BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIRST MEETING, 1984 SESSION (1) January 3, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met for the first meeting of the 1984 session as required by law, at 9:00 A.M., Tuesday, January 3, 1984 in the Board of Supervisors room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Chairman Harjes presided with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the December 27th and 28th, 1983 meetings were read, corrected and approved.

There being no old business to come before the Board, it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the meeting adjourn sine die. Carried.

For the first order of business of the new 1984 session, the County Auditor asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for 1984. Supervisor Samelson nominated Supervisor Harjes. This was seconded by Supervisor Radke. There being no further nominations it was moved by Radke that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Supervisor Harjes for Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for 1984. This motion carried unanimously. Supervisor Harjes then resumed his position as Chairman of the Board.

The next order of business was the appointment of Committees for 1984. Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson that the following appointments be approved:

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson to concur with the local Board of Health and reappoint Dr. Bruce Vander Kooi to a 3 year term on the Local Board of Health, term expiring 12-31-88. Aves--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke authorizing the Chairman to sign the approval form for proposed repairs on D.D. # 16-30-92. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke that the Buena Vista County Journal and the Storm Lake Pilot-Tribune be designated one full official newspaper each and that the Storm Lake Register and the Sioux Rapids Bulletin-Press share equally the amount due one full official paper for the year 1984. Ayes--all.

Depository Resolution

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson that the Depository Banks currently being used by the Treasurer, Recorder, Auditor, Sheriff, Care Facility, and the Clerk of Court continue to be used during 1984 in the same amounts as stated, and that the appropriate elected official be, and is hereby authorized to deposit the designated office funds in amounts not to exceed in the aggregate the amounts named for said bank. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Baker that the Federal Depository Bank, being designated for two years, shall continue to be the Citizens First National Bank, Storm Lake, Iowa for 1984, which is the second year. Ayes--all.

Resolution

A motion was made by Baker, seconded by Gustafson that the following resolution be adopted:
BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Auditor be, and is hereby, authorized to issue county warrants in
payment of salaries for all county employees in the office of the County Auditor, Treasurer, Clerk
of Court, Recorder, Sheriff, Care Facility, all utility bills, express and freight charges, emergency
welfare claims, bounties, state tax on fuel, salaries of all employed personnel in the County Engineer's office and shop, claims that allow a discount if paid by a certain date, and cash allowances when necessary without special authorization of the Board of Supervisors. This resolution carried unanimously.

Holiday, Vacation, and Sick Leave Policy

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson that the Buena Vista County Personnel Policy, as

the governing policy for all Buena Vista County employees under the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors for Buena vsita County. Ayes--all.

Bounties

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson that Buena Vista County continue to pay bounties during 1984 in the amount of 25 cents for each front pair of feet and claws from pocket Gophers. Ayes-all.

Dog License Resolution

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Baker that, WHEREAS, the law provides that the taxes of the county, and the several municipalities therein, shall be levied by the Board of Supervisors and made a record thereof, BE IT RESOLVED, that a tax of \$4.00 be levied on each male and female dog, and \$2.00 for each spayed female or neutered male dog for the year 1984. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker that Donald D. Linnan be reappointed County Engineer of Buena Vista County for the year 1984 and that he be and is hereby designated and empowered on behalf of the Board of Supervisors of said county to execute the Certification of Completion of work and Final Acceptance thereof, in accordance with the plans, and specifications therefor in connection with all Farm-to-Market construction projects in this county. The salary is to continue at the current rate. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker that Darel D. Burns be reappointed Drainage Engineer and assistant County Engineer for 1984, with his salary to continue at the current rate. Ayes--all.

Acquisition of Right-of-Way

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson that in order to comply with the provisions of the 1970 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Land Acquisition Policies Act, Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County furnishes the following assurances to the Iowa Department of Transportation: 1. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to acquire right-of-way in accord with Title III of said 1970 Act and applicable state laws. 2. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to provide relocation assistance benefits in accord with Title II of 1970 Act and applicable state laws. 3. The above named county will contact the Iowa Department of Transportation for assistance as needed to assure compliance with applicable laws which are summarized in the instructions entitled "Right-of-Way Acquisition" which is Instructional Memorandum 3.31. Ayes-all.

Resolution

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke authorizing the County Engineer to close any and all county roads on which construction is proposed, in order to facilitate construction, and for the duration of the construction, and to close any county road for necessary maintenance, repair, and to mark all detours, as necessary, without requiring any further authorization, and furthermore to be authorized to issue and sign special permits for the movement of vehicles of excessive size and weight upon Buena Vista County Secondary Roads in accordance with Chapter 321E Code of Iowa. Ayes--all.

R.O.W. Resolution

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to purchase right-of-way at 3 times the assessed land value during 1984 and to pay \$2.00 per rod for removal and \$4.00 per rod for replacement of barbed wire fencing and to pay \$2.50 per rod for removal and \$5.50 per rod for replacement of woven wire fencing with the replacement having to be within 18 months from the completion of the project. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Baker that the proposed Use Hearing of Federal Revenue Sharing Money for fiscal Year 1984-85 be held Tuesday, January 17, 1984 at 1:00 P.M. in the Public Meeting Room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve the December ADTU and Care Facility residents reports. Ayes—all.

