BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIRST MEETING, 1985 SESSION (1) January 2, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met for the first meeting of the 1985 session as required by law, at 9:00 A. M., Wednesday, January 2, 1985, in the Board of Supervisors room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Chairman Harjes presided with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson. Absent: Samelson

Minutes of the December 26th meeting were read and approved.

There being no further old business to come before the Board, it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that this meeting adjourn sine die. Carried.

The Board recessed to the Courtroom for Judge Richard W. Cooper to administer the Oath of Office to newly elected Supervisor Lorna Burnside and Supervisor Don Harjes and Richard Vail as well as the County Auditor, Clerk of District Court, County Sheriff Heeney, Hospital Trustees Glen Jesse and Marcia Schaller, and County Soil Conservation Commissioners Jeff Chindlund and Arlin Hinkeldey. Upon completion of the ceremony, the Board returned to the Board room to conduct the first meeting of 1985.

For the first order of business of the new 1985 session, the County Auditor asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for 1985. Supervisor Harjes nominated Jim Gustafson for Chairman. Supervisor Vail then nominated Orville Radke for Chairman. Supervisor Harjes then moved that nominations cease. This was seconded by Radke. Carried. Supervisor Burnside then moved that voting be by written ballot. This was seconded by Supervisor Vail and carried. County Auditor Julius and Wanda Moeller, newspaper representative, were designated to count the ballots. Upon completion of the counting, Supervisor Orville Radke was declared Chairman of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors for 1985. Chairman Radke then took his place as Chairman and thanked everyone for their support and asked for full cooperation and support for the year.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney inquired about the salary for Katie Brown, a part-time employee in the Sheriff's office and requested an increase in the amount that Sheriff Galbraith had asked for. Supervisor Harjes informed him that the Board of Supervisors sets the salary for all county employees, not the Department head. The Board feels that Katie should receive salary changes at the same time as other county employees but that this might be an exception. Sheriff Heeney stated that they do not need a "sworn Deputy" to handle the clerical work of the Sheriff's office. After further discussion it was moved by Gustafson to increase the salary for Katie Brown to \$4.50 per hour. This motion died for lack of a second. After further discussion it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson that Katie Brown be paid \$4.50 per hour effective January 1, 1985. This motion carried.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson that the following pay scale be adopted for the Sheriff's Department: Salary be based on Sheriff's salary being paid at the time the change occurs: Beginning wage-70%; 6 months later-73.5%; end of second 6 months-76.5%; end of 3rd 6 months-full pay scale of 80%. Motion carried.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson to approve one person (A.L.1-2-85) as a resident at the Care Facility as of this date. Ayes--all.

Letters were received from the official newspapers of the county requesting to be named as an official county paper for 1985. Whereupon it was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson that the official newspapers for 1985 be declared the same as for 1984. Ayes--all.

The next order of business was the appointment of Committees for 1985. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to appoint Arnie Hicks, Linn Grove, to the Buena Vista County Conservation Board District #1 for a 5 year term ending 12-31-89. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes to appoint Gary Meseck, Storm Lake, to the Buena Vista County Human Services Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to appoint Betty Silverberg, Casino Beach, to the Buena Vista County Human Services Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside to appoint Emily Jackson, Storm Lake, to the Buena Vista County Mental Health Advisory Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes to appoint Orlen Rohlfsen, Newell, to the Buena Vista County Mental Health Advisory Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to appoint Michele Plagman, Brooke Twp. to the Buena Vista County Mental Health Advisory Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes to appoint Dr. T. E. Shea as Buena Vista County Medical Examiner for 1985. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes to appoint Supervisors Harjes, Radke, and Gustafson to the County Care Facility Committee. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to appoint Orville Radke, Don Harjes and Lewis Julius to the Courthouse Committee. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail to appoint Yvonne Bertness, Sioux Rapids, Richard Vail and Jim Gustafson to the Northwest Iowa Mental Health Center and to the Alcohol and Drug Treatment Committees. Ayes--all. Burnside is to be the alternate.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail that the Upper Des Moines Opportunity, Inc., delegate be Burnside with Vail as the alternate. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside that the Northwest Iowa Planning and Development representative be Harjes with Gustafson as the alternate. Ayes--all.

3:00 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the 3rd and final reading on Buena Vista County Ordinance No. 4. 4 persons were present for the hearing. County Auditor Julius read proposed Ordinance No. 4. He then read the proposed revisions. After discussion with the County Attorney, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes that the following ordinance, with the revisions included, be adopted as Buena Vista County Ordinance No. 4 to become effective upon publication of these Board minutes:

Buena Vista County Ordinance No. 4

Title: An ordinance establishing the policy and level of service in respect to clearance of snow or ice and maintenance of this county's secondary roads during the winter months.

Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish this County's policy and level of service in respect to clearance of snow or ice and maintenance of its secondary road system during the winter months, as provided in HF 2487, Section 10(2), Acts of the 63rd G.A., Second Session, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 309.67, Code of Iowa. and level of service are to be implemented within the amount of money budgeted for this service, and as contained in this County's secondary road budget as submitted to and approved by the Iowa Department of Transportation and adopted by the Board of Supervisors.

