meeting were read and approved.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson authorizing the installation of a set of double doors at the east entrance (ramp entrance) of the Courthouse by Northwest Glass Company, Spencer, Iowa at a cost of \$3,315.00 installed. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke authorizing the purchase of a Sharp SF 820 reduction copier for use in the Auditor's office from Iowa Office Supply, Storm Lake at a cost of \$4,135.40. The vote was: Ayes--Radke, Samelson. Nays: Baker, Gustafson. This being a tie vote, Harjes voted Aye to break the tie and the motion carried.

The various Department Heads appeared to inquire about what procedures they were to follow according to the adopted Supervisors rules and to learn what guidelines were to be followed when purchasing supplies and equipment and in attending schools of instruction. This was discussed at length, whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson that the recently adopted Rules for Supervisors be rescinded and stricken from the record and that the Secretary conduct a roll call vote. The roll call vote was: Baker: No. Gustafson: No. Samelson: Aye. Radke: Aye. Harjes: No. The motion was defeated.

John Galbraith, Buena Vista County Sheriff, and Grace Weaver, representing the City of Marathon, presented an addendum to the present law enforcement contract and a proposed new 4 year contract between the County and the City of Marathon for the furnishing of law enforcement. It was then moved by Gustafson, seconded by Baker to approve the addendum to the present contract granting a 5% increase to the Marathon Deputy effective February 1, 1983 to be paid by the City of Marathon, resulting in equal pay for all county Deputy Sheriffs. Ayes—all. The 4 year contract will be presented to the Marathon City Council for approval and signature before being signed by the county.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to accept and readmit one resident (AR-2-8-83) at the Care Facility as of this date. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke to continue funding one person (MD2-8-83) at Goodwill Industries, Sioux City, Iowa for further training for up to 6 months. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve the 2nd quarter report on farm-to-market funds, and the January reports for Clerk's fees, ADTU. and Public Health Nursing. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker authorizing the Chairman to sign 6 agreements with the City of Storm Lake granting road crossings at various locations as follows:

- 1. 24" force main to convey city wastewater to sewage treatment plant E-W-Blacktop between Sections 13 and 14 Hayes Township along the centerline of abandoned RR ROW.
- 2. 24" force main to convey city wastewater to the new sewage treatment plant in county road (gravel surface) between Sections 12 and 13 Hayes Township along the centerline of abandoned RR ROW.
- 3. 24" force main to convey city wastewater to sewage treatment plant N-S County blacktop road between Sections 11 and 12 Hayes Township along centerline of abandoned RR ROW.

MATT PARROTT & BONS CO., WATERLOO, IOWA 78-0160

- 4. 6" force main to convey city wastewater to the new sewage treatment plant from Cedar Street at Lakeside and running approximately 150' North and 35" East of the centerline of Lakeside Blacktop between Sections 11 and 12 Hayes Township.
- 5. 6" water main to convey city water to the new sewage treatment E-W blacktop between Sections 13 and 24 Hayes Township 45' west of abandoned RR ROW centerline.
- 6. 6" water main to convey city water to the new sewage treatment plant crossing the Lakeside blacktop at Cedar Street in Lakeside between Sections 11 and 12 Hayes Township.

This motion was approved unanimously.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson to adjust the rental rates for secondary road equipment as per the schedule on file in the Auditor's and County Engineer's offices and to update the charges and minimum sizes for construction of farm field driveways and dirt fill. Ayes--all.

Greg Anliker and Rose Haar, representing the Iowa Lakes Area Council on Aging presented their annual report and also reported on the "Senior Transit Services" in Area III. They requested funding in the same amount for the fiscal year 1983-84.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the February 22, 1983 meeting were read and approved.

9:00 A.M. -- The time having arrived for the canvass of the special franchise election for the City of Newell, Iowa to determine if a Cable TV franchise should be granted to Midlands Cable Systems of Papillion, Nebraska. The canvass being completed, it was moved by Baker, seconded by Samelson that the results be declared as follows: Total votes cast--200. Yes--195 No--5. Therefore the election

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on the proposed 1983-84 budget for Buena Vista County. There was present a quorum as required by law. The Board found that the notice of the time and place of hearing had been published as directed in the official newspapers of the county during the week of February 20-26, 1983. There were twenty-two persons present for the hearing. hearing all taxpayers desiring to be heard, it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson that the 1983-84 budget be adopted as proposed and on file in the Auditor's office. It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker to approve the February reports of ADTU and Magistrate

3:00 P.M.--The time having arrived for the Public hearing concerning the filing of a Community Development Block Grant Application for the purpose of assisting the Buena Vista Work Activities Center in providing a new facility. 5 persons were present for the hearing. Roger Sarchet made a comparison between this application and the one for last year. There being no further comments it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to grant the approval for the application for the block grant, to be filed with the Iowa Office for Planning and Programming. Ayes—all.