It was tentatively decided to have the Tax sale at 10:30 A.M. on Tuesday, January 31, 1984 but that there would have to be a public hearing first. Whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Baker that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS, Buena Vista County, Iowa owns the following-described real estate: 1. One-half acre in the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (NWASEA) Section Three, Township Ninety-Three, Range Thirty-Eight (3-93-38) more particularly described as beginning at the northwest corner of the south one-half of the southeast quarter, thence north two rods, east forty rods, south two rods, and west to beginning containing one-half acre. 2. Strip sixty-six feet wide being a part of the former Railroad Avenue and adjacent to Lots Nine and Ten, Block One, Outcalt's Addition to the City of Rembrandt. 3. Lot four and the south twelve feet and the north twenty-five feet Lot three Hesla and Anderson's 1904 Addition, City of Linn Grove.., Iowa; and WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of Buena Vista County to sell said property; and WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors proposes to sell said property at public auction; BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, that a public hearing on the above proposal to sell said real estate be held on the 10th day of January, 1984, at 1:00 o'clock P.M. at the Boardroom of the Buena Vista County Courthouse at Storm Lake, Iowa. The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the January 3, 1984 meeting were read and approved.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to reappoint Keith Baker as the Buena Vista County representative on the SDA 3 Consortium Board (JTPA). Ayes—all.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Samelson to concur with the Marathon Library Board and to appoint Sandi Neary to serve as a rural representative on the Marathon Library Board. Ayes--all.

Two members of the Alta High School Government Class were present to observe the functioning of the Board of Supervisors.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to approve the December reports of Clerk's fees and Public Health Nursing; 2nd quarter FY 1983-84 Board of Health and Sheriff; Annual report of the Buena Vista Work Activity Center and county extension service. Ayes--all.

1:00 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the public hearing on the proposed tax sale of property. One person was present for the hearing. After much discussion one parcel was temporarily withdrawn from sale due to the City of Linn Grove wanting to duscuss with their city Attorney first. It was then moved by Baker, seconded by Radke that WEREAS, the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors proposes to sell the following-described property owned by Buena Vista County: 1. One-Half (½) Acre in the Northwest Quarter (NW4) of the Southeast Quarter (SC4), Section Three (3), Township Ninety-Three (93), Range Thirty-Eight (38), more particularly described as beginning at the Northwest (NW) Corner of the South One-Half (S½) of the Southeast Quarter (SC4), Thence North (N) Two Rods, East (E) Forty (40) Rods, South (S) Two Rods, and West (W) to beginning containing One-Half (½) Acre. 2. Strip Sixty-Six Feet (66') wide being a part of the former Railroad Avenue and adjacent to Lots Nine and Ten (9 & 10), Block One (1), Outcalt's Addition to the City of Rembrandt, Iowa, and WHEREAS a public hearing on said proposal was held on the 10th day of January, 1984; and WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the County to sell said real estate; BE IT RESOLWED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, that the above-described real estate be offered for sale at public auction on the 31st day of January, 1984 at 10:30 o'clock A.M. at the Boardroom of the Buena Vista County Courthouse, Storm Lake, Iowa. George Stevenson, representing self-funding insurance with whom the city of Storm Lake and Clay County are presently insured inquired about the county insurance. He was given permission to view our claims experience and to submit a program when ready.

Larry Sorenson, Buena Vista Work Activity Center Director asked the Board for support in obtaining a Community Block Grant to obtain a new facility. Whereupon it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to support the block grant and to hold a public hearing on Tuesday, January 17, 1984 at 2:45 P.M. in the Board of Supervisors Room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse concerning the filing of a Community Block Grant application for the purpose of assisting the Buena Vista Work Activity Center in obtaining a new facility. Ayes—all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson to appoint Rollin Sievers as the Buena Vista County designated handicapped regulations compliance coordinator for the courthouse. Ayes--all. It was further agreed to adopt the following policy:

POLICY OF NONDISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF HANDICAPPED STATUS

The County of Buena Vista, Iowa does not discriminate on the basis of handicapped status in the admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its programs or activities. Rollin Sievers has been designated to coordinate compliance with the nondiscrimination requirements contained in section 51.55 of the revenue sharing regulations.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke quthorizing the Chairman to sign a private contract with Jensen spraying in the amount of \$17,563.00 for the 1984 mixing and applying of Weed Chemicals for readside spraying. Ayes--all.

11:00 A.M. -- The time having arrived for the meeting with the Communications Center Board. 10 persons were present for the meeting. Chairman Harjes informed the board that the Supervisors withdrew from the Communications Board because the 28E Agreement was not being abided by. Rollin Sievers, Buena Vista County Handicapped Compliance Officer, reported on what needs to be done to comply with Federal Revenue Sharing Handicapped regulations. A self evaluation of all programs and policies and practices to identify areas of noncompliance; make nonstructural changes for accessibility; and prepare a transition plan if structural changes are needed. By October 17, 1986 the structural changes needed for accessibility are to be completed.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Samelson to approve the June and July Care Facility and County Farm reports; the December Clerk's Fees, filing fees & postage, and Child Support Recovery; the 2nd quarter FY 84-85 Recorder, Veteran's Affairs, Clerk's Fees, Care Review Committee; the semi-annual report of the County Treasurer, and the annual report for the Iowa Lakes Area Agency on Aging. The guidelines set forth in the Buena Vista County Poor Fund Manual were discussed at length. WHEREAS the Court Reorganization Act of 1983 (Chapter 186, 1983 lowa Acts) became effective July 1, 1983, with the intent of achieving a more equitable distribution of the costs related to the operation of the Courts by shifting most Court-related expenses from funding by local property taxes to funding by State General Fund revenues; and

WHEREAS that Act now provides for an orderly transition to State funding by Court component over a five-year period on a fixed timetable, while simultaneously providing for a shift of Court system revenues from the counties to the State; and