Level of Service. Clearance of snow or ice and maintenance of the secondary road system during the winter months is primarily for the benefit of the local residents of this County. Each storm has individual characteristics and must be dealt with accordingly. portion of the roadway improved for travel will have upon it snow and ice in a compacted condition. These conditions may be continuous, or they may be more concentrated on hills, in valleys, curves, and/or intersections. The County's existing snow removal equipment will be utilized for this purpose. All clearance of snow and ice, sanding, and other maintenance respecting winter conditions shall be accomplished within the amount of money budgeted for this service. The entire width of that portion of the road improved for travel may not be cleared of snow, ice, compacted snow and ice, or frost. Snow cleared from that part of the roadway improved for travel shall be placed on or in the adjacent shoulder, ditch, or right-of-way. Snow cabe expected to accumulate adjacent to the traveled portion to the extent that a motorist's sight distance to both the left and right may be greatly reduced or impaired. The snow removed from the intersections will be piled in its corners in piles of unequal height. The line of sight, sight distance, or visibility of motorists approaching these intersections may be greatly reduced or impaired. The County shall not be responsible for snow pushed or otherwise placed on the roadway or shoulder by others. (Buena Vista County Ordinance #3 Section 5 - Snow. No person shall deposit snow which has been removed from an adjoining property onto any portion of the public road right-of-way in Buena Vista County, provided, that no person shall be deemed to have violated this section unless such snow has been deposited on the traveled portion of the highway or piled in the road ditch to a level higher than two (2) feet above the level of the traveled portion or within thirty (30) feet of a sign post or mailbox support.) Motorists shall drive their vehicles during these conditions with additional caution and watchfulness, especially in respect to the surface of the roadway, and reduced or impaired visibility, and are advised to reduce their speed at least 25 miles per hour below that legally permitted or advised under normal conditions. In respect to roadways that have only one lane open, further extreme watchfulness and caution should be exercised by the motorist, and their speed should not exceed 10 miles per hour. During these conditions no additional warning or regulatory signs will be placed that warn of impaired sight distances, visibility at intersections, road blockages, one-lane conditions, or that the road surface is slick or slippery, or what the advised speed should be.

In the implementation of snow and ice removal and other Sequence of Service. maintenance of the county's secondary road system during the winter months, the County Engineer shall select the actual sequence of roads to be cleared as provided for in this Section of this Ordinance, and shall determine when drifting, wind velocity, and additional snow or snowstorms require that the snow removal equipment be removed from the roadway, or that additional clearance of paved routes be accomplished prior to the clearance of gravel and dirt roads. The County Engineer's professional judgment shall prevail unless it is clearly erroneous.

- (1) The initial effort will be to get all routes open to one-lane traffic as soon as possible.
- After one-lane travel is possible, subsequent snow removal will be carried on during normal working hours.
- The snow plows and spreaders will not normally be in operation during the hours that are outside the working hours established in the Buena Vista County Secondary Road Departmental Rules. The equipment may be called off the road if snow and/or blowing snow reduces visibility to hazardous working conditions, in the professional judgment of the engineer or his delegated representative.
- When required, due to heavy snow or large drifts, motor graders may be (4)used to open the paved roads and the opening of gravel roads may be delayed. It is not the policy of the county to provide a "dry" pavement condition.
- After roads have been plowed as provided in this section, stop intersections, hills, railroad crossings, and curves may have placed on them sand or other abrasive.
- This sequence of service shall normally be performed only during the working hours established in the Buena Vista County Secondary Road Departmental Rules. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays observed by County employees will be worked only if the roads are known to be blocked with snow or if in the professional judgment of the county engineer freezing precipitation necessitates sanding or placing other abrasives at some or all of the following: stop intersections, hills, railroad crossings and curves.

- Unpaved roads.
 - The initial effort will be to open the routes to all occupied homes as soon as possible after a storm has passed.
 - After the routes to all occupied homes are opened these same routes will be widened out and winged back and in conjunction with this operation the unoccupied roads or sections thereof that are priority bus routes will be opened.
 - After the above is completed the remainder of the gravel roads, not designated Level "B", will be opened.
 - Motorgraders and/or truck plows will not normally be in operation during the hours that are outside the working hours established in the Buena Vista County Secondary Roads Departmental Rules. Gravel roads may not be plowed if the wind is causing continual drifting.
 - Snow may not be removed from dirt roads.
 - This sequence of service shall normally be performed only during the working hours established in the Buena Vista County Secondary Road Departmental Rules. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays observed by County employees will be worked only if the roads are known to be blocked with snow.

Private drives.

- The County will not clear snow from private drives. Normal snow removal operations may result in snow being deposited in private drives. Snow from private drives shall not be placed on the roadway or shoulders
- The County shall not replace or repair mailboxes destroyed or damaged during snow removal operations.

There is no time limit after a snowstorm in which any of the above sequence of clearance, on paved or unpaved roads, shall take place.

SECTION 4. <u>Limitation of Service</u>. The policy and level of service provided for in this ordinance shall not include the performance of the following services:

- Sanding, salting, or placing of other abrasives upon the roadway that are slick, slippery, and dangerous due to the formation of frost. Sanding, salting, or placing other abrasives upon paved roadways due to freezing
- precipitation that occurs outside the county's usual working hours.
- Placing of additional warning or regulatory signs warning of impaired sight distances, visibility at intersections, road blockages, one-lane conditions, or that the road surface is slick or slippery, or what the advised speed should be.

SECTION 5. Emergency Conditions.

- The sequence of service may be suspended during "Emergency" conditions. An "Emergency" Condition shall be considered as one where a loss of life is probable, where a serious injury has occurred, or where extensive loss of property is imminent. These conditions should be verified through a physician or the sheriff's office. The County will respond to all "Emergency" conditions, either during or after a snowstorm. The provisions of the Ordinance shall be further suspended in the event the Governor,
- by proclamation, implements the State Disaster plan, or the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, by proclamation, implements the County disaster plan. If such occurs, the County personnel and equipment shall be immediately subject to the direction of the Governor or the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors.

SECTION 6. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validilty of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 8. When Effective. This o and publication as provided by law. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval,

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

9:30 A. M. -- Clarence Krepps, Jim Littlejohn and Jack Walton requested help concerning the railroad crossing in the Industrial Park area. They requested the crossing be designated as a public railroad crossing. Unless the crossing is made public, the Illinois Central Gulf Railroad will have to barricade the crossing. It is outside the city limits, therefore the county has to make the application to the State Department of Transportation, Railroad Division. The County Attorney and the City Attorney will get together to see what can be worked out. Perhaps a 28E agreement can be reached for the maintenance of the crossing. Whereupon, it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail to direct the County Attorney to make a formal request to IDOT, RR division, to make the existing crossing in the Industrial Park, an extension of Gilbert Street, into a public crossing. Ayes-all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson to concur with the County Board of Health to employ Ray Kurtz as a part-time Sanitatian effective January 14, 1985, at a salary of \$4.50 per hour with a re-evaluation at the end of the first 6 months, with the Sanitarian to be governed by the Buena Vista County Personnel Policy. Ayes--all.