Ken Mauer of Mauer Construction requested permission to bid on gravel stockpiling. The board will take his request under advisement.

Kim Burhop, General Relief Director, asked what the appeal procedure is for a client to appeal the denial for a request for assistance. This may be done by having the client make an appointment to see the Board of Supervisors.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SEVENTH MEETING, 1983 SESSION (7) March 22, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the March 8, 1983 meeting were read and approved.

Darlene Wise, representing UDMO, discussed the Workfare program. Liability insurance coverage delayed the implementation of the program, however the program is now in operation with 14 persons presently employed, at a cost to the county of \$11.50 per week per participant. Whereupon it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker to continue with the program until June 30th, and to authorize the Chairman to sign for all programs. Ayes--all.

Veterans Affairs Commissioner Tom Frederiksen, Ken Oleson and 4 other persons presented a letter requesting a Service Officer and office space for Veterans Affairs. Jim Browser is a service officer volunteer from Cherokee County and services about 7 counties from his home. Clay, Woodbury and Webster counties have a full time service officer. The Board decided to talk with other counties before reaching a decision.

Robert Potter requested reconsideration for General Relief. The General Relief Director did not grant his request for help in payment of a hospital bill in the amount of \$1,619.25. A Storm Lake Doctor referred him to a specialist who entered him in a hospital for examination where he did not receive relief. Mr. Potter is presently going to a Chiropractor and is obtaining some relief. After hearing the case as presented, the Board denied the appeal on the grounds that there is no proof of disability.

Eldon Rossow, MER Engineering, and four Lakeside City Council members approached the Board in regards to drainage problems concerning the city of Lakeside. They are thinking of using G. O. Bonds to finance a project to eliminate the flooding. They would like to use the county road ditch to divert some of the water. The Board wants further study before making a decision.

A letter from Dennis Anderson requesting use of county grounds at Marathon as a staging area for the Centennial was received. Permission was granted provided that it was not too wet and that any damage was repaired by them.

The Board rejected the fact-finder's report on the Care Facility negotiations. They informed the county representative to start negotiations for binding arbitration as soon as possible.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to approve the February reports of Public Health Nursing, Board of Health, NWIPDC, Child Support Recovery, County Farm and Care Facility. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the Contractors bonds for Maudlin Construction Co., Webster City, Iowa in the amount of \$20,160 and \$158,400. Ayes-all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve the application of Little Sioux Golff & Country Club for a Class "A" liquor license and Sunday Sales premit. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to approve the Cigarette permit for Crossroads Motel & Lounge. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the application of Storm Lake Municipal Golf Course for a Class "C" liquor license and Sunday sales permit. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign the 1983 contract with the Northwest Iowa Mental Health Center. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker to appoint Vivian Keister, Storm Lake, to the Northwest Iowa Mental Health Advisory Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke to amend the Supervisors Rules adopted 1-25-83 by inserting the word "special" between "of" and "agenda" in paragraph 4 of rule 5 so it would read thusly: "establishment of special agenda items for the, etc." Motion carried.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Baker to approve the application of Buena Vista R.E.C. for underground construction on the north side of sections of 27 and 28 Brooke twp. and on the west side of sections 28 and 33 Brooke twp. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker to approve the application of Northwestern Bell Telephone Co. for underground construction in the ditch on the north side of Section 22-91-37. Ayes--all.

- Recorder's office: Shirley Anderson to continue receiving 80% of Recorder's salary.

 Lona Yender to receive a 4% increase effective 1-1-83.
- Clerk of Court: Brenda Otto and Shirley Engebretson to continue receiving 80% of Clerk's salary. Sheri Shattuck to receive 2% plus \$280.00 per year effective 1-1-83 and an additional 3% on 7-1-83. Eleanor Dicks to receive an additional 4% effective 1-1-83. Carl Estes is to continue receiving \$25.00 per day worked.
- Treasurer's office: Janet Rosenbrook is to continue receiving 80% of the Treasurer's salary. Kathleen Bach is to receive 71% of the Treasurer's salary until July 1, 1983 and 75% thereafter. James O. Nelson, Buena Vista County Hospital Administrator, met with the Board to inform them as to what is being done at the Hospital and what they expect in the foreseeable future. This concerns the handling of indigents as well as the general operation. The hospital is licensed for 70 beds. Mr. Nelson believes in the 'wellness' program, i.e., keeping people well rather than just treating the sick. Cooperation and attitude is excellent at the hospital now.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING NENETEENTH MEETING, 1983 SESSION (19) July 12, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. for the first meeting in Fiscal Year 1983-84. Chairman Harjes presided with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samuelson.

Minutes of the June 28th and 30th meeting were read, corrected, and approved.