WHEREAS pursuant to that Act, 20% of the revenues formerly received by the counties have already been diverted to the State since July 1, 1983, and another 20% of the remaining Court system revenues now received by the counties are scheduled to be diverted to the State beginning July 1, 1984 and

WHEREAS the costs of Court Reporters are scheduled to be assumed by the State on July 1, 1984, at the costs of Court Attendants (Bailiffs) are scheduled to be assumed by the State on January 1, 1985 - both during this coming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS it appears possible some effort may be made by the General Assembly to postpone State assumption of all or part of those costs, with no remittance to the counties of revenues already collected by the State to fund assumption of such costs, and/or no delay in State diversion of additional Court system revenues from the counties to the State on July 1, 1984; and

WHEREAS county budget processes for the next fiscal year are nearly finalized and the counties no longer possess any statutory authority to budget or levy property taxes to pay for the costs of Court Reporters or Court Attendants (the latter for six months); and

WHEREAS any delay in State assumption of such costs would likely require the counties to borrow the necessary funds, at interest, to pay such costs, which action would force a higher levy on property taxes the following fiscal year in order to repay such borrowed funds; and

WHEREAS it would be contrary to the policy of "fair play" between the State and the counties to delay State assumption of such costs on the timetable now established by law while continuing to divert Court system revenues from the counties to the State Treasury to be used for purposes other than those for which those revenues were originally intended:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF BUENA VISTA COUNTY, IOWA:

That the General Assembly be advised of our determination to support State assumption of the costs related to the operation of the Courts on the timetable now established by law,

July 1, 1984: Court Reporters;

January 1, 1985: Court Attendants;
July 1, 1985: Juvenile Court personnel:
July 1, 1986: Clerks of Court; and
July 1, 1987: Indigent Defense (including Public Defender expense).

2. That the lowa State Association of Counties be similarly advised and urged to establish such a policy as its first legislative priority.

That this Board of Supervisors hereby establishes, of record, that the State assumption of the costs related to the operation of the Courts on the timetable now established by law is its first legislative priority.

The County Auditor is directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to each legislator resident within Buena Vista County, to the Iowa State Association of Counties, to the Speaker of the House, to the President of the Senate, and to the Governor, and to the State Court Administrator. Dated this 20th day of March, 1984. This resolution carrried unanimously.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Corwin Ritchie, County Attorney, met with the Board to discuss institutional accounts and how they should be handled. After a lengthy discussion it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Baker that, in reference to Chapter 230 of the lowa Code, which deals with Mental Health, that all accounts prior to January 1, 1984 be forgiven as of this date and, that all the billings received since that date be reviewed, and henceforth all accounts listed on abstracts dealing with mental health be indexed and and statements sent as soon as possible to the persons receiving treatment, after being approved by the Board of Supervisors. The vote on this motion was: Ayes--Baker, Gustafson, Samelson. Nays--Radke. Carried. It was then moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson that all accounts be reviewed annually and judgments filed accordingly. The vote on this motion was Ayes--all.

Further discussion followed in which Radke stated that he thought all accounts prior to January 1, 1984 should be reviewed before forgiving. Baker said the decision would not be an easy one but that they must have a viable bill with which to work. Harjes stated he felt that the date should have been July 1, 1984. Gustafson stated that substance abuse accounts should be billed for everything. Samelson stated that this date should be January 1, 1984 also. Whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the above mental health resolution be rescinded. This motion was defeated with the vote being: Ayes--Radke, Gustafson. Nays--Baker, Samelson, Harjes. The question of Substance Abuse was tabled for this meeting.

Darlene Peterson, Buena Vista County Nurse, discussed the newly revised county personnel policy and the fact that the Board of Health did not agree with the portion concerning health screening and physicals. They feel that the pre-employment physical should be done by a licensed physician of the person's own choice and paid for by the county. Whereupon it was moved by Baker seconded by Gustafson to amend page 8, section 3.9 of the Personnel Policy by deleting the present section and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "an applicant who has been interviewed and chosen for a full time position shall be required to pass a physical examination which will be provided free of charge by the county. It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve the application of Heritage Cablevision, Inc. to bury TV cable in the north shoulder of the road from the tower access road west for 3,714' to a point 2,395' west of the southwest corner of Section 36, Washington Township. Ayes--all.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the June 5th, 11th, 12th, and 19th meetings were read, corrected, and approved.

The County Treasurer explained that new legislation going into effect July 1, 1984 changed the method of providing security for public funds. Currently it is protected by a state "sinking fund", henceforth the financial institutions used as depositories will have to pledge assets, or use a surety bond. It is also necessary for the Board to sign a resolution of approval for each depository. Mrs. Roberts also requested reconsideration for the salaries of the three clerks in her office. No action was taken on the request.

Ron Wilson, County Disaster Services Director, inquired as to how the \$20,000.00 allocated in the current Communications Center budget will be transferred to the 1984-85 budget so that it can be used for the planned new construction. This has to be done by action of the County Communications Board as the Board is being phased out July 1, 1984.

Corwin Ritchie, County Attorney, requested reconsideration of the salary for his secretary which was "frozen" last week. He related that the workload has increased 310% for OWI and 290% for indictable cases. He is asking for a 4% increase for his part-time secretary. Next year he will probably be asking for a full-time secretary. After due consideration it was moved by Baker, seconded by Samelson to grant a 4% increase for Linda McShane for Fiscal year 1984-85. Ayes--all.