10:30 A. M. -- The time having arrived for the opening of quotes on Weed Chemicals. One person was present for the hearing. Four (4) quotes were received. After opening and discussing the quotes, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail, to accept the low quote of Jensen Spraying, Laurens, Iowa, on all three divisions, his being the low quote on all divisions, and to return the certified checks to the unsuccessful bidders. Ayes--all.

1:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on the proposed road vacation and closing. Three (3) persons were present for the hearing. City Attorney Paul Havens, on behalf of the City of Storm Lake, objected to the vacation due to the fact that the city plans to annex either voluntary or involuntary, and this road would then become an extension of Northwestern Drive and would have to be restored if vacated now. Joe Wiggins stated that he would like the road vacated so that he could farm the ground. The road is on the 1/2 mile line. The ground is not well suited for a housing development and the annexation may not be needed for some time. After further discussion it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to close and vacate the road described as: The public road sixty-six feet (66.0') in width, thirty-three feet (33.0') either side of the centerline commencing at the North one quarter (%) corner of Section thirty-three (33), Township ninety-one north (T 91N), Range thirty-seven west (R 37 W) of the Fifth Principal Meridiam (5th P. M.), Washington Township Buena Vista County, and running South along the centerline of said Section thirty-three (33) approximately three-fourths (3/4) of one mile to the south east corner of the Northeast Quarter, Southwest Quarter (NE\sN\s) of said section thirty-three (33), with the effective date of the vacation to be upon the restoration of the road. Ayes--all.

Eight (8) persons representing the Libraries in the county, with Storm Lake Librarian Erma Myers acting as spokesperson, requested that more money be budgeted for the Libraries. They are presently receiving 7 cents per one thousand dollars valuation and they would like to receive at least 10 cents per thousand. 28% of the people using the Storm Lake library are rural residents. The budget for the current year is \$124,000.00. June Salton, Alta Librarian, said their rural usage was also over 20%. The Board said that they would consider their request at budget time.

A letter was received from the Albert City Historical Association requesting consideration for \$1,000.00 in the upcoming budget. This will also be considered at budget time. A copy of the expenditures for the Albert City Association was also submitted.

The control of the MCIC terminal must be under the direct control of a law enforcement agency. The guidelines set forth by the State does not include guidelines for the rest of the Communications

and that the rest of the administration be under the direction of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors with the Buena Vista County Communication Center Advisory Board to be composed of a County Supervisor, Hospital Administrator or designee, the Mayors or their designee, Director of Disaster Services, Storm Lake Chief of Police and Fire Chief, and they are to be used in an advisory capacity to the Board of Supervisors for overall direction of the Communications Center. This motion carried unanimously.

The 1985-86 budgets are to be reviewed February 4th.

He recommended investigating the possibility of voluntary or involuntary annexation. He also inquired about a 28E agreement for the maintenance of the crossing. County Attorney Ritchie stated not to worry about costs at this time as there may be no cost. The crossing needs to be designated as a public crossing first.

Ken Greenfield, Gibbs-Cook representative, and Brad Raveling, countyshop foreman, informed the Board that two new motorgraders were needed and possibly some snow plows. After a lengthy discussion it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to accept the price of \$170,000.00 as the new delivered price for two new 140G Caterpillar Motor Graders with wing and plow, from Gibbs-Cook Equipment Company, Des Moines, Iowa. The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, pursuant to adjournment, at 9:00 A. M. with the following members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside. Absent: Radke. The Chariman being absent, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside, that Supervisor Harjes be the Chairman for this meeting. Carried.

The County Attorney related the proper procedures to follow in discussing the Communications Center problems.

Supervisor Gustafson asked if a persons job description and title can be changed. The County Attorney assured him that this is proper procedure.

Sheriff Heeney stated that the Communications Center is not being run properly. He is afraid that someone might get hurt. They need new, properly trained employees. He does not feel that a Supervisor is needed, that it should be under the control and supervision of the County Sheriff. Better cooperation is needed between the Communications Center and the Sheriff's department. He has informed the Communications Center of the problems that need to be resolved.

The County Attorney related the Attorney General's Opinion that the Communications Center must provide the Sheriff with his own radio set and one for his car in order to enforce the law.

Chairman Harjes stated that the individuals involved should be called in to answer all the questions presented. Each employee in the Comm Center is to be given a packet of problems so they are prepared to answer any questions that might be presented. The County Attorney is also to receive a packet. It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside that the evaluation of the conduct of the Communications Center be brought out and discussed in full at a meeting to be held Wednesday morning, March 27, 1985 at 9:00 A. M. with all persons involved to be present.

It was moved by Vail that this meeting be adjourned until Wednesday, March 27th at 9:00 A. M.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIFTEENTH MEETING, 1985 SESSION (15) March 26, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, pursuant to adjournment, at 9:00 A. M. with the following members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside. Absent: Radke. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SIXTEENTH MEETING, 1985 SESSION (16) March 27, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, pursuant to adjournment, at 9:00 A. M. with the following members being present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside, Radke. Radke did not participate because of health problems. Whereupon, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson, that Harjes be Chairman for this meeting. Carried.

The main purpose of this meeting was to evaluate the conduct of the Communication Center personnel. Supervisor Denise Kleen was called in first and requested an open meeting. Harjes then questioned Kleen as to why she allowed the conduct and did not curtail the conversation. He then pointed out her responsibilities. The County Attorney then asked for specifics and asked Kleen to respond, the specifics being:

1. Failure to do timely radio checks? Response: She felt she had complied. (If no

- Failure to do timely radio checks? Response: She felt she had complied. (If no contact with officer for an hour then they check). This is taken on an individual officer basis. If they are in the office, the operators do not check.
- 1 a. Written procedure for complaint on doing radio checks? Response: There have been complaints and they were brought to the operators attention.

1 b. Record keeping? Response: Radio calls are logged.

- 2. Failure to respond to officers calls (May be favoritism or interference by radio or TV)? Response: There are 13 frequencies to monitor (12 telephone lines as well as radio) so it is difficult to answer when in the middle of another call. There is no favoritism.
- 2 a. Have you received any direct complaints? Response: In February, after receiving letter from Duane. The officers need to consider the work load and are lax on information, i.e., should give the complete number not just the officers number.