This being the first meeting in Fiscal Year 1983-84, a motion was made by Samelson, seconded by Baker to authorize the County Auditor to appropriate the county funds as budgeted for FY 1983-84 to the designated county funds for expenditure and also the Federal Revenue Sharing Funds as designated in the budget for expenditure for the 1983-84 budget. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke authorizing the County Auditor to issue warrants in the amount of 100% of the Domestic Animal claims approved for Fiscal Year 1982-83 as shown on the claims, the total amount of these claims being \$3,176.34, and to authorize a claim in the amount of \$146.60 to be paid to the assessment fund from the Domestic Animal Fund to comply with Section 351.15 Code of Iowa. It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to suspend taxes on Lot 3, Block 1 O.L.Hesla's Addition, Linn Grove Corp. in the name of Hattle E. John, as of this date. Ayes—all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign the application for Land Use Inventory Financial Assistance in the amount of \$1,000.00. Ayes--all.

John Demers of Demers Farms presented a claim for \$3,310.20 due for the 1983 crop season. He explained the procedures followed and what to expect in the way of returns this year.

BUENA VISTA COUNTY ORDINANCE #2

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the third and final reading of Buena Vista Ordinance #2 to become effective upon the publication of the ordinance in this set of Board Minutes, as follows:

Ordinance Repealing Ordinance 1A

- Section 1 Purpose. This Ordinance repeals Ordinance #1A adopted April 24, 1979. Code of Iowa, Chapter 331.302(5) will then be the procedure followed in adopting Buena Vista County Ordinances.
- Section 2 Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law. This meeting constitutes the first hearing, and the publication requirements are met by publishing the Board of Supervisors' mintues containing this ordinance in all official papers.

Approved 6-14-83, 6-28-83, 7-12-83. Effective upon publication of these board minutes.

RESOLUTION

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson that WHEREAS House File 201 passed by the State Legislature in the session just completed states that signatures are no longer required on claims submitted for payment to the county, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that signatures are no longer required on Buena Vista County Calims when submitted upon a clearly designated form or letterhead identifying the claimant, and approved by the Department Head involved. The vote on this resolution being Ayes--all, Resolution carried.

Two Burroughs representatives and 7 other persons from the various offices in the courthouse who are interested in using the courthouse computer related the need for a larger computer in the courthouse, this being a Burroughs B1900 at a cost of \$85,083.40. New offices want to be connected, and new programs installed for use. The present B800 is not large enough to be available to all who want to use it at the same time, this results in a greater response time being used in order to obtain information from the computer. After discussion, it was moved by Samelson to purchase a Burroughs B1900 computer at a cost of \$85,083.40. Chairman Harjes asked for a second to the motion. Hearing none he again asked for a second. There being none the motion died for lack of a second. This resulted in the request being denied.

Byron Yaffee, an Arbitrator from Madison, Wisconsin will meet with the representatives from the Union and from the Care Facility to settle a grievance concerning holiday pay for part-time Care Facility employees. This meeting is to be at 10:30 A.M., Thursday, July 14, 1983 in the courthouse Public Meeting Room.

A discussion concerning the need for a county public road right-of-way ordinance based on the sample submitted by Sioux County followed. Terry Larson, ISAC staff person, recommended some changes be made, WHEREUPON it was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke that the following Buena Vista County Ordinance #3 be adopted, this being the first reading:

BUENA VISTA COUNTY ORDINANCE #3

TITLE: PUBLIC ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY ORDINANCE OF BUENA VISTA COUNTY

Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa:

- Section 1. Purpose. This ordinance prohibits the removal of gravel from and the obstruction and tillage of public road rights-of-way in Buena Vista County in order to facilitate the care and maintenance of same and protect the public health and safety and provides a penalty.
- Section 2. Definitions. For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows: "Public Road Right-of-Way" shall mean the land area, the right to possession of which, is secured or reserved by the governmental authority for roadway purposes.
- Section 3. Obstructions. No person shall erect any fence or other obstruction on any portion of a

<u>Debris</u>, <u>Trash and Garbage</u>. No person shall deposit any debris, trash and/or garbage on any portion of a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County.

<u>Snow</u>. No person shall deposit snow which has been removed from an adjoining property onto Section 4.

portion of a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County, provided, that no person shall be deemed to have violated this section unless such snow has been deposited on the traveled portion of the highway or piled in the road ditch to a level higher that two (2) feet above the level of the traveled portion or within thirty (30) feet of a sign post or

<u>Tillage</u>. No person, except Buena Vista County road workers, contractors with Buena Vista County, or those granted permits, shall till or in any way disturb the soil on any portion of public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County. Section 6.

Section 7. Removal of Gravel. No person shall remove gravel or any surfacing materials from any portion of any public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County unless authorized to do so by the Buena Vista County Board or its designees.