Darlene Wise, UDMO Director, stated that currently there are 7 persons on the ADC-UP program (aid to dependent children-unemployed parents). She requested renewal of the 'work-fare' contract. Where-upon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to renew the contract for fiscal year 1984-85 with UDMO and authorized the Chairman to sign same. Ayes--all.

JULY 10, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Baker, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the June 26th and 29th meetings and the July 2, 1984 meeting were read and approved.

This being the first meeting for fiscal year 1984-85, a motion was made by Baker, seconded by Radke authorizing the County Auditor to appropriate the county funds as budgeted for fiscal year 1984-85 to the designated county funds for expenditure and to also appropriate the Federal Revenue Sharing funds as designated in the budget for expenditure in the 1984-85 budget. Ayes--all.

A letter was received from the County Assessor's office stating that the abandoned railroad right-of-way for the Chicago & Northwestern Transportation Co. reverts back to the adjacent property owners in some instances, which increases the taxable acres for 4 parcels belonging to Buena Vista County. These parcels being #12018.75 and 12018.85 in Brooke Township; #9014.85 and 9016.85 in Lee Township. The Auditor was directed to make the necessary changes in the tax records.

The new mower purchased by Secondary Roads came with some wrong parts, therefore \$1,000.00 will be withheld until the correct parts arrive.

A report on the cost of providing suitable water at the Care Facility was submitted. It will be discussed with the City and their engineers as to the possibility of obtaining city water for use at the Care Facility. The inspection report on the boilers at the Care Facility was also read.

John Demers discussed a drainage problem and presented a claim for crop expenses at the Care Facility.

Darold Brown, Marathon, was reported to be in violation of the terms of a special use permit governing the operation of a salvage yard. The Zoning Commission will hold a hearing to consider revoking the permit.

It was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to approve payment for inpatient care of one person (LE7-10-84) at the Northwest Iowa Mental Health Center. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson to approve partial payment for 2 persons using General Relief funds (VG7-10-84 and AS7-10-84 in the amounts of \$195 and \$900 respectively). Ayes--all.

11:00 A. M. -- The Board meeting was recessed until 1:00 P. M. in order to hold a joint drainage meeting with Clay County on D.D.#14--42.

1:00 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on Zoning Regulations. 7 interested persons were present for the hearing. County Zoning Administrator, Don Linnan, presented the changes proposed in the county zoning regulations, of primary interest was a proposal to require developers to pave streets in developments. Potential developers raised concern that requiring roads to be paved would make developments cost prohibitive. The county is at a disadvantage, compared to a city, when a road is paved because the county does not have the ability to assess the individuals benefitted, but rather has to levy against all taxpayers in the county. In certain instances improvement district warrants may be attached as a lien on the property. This gives the developer access to funds for improvements at a lower interest rate for a longer period of time. The County Attorney will be asked to investigate and see if this is legal in Iowa. This hearing was continued until July 24, 1984 at 1:00 P. M.

1:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public hearing on D.D.14/14 Ext. This Drainage hearing was adjourned at 3:50 P. M. and the Board then reconvened their regular board meeting.

Darlene Peterson, County Health Nurse, requested a \$150.00 per month raise for Jan Hartwig as Administrator of the Homemaker Home Health Aides program as approved by the County Board of Health. This request is in addition to the raise granted Hartwig for duties as fiscal manager of the Public Health Office. After much discussion it was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson to grant a \$150.00 per month raise to Jan Hartwig as Administrator of state funded HM/HHA program. After further discussion the motion was withdrawn. It was then moved by Baker, seconded by Radke to approve the April 24, 1984 Board of Health report as filed with the following exceptions: Paragraph 3 page 3 and paragraph 1 page 4 (which is in conflict with the Buena Vista County personnel policy). The vote on this motion was: Ayes—all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the following reports: June ADTU, Tourism, NWIPDC, Board of Health; 4th quarter Board of Health, Sheriff, Recorder, Veterans Affairs; semi-annual Treasurer's report and Bank Cashier's certificate of balance; and 1983-84 annual Veterans Affairs report. Ayes--all.

Denise Kleen, Head Radio Operator and Supervisor of the Communications Center, inquired about obtaining quotes for the new Comm Center equipment. She was informed to meet federal regulations since the equipment will be partially paid by federal funds. A new agreement needs to be signed between the county, state of Iowa, and the federal government regarding the use of TRACIS. The dissolution of the 28E agreement necessitated this need. Also, a resolution to pay for the TRACIS service is needed. Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to enter into an agreement with the State of Iowa to pay the monthly service fees for TRACIS as presented. Ayes -- all.

There was some question as to the salary of Ron Scott. Whereupon it was moved by Baker, seconded by Gustafson to amend the June 19th motion to read: "increase the pay of Ron Scott 20 cents per hour effective July 1, 1984, and to grant an additional 50 cents per hour effective July 2, 1984, which is a "step" increase agreed upon at the time of his employment. carried with all voting "AYE". The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Gustafson, Samelson.

Ralph Walter, County Weed Commissioner, inquired about using Brush Killer to kill the roadside brush. It is too late for anymore spraying this season. A letter was read from a concerned citizen regarding thistles east of Marathon. Mr. Walter said this was just a bad year for control due to the extremely wet spring.

Dan Goslin, Storm Lake Director of Job Service of Iowa, and Cindy Radke, JTPA representative, introduced themselves to the Board and explained their function and the fact that they are serving the entire county in job placement and job programs. They are trying to reach dislocated farmers through the extension service. The Board wished them well in their endeavors.