2 b. Are other counties heard on our system. Response: Yes.

- 3. Allegations of Storm Lake Police not having same problem. Response: Disagrees with this statement. There is no trouble understanding radio unless two officers are reporting at the same time (license, etc). Kleen has written letters to the department asking for assistance to upgrade their performance. This has met with little response, however, there was a noticeable change in the Storm Lake Police. She has talked with Duane requesting help to identify and he has said that he would talk with his officers.
- 2 c. Do you talk with Duane on a regular basis; the problems should be brought up until solved. Have you seen some improvement? Response: No.
- 4. Was it possible that Bergman was sent to an accident already covered by the State Troopers? Response: Did not know of this until a letter was received, at which time she talked to Myron Nourse about it.
- 5. Rudeness, i.e., called Duane in the middle of the night for something trivial. Response: He goes from one extreme to another on calls. Cannot determine priorities as there are no guidelines so she exercises her own judgment.
- 6. Is it the job of the Communications Center only to relay messages, not to make decisions? Response: Disagree completely. Not only a relay station, but must decide who the message goes to. There are times when they have to make decisions as they do not have time to consult with the officers.
- 6 a. What about complaints? Response: Yes, from Duane on minor things. There are no guidelines for trivial calls. They need to communicate with Duane on a daily basis. She does not know of lots of things that occur during the night or day, and would like to know of complaints before they get to this stage.
- 7. Refusal to let families in the back door when identified? Response: This is no longer a problem. There are no rules, but only authorized personnel are allowed; however sometimes people come down and they cannot see who they are.

 8. What about failure to obey officer in the field? Response: This refers to
- 8. What about failure to obey officer in the field? Response: This refers to when a phone call was made to see if someone was coming to work, an officer was in the office so he was asked to make the call. On the Alta letter, it is not the duty of the Communication Center to call the home where the trouble is. They do not obtain information, however, they asked the Alta police to go to the home and Myron called the home, but got no answer, so Myron called the Cherokee Law Enforcement Center. From a safety standpoint, it is safer to use the phone than to go to the door in the middle of the night.
- 9. What about use of alcohol before going on duty and the wearing of proper attire? Response: Knew only of attire except when related to in letter by Duane. There are no standards. This should be covered by departmental rules. If rudeness or attire is a problem, the operator should be talked to.
- 10. Has radio traffic been blotted out by radio and/or TV? Response: a letter was received from Duane and this was discussed with the operators who were told to keep both on a low volume.
- 11. What about the work schedule problem? Response: There were lots of schedules by Duane that did not work because of changing from 5 full-time to 4 full-time and 2 part-time. There is no problem now.
- 12. What was the problem with the Newell Emergency unit? Response: There is a map set up on the ambulance boundaries. Buch was ½ mile into the Newell territory but the operator did not look at the map, but called the Storm Lake Ambulance in error, and since it was code blue, the ambulance contintued since it had been dispatched.
- 13. Tapes of phone calls show long duration of chit-chat. Response: It is hard to respond to conversations that are so old. The language might have been inappropriate, but it is not unique. Only know of one instance where conversation interfered with radio calls.
- Ms. Kleen then handed out a paper to the Supervisors which was self-explanatory and is on file in the Auditor's office. This was read to the Supervisors. There is a lack of communication which started at election time. They are trying to adjust their attitude but cooperation has to be there and will be as long as there is a two-way street. If an agreement cannot be reached, then the Board will have to intervene.

The TV belongs to the radio operators, and has been there about three years; however, it is not a good idea and should be eliminated. It does help on the midnite shift to keep the operators awake.

14. When the light fixture was pulled down in the jail, was it seen on the monitor? Response: Yes.

Chairman Harjes then called Jeff Feldick to the table and asked if he wanted a closed session. Mr. Feldick stated that he wanted an open meeting. The County Attorney then proceeded with the questioning. The County Attorney then asked about the old taped conversations and the language used. Mr. Feldick said that he wanted to relay a message to the deputy which he did and then they had a personal conversation which got lengthy. This was over two years ago and why is it coming up now? The County Attorney then asked if there were any guidelines for phone use. There are none that he knows of other than it cannot interfere with business traffic. If there

Jeff feels that the personality differences with the Sheriff's department can be worked out, but that it must be a two-way street. In reference to the ice storm when Denise was gone and Linda, a new employee was on duty, Jeff was called in by Linda to help, which he did and then went home. Two hours later he and Myron were both called in to help. Myron stayed to help Linda when the Sheriff had requested Jeff to stay. Jeff was asked who was in charge when Denise was gone and he replied "No one." Mr. Gustafson stated that someone has to be in charge and answerable, and that a chain of command should be established. The County Attorney then asked how long it had been since Randy Coleman worked and was informed that it was over 2 years. Cory then asked if he had heard the remark that this was Denise's Comm Center and that there would probably be some "ousting" done if Duane was elected. Jeff said this was only hearsay and that there were phone calls in the middle of the night which undermined both sides. It was childish and he apologized for it but that it could be worked out if there was a "two-way street". The Board needs to realize the problem and that he was willing to go half way to get along with everyone. The TV may be a problem, it is getting better. As for language his mother wanted to wash his mouth out with soap, his personal goal is to improve his As for dress, he has worn a hospital shirt on the late shift, but he has never had alcohol within 6 hours of working. He likes his job because of the different things to do. Whereupon, a letter written by him was read by the secretary and is now on file in the Auditor's