Other Obstructions. Any obstructions on or disturbances to a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista not provided for in Sections 3,4,5,6, and 7 of this ordinance are hereby Section 8. prohibited.

Grazing and Harvesting. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to persons using public road right-of-ways for grazing and harvesting of grasses and legumes so long as such activities do not disturb the topsoil on said public road right-of-ways. Section 9.

Section 10. Penalty. Any person found in violation of this ordinance shall be guilty of a simple mis-

Section 11. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this

ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Severability Clause</u>. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, the balance of the ordinance shall not be considered invalid Section 12. Severability Clause. or unconstitutional.

Section 13. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to grant the request of the County Attorney and to pay Assistant County Attorney an annual salary in the amount of \$15,400.00 for fiscal year 1983-84, effective as of July 1, 1983. It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Baker to approve the 3rd and final reading of Buena Vista County Ordinance #3, with the ordinance to become effective upon publication of these minutes in the official county newspapers, as follows:

BUENA VISTA COUNTY ORDINANCE #3

TITLE: PUBLIC ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY ORDINANCE OF BUENA VISTA COUNTY

- Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa:
 Section 1 Purpose. This ordinance prohibits the removal of gravel from and the obstruction and tillage of public road rights-of-way in Buena Vista County in order to facilitate the care and maintenance of same and protect the public health and safety and provides a penalty.
- Section 2 Definitions. For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows: "Public Road Right-of-way" shall mean the land area, the right to possession of which, is secured or reserved by the governmental authority for roadway purposes.
- Section 3 Obstructions. No person shall erect any fence or other obstruction on any portion of a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County except for those fences forming boundaries between public rights-of-way and abutting properties.
- Section 4 Debris, Trash, and Garbage. No person shall deposit any debris, trash and/or garbage on any portion of a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County.

 Section 5 Snow. No person shall deposit snow which has been removed from an adjoining property
- onto any portion of the public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County, provided, that no person shall be deemed to have violated this section unless such snow has been deposited on the traveled portion of the highway or piled in the road ditch to a level higher than two (2) feet above the level of the traveled portion or within thirty (30) feet of a sign post or mailbox support.
- Tillage. No person, except Buena Vista County road workers, contractors with Buena Vista Section 6 -County, or those granted permits, shall till or in any way disturb the soil on any portion of public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County.
- Removal of Gravel. No person shall remove gravel or any surfacing materials from any por Section 7 tion of any public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County unless authorized to do so by the Buena Vista County Board or its designees.
- Section 8 Other Obstructions. Any obstructions on or disturbances to a public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County not provided for in Sections 3,4,5,6, and 7 of this ordinance are hereby prohibited.
- Section 9 Grazing and Harvesting. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to persons using public road right-of-ways for grazing and harvesting of grasses and legumes so long as such activities do not disturb the topsoil on said public road rights-of-ways.

Section 10 - Penalty. Any person found in violation of this ordinance shall be guilty of a simple misdemeanor.

Section 11 - Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 12 - Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, the balance of the ordinance shall not be considered invalid Section 13 - Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and

publication as provided by law.

This ordinance carried unanimously.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING TWENTY-FIFTH MEETING, 1983 SESSION (25) September 6, 1983

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the August 23rd meeting were read and approved.

The Board journeyed to Sioux Rapids on Monday, August 29th to meet with Dr. Kleaveland, Larry Anderson and Glen Hart, and to view the site on D.D.14-42 Joint with Clay County which had been petitioned for repair or improvement. The County Sheriff will attend a demonstration dinner at Estherville showing the use of canned-dried foods having a two year shelf life, available for prisoners meals if desired.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Custodian Rollin Sievers requested permission to purchase a new lawn tractor for mowing and snow removal. The tractor he is presently using is showing signs of wear. Permission was given.

10:30 A.M. -- The time having arrived for the awarding of insurance contracts for 1984. Chairman Harjes opened the discussion by asking those present if they had a statement to make. Steve Stille stated that he was there to answer questions and that he had Frank Nies from Northwestern National with him. He stated that their company is on a "claims made" basis rather than an "occurrence" basis. Dave Murphy, ISAC Risk Manager was there on behalf of the Board of Supervisors to see that the bids met specifications. Mike Sharar stated that their Error & Ommissions policy had a \$1,500.00 deductible and allowed no moonlighting coverage. Don Elk stated that his boiler policy was based on the replacement cost of the building containing the boiler. Pam Elmitt stated that their policy complied with section 613A Code of Iowa and was on an "occurrence" basis and that they have to indemnify all county employees. Dave Murphy stated that he drew up the specifications under the Board's guidance and that they should consider only the original bids opened on November 29th. Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Radke to award the insurance contracts to ISAC for divisions 1,2,6,7,8,9,10.