County Engineer Don Linnan related that they are using Chloride to try to control the dust and told them that a culvert had been broken under the road by the Midwest Childrens Home and needed to be replaced.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the signing of the admission forms for 7 persons as residents at the Care Facility. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson authorizing Waller Engineering Co., Ida Grove, to provide engineering services for bridge replacement in Grant Township at a cost of \$900.00 and authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement. Ayes--all.

Denise Kleen, Supervisor of the Comm Center, informed the Board that the opening of quotes for the new equipment and remodeling is scheduled for 9:00 A.M. Wednesday, August 1, 1984.

1:00 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the continuance of the zoning hearing. 4 persons were present for the hearing. Chet Brecher felt the ordinance as in effect now is fair, the recommended changes would be unfair to the developer. Bob Bruce and Chuck Wetherell made further comments. After much discussion, it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to return to the zoning as it was prior to 1979 by deleting the following paragraphs 1 and 2 of Subsection D. Improvements (Section 5 - Subdivision Design Standards):

1. For all streets with fifty foot (50') rights-of-way, the following minimum standards shall apply.

a. Portland cement concrete 6" non-reinforced, or

- b. Asphaltic concrete seven inch (7") with five inch (5") coarse graded binder course, and two inch (2") fine graded surface course with six inch (6") concrete curb integral with twenty-four inch (24") cement concrete gutter (30") overall); asphaltic concrete must be approved by the County Engineer
- asphaltic concrete must be approved by the County Engineer.

 2. For all other streets, the minimum right-of-way shall be sixty-six feet (66'), and the roadway shall be twenty-eight feet (28') in width with a four inch (4") crown. There shall be ditches 3.5' below the top of roadway on both sides, with an eight foot (8') minimum width in the ditch bottom. There shall be 2:1 slopes on the roadway and 4:1 back slopes to property. Class C gravel surfacing in accordance with lowa Department of Transportation Specifications shall be applied at a minimum rate of 1,000 cubic yards per mile.

The above shall be replaced with the following:

and 2. <u>Surfacing</u>. The subdivider shall at his expense surface all streets being dedicated for public use. Surfacing shall consist of not less than six (6) inches of portland cement concrete or eight (8) inches of asphalt concrete over a prepared subgrade and shall be constructed in accordance with designs and specifications and at grades, widths, and thicknessess approved by the Board of Supervisors.

The above resolution passed unanimously.

Appropriations Resolution

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The amounts itemized by fund and by department or office on the certified County Budget for 1984-85 are hereby appropriated from the resources of each fund so itemized, to the department or office listed in the 1984-85 certified county budget.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations, and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under section 1 shall constitute authorization for the department or officer listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the itemized fund, effective July 1, 1984.

Section 3. In accordance with section 331.437, Code of Iowa, no department or officer shall expend or contract to expend any money or incur any liability, or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditure of money for any purpose in excess of the amounts appropriated pursuant to this resolution.

Section 4. If at any time during the 1984-85 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriations, he shall immediately so inform the board and recommend appropriate corrective action.

Section 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amounts charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers quarterly during the 1984-85 budget year.

Section 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business June 30, 1985.

Resolution for Interfund Operating Transfer

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to transfer monies from the General Basic fund to the General supplemental fund and the Secondary fund; and to transfer from the Rural Services basic fund to the Rural Services supplemental fund and the Secondary Roads fund; and WHEREAS said operating transfers are in accordance with section 331.432, Code of Iowa, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$915,543.00 is ordered transferred from the General Basic to the General Supplemental fund.

The sum of \$103,670.00 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Rural Services Supplemental fund.

The sum of \$2,089,550.00 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund.

Section 2. The Auditor is directed to correct his books accordingly and to notify the Treasurer of this operating transfer, accompanying the notification with a copy of this resolution and the record of its adoption.

Resolution for Interfund Operating Transfer

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson that the following resolution be adopted: Whereas, it is desired to authorize the Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Basic and Rural Services Basic funds to the Secondary Road fund during the 1984-85 budget year, and

Whereas, said transfers must be in accordance with section 331.432. Code of Iowa, Now, Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984, shall not exceed the sum of \$102,800.00; and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984, shall not exceed the sum of \$776,489.00.

Section 2. Within 30 days of being notified of the apportionment of current property taxes, state replacements against levied property taxes, mobile home taxes, military service tax credit replacements, or livestock credit replacements to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic funds, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said fund to the Secondary Road fund.

Section 3. The amount of the transfer required by section 2 shall be equal to the apportionment made under section 2 to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic fund, respectively multiplied by the ratio of said fund's total maximum transfer to the Secondary Road fund, to the sum of said fund's total current property tax levy, total mobile home taxes, total military service tax credit replacements, and total livestock credit replacements.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this resolution, total transfers to the Secondary Road fund shall not exceed the amounts specified in section 1.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3, the amount of any transfer shall not exceed fund balances in the transferring fund as of the end of the fiscal year.

Section 6. The Auditor is directed to correct his books when said operating transfers are made to notify the Treasurer and the County Engineer of the amounts of said transfers.

No decision was reached pending a meeting with the sales representative in the afternoon.

Resolution

Darlene Peterson, County Nurse, explained the need for a pre-employment Physical Examination for county employees and explained the suggested forms to the Board. A joint meeting with Clay County to discuss D.D.#14-42 was scheduled for 10:30 A.M., October 10, 1984 at the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors Room.

D.D.#82

A petition signed by 10 landowners in D.D.#82 was presented and discussed. Whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to appoint Darel Burns as the Drainage Engineer to investigate the petition for reconstruction and report back to the Board. Ayes-all. The Board also approved the use of Chuck Tapley to assist Darel Burns with the field work for several pending petitions.