Chairman Harjes then called Myron Nourse to the table and asked if he wanted an open or a closed meeting. Mr. Nourse requested an open meeting. The County Attorney then proceeded with the questioning. In regard to the computer being taken away by the state, he had a lengthy conversation with Denise. As it turned out, there was no big loss. Since there was no agreement to operate the computer, the Sheriff asked the state to take away the service. Myron was afraid they would lose the computer completely. He did not realize the conversation was so long. Myron has been employed at the Comm Center for over 2 years, will be 3 in July. He tried to remain neutral during the election and refused to help campaign, however during the final week he did allow his signature to be used as an endorsement for Bernie Gutz. At no time was he derogatory to Duane. He did hear however, that there could be trouble, but at no time did he feel that his job was threatened. He knew there was underhanded politicking being done by both sides. He was here today not to put job on line, but to help get parties to work together. Concerning loud background music and TV interference, he has no problem with this when he is working. He has promised Denise that he would not let it interfere with the job. There are about 65 line items of traffic received between midnite and 8:00 A. M. From 4:00 P. M. until midnite there will be 65 to over 200 on a busy nite. Week-ends are usually slow, especially Sunday night. Thursday and Friday nights have the most traffic. He does not think the differences between the Comm Center and the Sheriff are beyond repair, but does feel that guidelines are needed. If there are any complaints, he tries to discuss it with the complaintant and then he notifies the Supervisor. He also logs the complaint. Myron then read the letter he had written and which is on file in the Auditor's office.

All three persons and the Sheriff were then involved in the discussion. Duane reviewed what had happened in the morning meeting and the fact that none of the complaints were denied, they were found on the tapes when reviewing them for accident reports. Most of the complaints were received from other law enforcement agencies. The election created problems and hard feelings. Any problems on the computer should be taken to Duane. Duane did not converse with Denise before she went on vacation as he had other things to do. Denise has been Supervisor for three years come summer. Wayne Case was Supervisor before her. Duane is disagreeing with "Communications being a two-way street". He is concerned for his men in the field. There should be meetings between all concerned and disciplinary action taken if things are not rectified immediately. Duane stated that the Storm Lake Police Department does not have problems as there are no politics involved. Harjes suggested that the Board and a special committee write departmental rules for the Comm Center. The County Attorney stated there is no flexibility on either side and asked if you could make rules to cover real and trivial occurrences. Radke asked if things could be worked out and Duane replied "yes". Harjes then stated that things must be worked out and better communications installed. All three are good operators and the election is over. He informed them that the county personnel policy will be adhered to more closely. Vail stated that the problems need to be handled immediately upon happening. Denise stated that she would like to have monthly meetings of all law enforcement personnel. Duane said that he had talked of this but has not had time to have the meetings. Harjes suggested that there be a debriefing with Denise, Duane and two Board members, and to set up guidelines. Whereupon, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to do the above. Motion carried. The meeting then adjourned with County Attorney, Harjes, Gustafson, Heeney, and Kleen remaining to work on the quidelines.

The current county budget was discussed. Whereupon, it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail, that a public hearing to amend the current county budget will be held at the Board of Supervisors Room, Buena Vista County Courthouse, on May 28, 1985, at 1:30 P. M. for the purpose of amending the current county budget adopted March 20, 1984, by increasing expenditures in the Public Safety Service area from \$576,227 to \$626,227 which is necessary because net expenditures rather than gross expenditures were budgeted for the Communications Center improvements. M. for the main purpose of determining if the current budget for the Mental Health Service Area should be amended. As Engineer he recommended that the open ditch be cleaned and that the spoil be placed on the north side of the ditch. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING TWENTY-FOURTH MEETING, 1985 SESSION (24) May 28, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the May 14, 1985, meeting were read and approved.

Les Schmidt, Director for Northwest Iowa ADTU, explained that all of his clients are notified that they are responsible for the cost of the treatment that they receive and have to repay the county if they are able to do so. Bill Perry explained commitment costs and the procedure that is followed when persons are committed to the mental health institutions for treatment.

Ferne Frederiksen, County Recorder, inquired about computer programs and a small computer for her office. The cost for the program for boats and snowmobiles for the main-frame computer would be \$2,500.00, whereas the cost would only be \$700.00 if she used the COTT program. She was instructed to proceed with the COTT program if she could find financing for it.

County Engineer Don Linnan inquired about the county policy on unpaved roads. Whereupon it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail, to establish the following policy on unpaved county roads: To lower the height of the angle iron rails to approximately 24 inches above the deck on I-Beam bridges that are less than 20 feet wide between rails, when requested by a farm operator who cannot take "implements of husbandry" across the bridge because of a width restriction. In conjunction with the lowering of the railing, double facing hazard markers on swinging cantilevered arms will be placed at the approach corners of the bridge. The site is to be checked and approved by the county Supervisor in whose district the bridge is located and the County Engineer prior to placement. Ayes--all.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney presented the new schedule for Deputies and Jailers work hours effective May 28, 1985. This complies with the recommended 28 day-171 hour schedule recommended by the Department of Labor before payment of overtime is necessary.

Don Elk, representing ISAC insurance coverage, presented a quote on additional Excess Umbrella limits for county comprehensive general liability at a cost of \$1,000.00 per \$1,000,000.00. Whereupon, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes, to purchase an additional \$3,000,000.00 coverage effective June 1, 1985. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail, to approve two persons (D.P.&S.P.5-28-85) as clients at the "Red Barn" work activity center. Ayes--all.

Darlene Peterson, County Nurse, will continue working part-time until June 4, 1985. Free immunizations are now being done by the county health department. It was noted that the first 6 month period for Ray Kurtz was about up, whereupon it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson to concur with the recommendation of the County Board of Health, and to increase the salary for Ray Kurtz 50 cents per hour effective July 1, 1985. Ayes all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson, to authorize the Chairman to sign a contract with Koth Construction Co. in the amount of \$4,933.75 for tile repair in D.D. #116, said amount being the low quote approved May 14, 1985. Myes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail, to approve the request from I.D.O.T. for the temporary closing of the county road south of section 7-92-36 (Lincoln Twp.) during the construction of a new culvert on U.S.#71 near the southwest corner section 7-92-36. The approximate period of closure would be from late June through September 1985. The county engineer is hereby authorized to approve the placement of signs, and closing, on date requested by I.D.O.T. The closure is to be terminated upon completion of the construction work. Farm operators shall be allowed to use the road to farm adjoining land. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside, to approve the April county conservation report and the May ADTU and Board of Health reports. Ayes--all.

1:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the public hearing to amend the current Buena Vista County Budget for fiscal year 1984-85. Ten (10) persons were present for the hearing. Auditor Julius related the need to amend in the Public Safety and Mental Health areas. Mr. Stille asked why the mental health needed to be amended and Human Services Director Anita Hallquist told the reasons. Gladys Heuton said that she thought the state should fund mental health rather than property taxes. Whereupon, it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson, that whereas a quorum was present and that the notice of time and place of hearing had been published according to law, and the amendments were taken up and considered and the taxpayers were heard, that the Board does hereby determine that said budget be corrected by changing the proposed expenditures as listed in the original budget, in the Public Safety service area from \$576,222 to \$626,227 and the Mental Health service area from \$576,408 to \$641,408. The amendment does not increase the taxes to be collected in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985. The vote upon final adoption of the amendment was: Ayes--all. Nays--none. Amendment carried.

Jerry Culbertson informed the Board about a discrepancy in platting at the Casino. He requested that the county survey and establish correct lot lines. County Engineer Don Linnan said the matter should be referred to the County Attorney to find out what can and should be done to correct the situation. This will be done.

2:30 P. M.—The time having arrived for the public letting on project L-BV-G-5-86-11.

Five (5) persons were present for the letting. Four (4) quotes were received. Upon opening and discussing the quotes and finding all in order, it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail, to accept the low quote of Don Doyle Construction, Sioux Rapids, Iowa, in the amount of \$40,439.65 for project L-BV G-5-86-11 and authorize the Chairman to sign the contract. Ayes--all.

A request by Daryl Miller for a 3 month leave of absence was denied.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson, to award the contract to O.K. Roofing Co., Laurens, Iowa to investigate and repair two roof leaks at the County Care Facility at a cost

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail to approve the application of Lake Creek Country Club for a Class "C" liquor license and Sunday Sales Permit. Ayes--all.

/ The Board instructed the Clerk of Court and the County Auditor to proceed with the bookbinding as needed and to award the work to United Binding Company, St. Paul, Minnesota who submitted the low quotes.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to forgive the taxes on Parcel #10341.85 for the 1981 and the 1983 assessments in the total amount of \$65.00, the property being known as part of the abandoned railroad right-of-way in the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter section 3-93-37. Property now appears in the name of Buena Vista County as it reverted back to the adjoining property owner. Ayes-vall.

Glen Huntington, a director of the Storm Lake Industrial Commission, presented a reorganization plan which makes the commission a county-wide organization. It states the county share of the yearly budget at \$30,000.00. This plan will be discussed at a later date.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

He was instructed to investigate further and report back.

Glen Huntington, representing the Storm Lake Industrial Corporation, reported on House File 225 which is the new law known as "the Lottery Bill". The funds received from the state will be dispensed by a Board for each of the 15 merged area school districts. The Board will be composed of 2 persons from each county within the district. The Board thanked Mr. Huntington for the report.

Darel Burns, County Drainage Engineer, presented an engineer's final report on D.D.#116, and commented that Mr. Koth had done an excellent job. He then recommended that the project be accepted as complete. Whereupon, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail, to accept the Engineer's report and to hold a public hearing at 1:30 P. M., July 23, 1985, in the public meeting room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse on the completion of the contract. Ayes--all.

A request having been received from Kenneth Hansen and Ed and Jan Dowdy to rezone from Rural farm to Commercial, a parcel of land located in theNE4SE4 Section 17-91-38, containing 10.78 acres of which 0.50 are existing highway right-of-way. Spot zoning has been done in the past for businesses that were compatible with the area (such as Farm Service, Anhydrous ammonia plants, etc.). The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson. Absent: Burnside.

Minutes of the June 25th and 28th meetings were read and approved.

This being the first meeting for fiscal year 1985-86, a motion was made by Vail, seconded by Gustafson, authorizing the County Auditor to appropriate the county funds as budgeted for fiscal year 1985-86 to the designated county funds and departments for expenditure as they become available, with no further allocation being necessary, and to also appropriate the Federal Revenue Sharing funds as designated in the 1985-86 budget for expenditure. This motion carried unanimously.

Appropriations Resolution

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson, that the following resolution be adopted: that, WHEREAS it is desired to make appropriations for each of the different officers and departments for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1985, in accordance with section 331.434(6), Code of Iowa, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The amount itemized by fund and by department or office on the certified County Budget for 1985-86 are hereby appropriated from the resources of each fund so itemized, to the department or office listed in the 1985-86 county budget.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under section 1 shall constitute authorization for the department or officer listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the itemized fund, effective July 1, 1985.

Section 3. In accordance with section 331.437, Code of Iowa, no department or officer shall expend or contract to expend any money or incur any liability, or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditure of money for any purpose in excess of the amount appropriated pursuant to their resolution.

Section 4. If at any time during the 1985-86 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriation, he shall immediately so inform the Board and recommend appropriate corrective action

Section 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amount charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers quarterly during the 1985-86 budget year.

Section 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business June 30, 1986.

The above and foregoing resolution was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, on July 9, 1985, by a unanimous vote.

Resolution for Interfund Operating Transfers

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to transfer monies from the General Basic fund to the General Supplemental fund and the Secondary Road fund; and to transfer from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Rural Services Supplemental fund and the Secondary Roads fund; and, WHEREAS said operating transfers are in accordance with section 331.432, Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$960,350 is ordered transferred from the General Basic to the General Supplemental fund, with one-half the amount to be transferred effective July 1, 1985, and the last one-half to be transferred on January 1, 1986. The sum of \$111,330 is ordered transferred from Rural Services Basic fund to the Rural Services Supplemental fund, with one-half transferred as of July 1, 1985, and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1986. The sum of \$109,889 is ordered transferred from the General Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund with one-half the amount transferred effective July 1, 1985 and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1986. The sum of \$1,220,500 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund with one-half the amount transferred effective July 1, 1985, and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1986.

Section 2. The Auditor is directed to correct his books accordingly and to notify the Treasurer of this operating transfer, accompanying the notification with a copy of this resulution and the record of its adoption.

The above and foregoing resolution was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa on July 9, 1985.