Melvin Kischer requested consideration of an area that was flooded this spring when tile lines were running full and backed up forcing him to replant this spring. A committee composed of Don Linnan, Jim Gustafson, Don Harjes, and Stuart Samelson was appointed to make a visual inspection of the area and to report back to the board.

A motion was made by Radke, seconded by Samelson to approve the application for the placement of Terry Minard at the Lutheran Group Home. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the culvert project L-BV-C-2-84 of Graves Construction of Melvin, Iowa. Ayes--all.

A discussion of the signs to be posted during snow season on unplowed roads or roads only partially cleared was held. Two types were approved for posting and are to be printed.

An immunization program will be started in November by the Board of Health. It has the approval of the two Storm Lake clinics.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to revise the HM/HHA contract with the State for House File funds, from \$15/hr. to \$12/hr. as the cost has been determined at the \$12.00 amount. Ayes--all.

Health screening, which is a part of the "wellness" program will begin November 6, 1984 with the secondary road employees. It is for all county employees. It is not mandatory, but is recommended.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to approve the September ADTU and Board of Health; the first quarter Sheriff, and the annual 3rd Judicial Department of Corrections report. Ayes--all.

Denise Kleen, Communication Center, said that the new equipment has been ordered for the tower site and that Chuck Tapley has been hired to survey the new site. A 20-button phone has been ordered to replace the present phone and a 6-button phone has been ordered for standby. The Board approved the purchase.

A motion was made by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to abate the taxes on parcel #2255 owned by the City of Linn Grove, Iowa for the current fiscal year. Ayes--all.

A letter was received from Clarence Krepps and from Kuehl & Payer relative to the cost of extending a water line to the County Care Facility. This will be discussed further at a later date.

An addendum to the County personnel policy, approved by OPP, was added as of this date. This deals with sick leave.

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the public hearing on the sanitary landfill site. Approximately 40 persons were present for the hearing which was held in the public meeting room. Chairman Harjes asked for opening comments. Gary Armstrong, attorney for the landfill commission stated that he was dissatisfied with the Zoning Commission hearing last week as they were very ill-prepared. The landfill commission is a subdivision of government embracing the cities of Albert City, Alta, Lakeside, Marathon, Newell, Sioux Rapids, Truesdale, Storm Lake, Linn Grove, Rembrandt and Buena Vista County rural residents. It was organized in 1971.

Other solutions to the garbage problem other than a landfill are: incineration, which is not economically feasible. The proposed site meets the DEQ criteria and has sufficient capacity.

The purpose of this meeting is to consider a special use zoning permit. There will be a living green fence to screen the site so it should have minimal effect on the character of the neighborhood. Only 4 or 5 acres will be in use at any one time. 75% will be pasture or row crop. I.D.O.T. has given approval of the site as having a minimum effect on traffic. There should be no effect upon D.D.#46. Environmental impact would be minimal as they will follow the procedure to be certain of compliance.

Unofficial preliminary approval has been received from DEO and DWAWM allowing the Landfill Commission to proceed with the site development and it will be reviewed all along the way.

One (1) other site was looked at before choosing this site. The well that is 90' from the site will be engineered around so that the landfill will not interfere.

Dan Connell, Attorney for one of the landowners, questioned the Board's authority in the procedure used. The request was not in proper order. The Board should be cautious in approving the Zoning Boards findings. The extra 10 acres in the application are for road and are not part of the application for special use. Kim Triggs stated the Storm Lake City Council was in favor of the site. Newell is also in favor. Surrounding counties are hauling great distances because burning is not efficient.

Whereupon it was moved by Gustafson to delay for 6 months for a cooling off period and to give the commission time to examine other options and other sites. This was seconded by Radke. Whereupon, they were informed that the option on the proposed site expires November 1, 1984. Radke then withdrew his second to the motion. The motion died for lack of a second. Radke then moved to grant a special use permit, being seconded by Samelson. The vote on this motion was: Ayes--Radke, Samelson. Nays--Gustafson. The motion carried. County Attorney Ritchie will be asked for an opinion on the legality of the Board of Supervisors action. The hearing was adjourned and the Board returned to the Board room to complete their meeting.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-NINTH MEETING, 1984 SESSION (39) October 16, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the October 2, 1984 meeting were read, corrected and approved.

County Treasurer Nina Roberts informed the Board that the Commercial Bank was now ready to pledge assets to the extent of \$3,000,000.00. The ceiling allowed by the Board of Supervisors and approved by the Treasurer of the State of Iowa is \$5,000,000.00, however only \$3,000,000.00 is needed at this time. Whereupon it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke to authorize the Supervisors to sign the form pledging \$5,000,000.00 in assets for the security of public funds of Buena Vista county with the Commercial Trust & Savings Bank, Storm Lake, Iowa. Ayes--all.

Custodian Rollin Sievers inquired about using pagers to signal the custodians when they are needed at a particular location. He was instructed to get chips so that the secondary road channel can be used rather than the emergency channel now being used.

Darel Burns, Drainage Engineer, presented a petition requesting a clean-out on lateral 3 of D.D.#34. He feels the clean-out is needed. Whereupon it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson to appoint Darel Burns as the Drainage Engineer to investigate the need and to report back to the Board with his findings and recommendations. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke authorizing the Treasurer to deposit the 4th quarter Entitlement Period 15 Federal Revenue Sharing check in the amount of \$60,576.00 in the Security Trust & Savings Bank, Storm Lake at interest. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson to approve the following reports: September NWIPDC, Court Revenue, small claims, Clerk's Fees, Conservation Board; Annual report 1983-84 Conservation Board; 1st quarter 1984-85 Recorder; MHI report on Care Facility residents.

The County Engineer discussed snow removal for school bus routes for the 1984-85 school year. Routes have been changed slightly at the request of the school superintendents. The Supervisors agreed to some of these changes.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-THIRD MEETING, 1984 SESSION (43) November 13, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Gustafson, Samelson.

Minutes of the October 30, 1984 meeting were read and approved.

As the first order of business, County Auditor Julius administered the Oath of Office to Richard A. Vail, as County Supervisor elected to fill the unexpired term of Supervisor for District #1. This term expires December 31, 1986.

County Attorney Corwin Ritchie submitted a letter of appointment, appointing Jon J. Weigand to the Buena Vista County Civil Service Commission for a term expiring December 31, 1989.

Buena Vista County Clerk of Court Donna McPherren inquired about renewing the Certificate of Deposit for the Buckingham Trust Fund in the amount of \$34,222.00 with the First Federal Savings & Loan of Storm Lake, Iowa for a period of 6 months. The checking account for the fund has a balance of \$4458.00 available for use for needy children of Buena Vista County. She was instructed to renew the certificate and to place the interest in the checking account.

Jim Nelson, Buena Vista County Hospital Administrator, informed the board about the county ambulance situation. The Sioux Rapids ambulance needs a new motor. The others are located at Albert City and the County Hospital. He wondered if this was the proper location for them and feels that the survey of the community will shed some light on the needs and desires. Volunteers are needed for this service. Mr. Nelson also stated that the hospital picture is not too bright for the near future but that the county hospital will survive all right.

Anita Hallquist and Bob Peters, District Director for Human Services, presented an overview of Program & Service Delivery of Human Services as it related to Buena Vista County. This was well received. The disputed general relief claim owed the State Comptrollers office was reviewed and will be settled with a meeting of the persons involved. Whereupon it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson to go into a closed session to discuss an employee in the Human Services office. This proceeding was taped as required by law.

Darlene Peterson, County Nurse, informed the Board that their department is conducting a volunteer "wellness" program for all county employees. The program seems to be off to a good start.

The approved resolution naming depositories was received from the State Treasurer's office.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Radke authorizing the Supervisors to sign the form with First Federal Savings & Loan, Storm Lake in which they pledge \$2,000,000.00 in assets for the security of public funds which may be deposited with them.

Willard Christensen inquired about a bridge which needs to be replaced in Brooke Township. It is a historical bridge. The Board will investigate this further to see if the road can be closed and vacated.

A Work Comp dividend in the amount of \$1,280.95 for the 1982 year was received. The ISAC insurance program will be discussed further at the next meeting.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Samelson to approve the 1st quarter 1984-85 report on farm-to-market funds, the September and October reports on child support recovery, and the October report on Clerk's fees. Ayes--all.

Minutes of the November 12, 13, and 20th meetings were read and approved.

It was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson that it is hereby resolved that Buena Vista County Drainage District #34 (lateral 4) be hereby authorized to enter into a temporary easement agreement with the State of Iowa for mutual benefit under terms and conditions as set forth in the contract relating to Project #FN-71-7(38)--21-11 parcel #3. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Vail that is is hereby resolved that Buena Vista County Drainage District #34 (lateral 6) be hereby authorized to enter into a temporary easement agreement with the State of Iowa for mutual benefit under terms and conditions as set forth in the contract relating to project #FN-71-7(38)--21-11 parcel #5. Ayes--all.

County Sheriff-elect Duane Heeney explained their department's and the Communications Center's involvement with the fatal accident that happened at Highway #3 & M-27 junction in which 3 persons were killed. Deputy Heeney also stated that their relationship with the state patrol is excellent and that the one nearest the scene of an accident is the one who covers the accident. Deputy Heeney also requested consideration for a 4-wheel drive vehicle to be included in the upcoming budget. He was informed that his 1985-86 proposed budget is to be ready for consideration about January 20, 1985. Deputy Heeney then stated that when he becomes the elected official he would like to stagger the pay scale of all the deputies whenever the next salary increase occurs. He will submit his pay recommendations at the next regular meeting.

Deputy Auditor Jean Eckerman, informed the Board as to what all was covered under the computer maintenance agreement. She recommended a direct telephone line hook-up with CMS for software maintenance. No action was taken, however the Board will take this under advisement.

Jan Hartwig, from the County Health Department, and Sue Now, from the Department of Human Services, inquired about a person needing to be evaluated at Woodward. After explanation of the person's needs, it was moved by Radke, seconded by Samelson to authorize the diagnostic evaluation of one person (C.G.-11-27-84) at Woodward. Ayes--all.

The Homemaker-Home Health Aid program started about three months ago at an initial cost of \$21.00 per hour. The cost now is reduced to \$12.00 per hour as the administrative cost has been eliminated. There are presently 5 employees averaging 25 hours per week servicing 84 households.

It will be about next July before they will know how effective this was. The cost this year was about \$53,000.00 for the program. Mr. Jensen recommended blanket spraying the south 1/2 of the county and spot spraying the north 1/2 this coming year, with less expensive chemicals if they are trying to economize. This will be given further consideration.