Resolution for Interfund Operating Transfer

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to authorize the Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Basic and Rural Services Basic funds to the Secondary Road fund during the 1985-86 budget year, and WHEREAS, said transfers must be in accordance with section 331.432, Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa as follows:

Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, shall not exceed the sum of \$109,889; and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, shall not exceed the sum of \$1,220,500.

Section 2. Within 30 days of being notified of the apportionment of current property taxes, state replacements against levied property taxes, mobile home taxes, military service tax credit replacements, or livestock credit replacements to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic funds, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said fund to the Secondary Road fund.

Section 3. The amount of the transfer required by section 2 shall be equal to the apportionment made under section 2 to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic fund, respectively multiplied by this ratio of said funds total maximum transfer to the Secondary Road fund to the sum of said funds total current property tax levy, total mobile home taxes, total military service tax credit replacements, and total livestock credit replacements.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this resolution, total transfers to the Secondary Road fund shall not exceed the amounts specified in section 1. Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3, the amount of any transfer

shall not exceed fund balances in the transferring fund as of the end of the fiscal year. Section 6. The Auditor is directed to correct his books when said operating transfers are made and to notify the Treasurer and the County Engineer of the amounts of said transfers.

The above and foregoing resolution was adopted by unanimous vote of the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, on July 9, 1985.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTIETH MEETING, 1985 SESSION (30) July 23, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Absent: Burnside. Gustafson.

9:00 A. M. -- The time having arrived for the canvass of the Sioux Rapids Special Franchise Election held July 16, 1985 for Iowa Electric Light & Power Company to determine if Iowa Electric should be granted a 25 year franchise to erect, construct, re-construct, maintain and operate in the City of Sioux Rapids. Upon completion of the official canvass, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson, that the results be declared as follows: Upon the question "Shall a 25 year non-exclusive franchise to operate a power plant within the city of Sioux Rapids be granted to Iowa Electric Light & Power Company?" There were 136 ballots cast of which 107 were cast "YES" and 25 were cast "NO". There were 4 challenged ballots which The measure was declared passed. were not counted.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to reappoint Richard Iehl to the Lincoln Township Fire District Board of Trustees for a 3 year term expiring 7-1+88. Ayes--all.

It was noted that County Attorney Corwin Ritchie has appointed Maurine Heeger as Assistant Buena Vista County Attorney with the sole responsibility for enforcement of Child Support obligations in Buena Vista County. County Attorney Ritchie then reviewed his letter to Webster County regarding their refusal to reimburse Buena Vista County for the commitment costs of two Webster County residents. He suggested that Webster County be contacted by telephone.

County Assessor Ted VanGrootheest discussed Senate File 509 which requires the Board of Supervisors to appoint either the Conservation Board or the County Assessor to inspect the lands designated as forest and fruit tree reserves. After the explanation, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes, to appoint the Buena Vista County Conservation Commission to inspect the forest and fruit tree areas. Ayes -- all.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney presented his 6 month arrest report. He also inquired about overtime hours and was informed that information is forthcoming from O.P.P. It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes, that the resolution be adopted to establish a 28E agreement that counties receiving services from Sheriff Departments from other counties in times of emergency or disaster, will pay for gas, oil, meals and lodging expenses incurred while assisting. Ayes--all.

The "Homecoming '86" letter from the Iowa Development Commission was discussed. Supervisor Harjes will continue to look for a person to serve as county chairman on this committee.

A letter was received from Brown & Even concerning a Care Facility Maintenance contract. A meeting of the County Farm committee will be held on 7-25 to discuss this and changes in the telephone system at the care facility.

A letter from the Webster County Care Facility requesting an increase in the cash allowance for one resident was received. This request was denied. The Board stated that all residents should be treated equally.

1:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing in Drainage District #116. Two persons were present for the hearing. Two claims for damages had been received. discussion, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes, to accept the Engineer's final report of acceptance of the contract as being complete as of this date and to pay claims of \$50.00 to Rich Mosbo and \$700.00 to Norm Eastman. Ayes -- all.

Anita Hallquist, Director of Human Services, presented a proposed revision to the General Services guidelines. After discussion, it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS certain revisions of Buena Vista County's General Relief Rules which include Appendix I to the Rules have been recommended to the Buena Vista

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-FIRST MEETING, 1985 SESSION (31) August 6, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Burnside. Absent: Gustafson.

Minutes of the July 9th and 23rd meetings were read and approved.

Norman Lund and Roger Sievers informed the Board about the weed program and what had been done this year. They will make maps showing the areas worked.

Ferne Frederiksen inquired about burial expenses for veterans. A policy needs to be established enumerating guidelines to follow in arriving at how to determine needs.

Denise Kleen, Communications Supervisor, explained the "Hawkeye Plan" offered by Northwestern Bell Telephone Company. Whereupon, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside authorizing the Communications Center to purchase the "Hawkeye Plan" for use in making long distance calls. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail, to abate taxes for the 1982-83 year in the amount of \$264.48 on property listed in the name of Henry C. and Sadie Herrig, with contract to Theodore H. Grau described as Machinery & Equipment assessed as real estate in Sioux Rapids-Rembrandt-Lee, Section 6-93-36 as the property is no longer there. Ayes--all.

Charlene Lickiss, Department of Human Services, presented the form needed to be completed to establish the rent from the State for the Human Services offices in the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Paula Adkins, Don Elk and Jim Faust are to be the appraisers to establish the rate.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside, authorizing the Chairman to sign the agreement with Spencer Municipal Hospital to hospitalize psychiatric impatients and establishing the conditions to be met when doing so. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail, to appoint Mrs. Avonne C. Frederickson, 1307 West Highway St., Alta, Iowa, to the Buena Vista County local Board of Health, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mrs. Pat Patten. Term expires 12-31-87. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside, to employ Layne Hasenbank, effective 8-1-85, in the Secondary Road Department with a beginning salary of \$6.50 per hour with rate increases of uniform increments each six (6) months to be consistent with the base salary being paid at that time. At the end of the two year period, he shall be paid the standard base rate. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Harjes, that the maintenance Seal Coat contract with Rohlin Construction, Estherville, Iowa, be accepted as complete with the understanding that if aggregate stripping problems should occur on M-36 (project No. 3) between this date and the Spring of 1986, the contractor will, at his expense, re-seal the affected area if it occurs within the area shown on the attached letter. The said agreement was drafted and signed by the contractor to cover a particular area on the project where oil samples did not meet testing requirements, and that the final settlement be based upon Estimate No. 1 and subfinal as submitted this date, with the total amount earned being \$135,071.83. Ayes--all.