Jerry Meyer, Richard Grienke and Bernard Peterson inquired about getting "rumble strips" installed at Highway 3 and M-27, or flashing lights. They presented a petition signed by 178 persons requesting this be done. This was discussed and County Engineer Don Linnan informed the Board that it would cost about \$30,000.00 to do all the hard-surfaced roads in the county. All the signs approaching the accident location were covered with snow and ice and were not readable. Mr. Linnan was instructed to obtain prices for the whole county and on a per intersection basis.

Larry Sorenson, "Red Barn" Administrator, presented the annual report on the Work Activity Center. He stated that they were again going to try to obtain a Block Grant, about the same as last year. After further discussion it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to support the Work Activity Center's application for a block grant, with the Public Hearing to be held December 11, 1984 at 1:30 P. M. in the Board of Supervisors Room.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-SIXTH MEETING, 1984 SESSION (46) December 11, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Samelson. Supervisor-elect Lorna Burnside was also present.

Minutes of the November 27, 1984 meeting were read, corrected and approved.

Ralph Walter, County Weed Commissioner, presented his final report to the board. Mr. Walter has resigned as County Weed Commissioner, effective December 31, 1984.

Rollin Sievers, Custodian, informed the Board about the power outage last Tuesday which was caused by a backhoe hitting the electric cable entering the courthouse. Power was restored in about 6 hours. Some damage resulted from the outage but the extent is not known at this The excessive heat in the computer room will be vented out to the circulation system.

9:30 A. M.-- The time having arrived for the public hearing on the first reading of County Ordinance #4. One person was present for the reading. After much discussion, a motion was made by Vail, seconded by Samelson approving the first reading with the second reading to be at 10:00 A. M. on Monday, December 17, 1984 at 10:00 A. M. Ayes--all. Copies of the complete ordinance #4 dealing with snow and ice removal on county roads are available at the County Auditor's Office in the Buena Vista County Courthouse, Storm Lake, Iowa.

Sheriff-elect Duane Heeney asked the Board if they were ready to make a decision on hiring policies for the Sheriff's office. The Board decided that new employees hired as deputies should not exceed 70% of the Sheriff's salary.

Pastor Schillo, Director of Lutheran Services Group Homes from Fort Dodge, informed the Board that they do not use federal funds or "Purchases of Service" from the State. They do rely on county funding for support as they feel this is the more economical way to go. Storm Lake home is now at capacity.

John Demers presented the bill for their services at the county farm this year. He has ordered the seed corn for next year. They tiled some this year. He reported on the farm program and stated that he would like to continue on the same basis for next year.

Larry Sorenson, Director for the center, presented the application and explained its function. After discussion, it was moved by Samelson, seconded by Gustafson that the Chairman be authorized to execute said application and file it with the Iowa Office for Planning and Programming. The Board of Supervisors intend to meet at least one of the CDBG objectives and will comply with appropriate state and federal laws, rules and regulations. The application is in the amount of \$350,000.00. Ayes—all.

Merle Zillig inquired about an institutional lien against a piece of property which he has listed for sale. After further discussion it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the institutional liens found in Book 5, page 87, and Book 6 page 88, of Institutional Liens be forgiven as of this date. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-SEVENTH MEETING, 1984 SESSION (47) December 17, 1984

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Samelson.

The main purpose for this meeting being to canvass the Linn Grove telephone franchise election held Tuesday, December 11, 1984 at the Community Center in Linn Grove, Iowa. The canvass having been completed with the results being in favor of granting the franchise to Continental Telephone Company. Upon completion of the official canvass it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail that the results be declared as follows: "Shall a 25 year franchise be granted to Continental Telephone Company of Iowa?" 12 votes were cast with 9 being yeas and 3 being nays. Franchise carried. The canvass having been completed, the Board proceeded to discuss other business.

Institutional accounts were then reviewed to determine the persons' ability to pay. Upon completion of the review, the County Auditor was instructed to send statements to those who were determined have the ability to pay.

10:00 A. M. -- The time having arrived for the second reading of Buena Vista County Ordinance #4. Eleven (11) persons were present for the reading. County Auditor Julius read the ordinance. County Engineer Linnan related the minor changes that occurred after the first reading. Chairman Harjes commented on the reaction received to date from the taxpayers. Paul Marshall inquired why the County Attorney was not present. He also suggested removing the specified working hours from the ordinance. Lawrence Zubradt requested that section B6 and that part of section A6 pertaining to service (both sections being a part of Section 3) be removed from the ordinance. Lester Anderson inquired as to how the county road miles were posted. He also suggested that the bridges be sanded. The County Engineer informed him that a "frost program" would require an entirely different program. Supervisor Gustafson felt that both sections 6 should be rewritten. Supervisor Vail said that we should have legal advice before proceeding any further. The County Engineer suggested some changes to A6. It was then moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to accept the second reading as written and to hold the third reading on January 8, 1985 at 3:00 P. M. in the Board Room. Motion carried.

Sheriff-elect Duane Heeney presented a letter in regards to the salary of Katie Brown, a part-time clerk in the Sheriff's office. No action was taken. He then related that he would like to employ Jay Dahlman as a Deputy starting about February 1, 1985. He was instructed to proceed with the hiring at a salary not to exceed 70% of the Sheriff's salary. He then presented a recommended pay scale covering Paul Bergman and all future employees. No action was taken on this recommendation.

Ted VanGrootheest, County Assessor, explained state rollbacks, equalization computations,

and applied. The Board thanked him for the explanations.

County Engineer Don Linnan reviewed the priority for snow removal on county roads to accommodate mail delivery and school bus routes. Some changes were suggested.

It was moved by Gustafson to adjourn to Wednesday, December 26, 1984 at 9:00 A. M.