Dan Copeland, representing Walt Garner Associates, requested permission to talk with the county employees concerning Cancer Insurance. The county presently has a carrier for Cancer Insurance, this being Statesman Insurance. The Board granted permission to Mr. Copeland to talk to the employees concerning cancer and intensive care coverage.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Harjes, to approve the following reports: 4th quarter Farm-to-Market funds, June Care Facility and County Farm, July 1985 Child Support Recovery, ADTU, NWIPDC, Clerk's fees, Court Revenue, Small Claims, and Care Review Committee. Ayes--all.

The Medical Examiner's fees were discussed and the decision was made to continue with the present fee schedule which is \$50 per case plus necessary expenses.

Jeff Chindlund informed the Board that he would like to rent the county farm ground. He presented a program using ridge planting; he also would use the conventional system if this is what they preferred. The Board congratulated him on a well prepared presentation, but informed him that the land had already been rented to Demers Farms.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the August 6, 1985 meeting were read and approved.

County Drainage Engineer Darel Burns informed the Board about the meeting held with State Conservation, DWAWM, and the state committee on drainage to attempt to establish authority over drainage districts. This will be discussed at length at a later date. Mr. Burns then explained that there was a claim against D.D. #274 in the amount of \$11,689.26. The landowners need to be notified and a joint meeting with Sac County scheduled. Whereupon, Sac County was contacted by telephone and the meeting was scheduled for Monday, September 16,1985, at 10:00 A. M., Monday, September 30, 1985, in the Public Meeting Room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse be set for the hearing of said report by all interested parties, and that the County Auditor be instructed to publish proper notice of this proposed hearing, and to also inform all interested parties by mail of the scheduled meeting. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, grading project #586 with Doyle Construction Company, and to make final payment according to the County Engineer's recommendation. Ayes--all.

Larry Jensen of Jensen Spraying and Norman Lund were present to report on the effectiveness of spraying with KRENITE. They also discussed further use of the product. The Board made an inspection of a county road east of Lakeside. This will receive attention.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the September 17th meeting were read and approved.

County Auditor Julius reported that Buena Vista County received \$24,427.33 as their share of the 1984-85 liquor revenue. \$85,988.75 was the total received by the cities in Buena Vista County. It was the opinion that all of this money should be used for rehabilitation programs before being distributed, thereby making this a "user fee" expense rather than the expense of the property taxpayer.

Tom Frederiksen and Bob Brostad, Commissioners for Veterans Affairs presented some proposed guidelines for aid to veterans. After much discussion it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail to approve the guidelines for Veterans Affairs as presented, a copy being on file in the Auditor's Office. Aves--ail

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns informed the Board in regard to a request for a right-of-way to use a private tile outlet. A Petition is needed before the Board can respond to the request.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign the contractor's bond for Wirtjers Trucking, Inc., Sac City, in the amount of \$5,920.00. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes to approve the application of Contel to bury cable 3 miles northwest of Newell between sections 11-12, 2-11, 3-10 Providence Township. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside authorizing Interim Committee Member Lorna Burnside to sign approval for work to be done at sites 85-18 and 85-19 Drainage District #181 at an estimated cost of \$4,500.00. Ayes--all.

Sheriff Duane Heeney inquired about the effects of the Fair Labor Standards Act upon his scheduling of work for the Deputies. This is being investigated at the present. He was instructed to obtain estimates for a new sink, cabinets, and painting for the jail.

Sue Morrow, Care Facility Administrator, showed a sketch of the proposed sign to be erected at the Care Facility. She was instucted to proceed. The state is going to erect location signs for the care facility along Highway #71 and highway C-49 to direct people to the facility. She stated it is time to start renegotiations for collective bargaining at the care facility. The first session should be before October 15th.

Anita Hallquist, County Director of Human Services informed the board about several residents. She stated she would like to "clear out" some old records, whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside authorizing the Director to expunge General Relief records more than five years old. Aves--all.

Dr. T. E. Shea, Ardyth Plath, Tom Neal and Verne Campbell, on behalf of the Izaak Walton League, presented a paper stating that roadside nesting is the only hope for Pheasants. 24% of the pheasants are hatched along the roadside, 75% for the gray Partridge. A good educational program in our schools and the cooperation of all who manage roadways is needed to provide more habitat. Such a program should: 1. discourage mowing along roadsides before August 1 - except the shoulders of the roads. 2. burn roadsides only once every 4-5 years. 3. use spot spraying for noxious weeds, etc., and provide good native plants such as alfalfa and clover and good native grasses such as switch grass for cover. The Board thanked them for their interest and information.

Marian McNabb told the Board that she and a group are trying to start a nature trail on old railroad property near Linn Grove. She is attempting to obtain quit claim deeds from 9 adjoining property owners to the railroad near Linn Grove to establish a 2 mile nature trail. The Board granted her permission to try to obtain quit claim deeds and to present them to the county conservation board who in turn would present them to the county for recording.

Judge Vipond, Chief Judge of the 3rd Judicial District which encompasses

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following other members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside

Minutes of the November 26, 1985 meeting were read and approved.

Ray Kurtz, County Sanitarian, reported on the work he is doing around the county. The Board commended for his work and for informing them of what has been done.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail to forgive the back taxes in the amount of \$410.00 on a mobile home located in Marathon, Iowa on LeRoy Lind's property. Ayes--all.

Don Linnan, County Engineer, discussed the priority snow removal roads for the 1985-86 season. The final map showing the routes will be on file in the County Engineer's office.

First Aid training for county employees will be conducted by Denise Kleen, who is a certified instructor, probably some time in January.

1:00 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the third and final reading of proposed Buena Vista County Ordinance #5. No interested persons were present for the hearing. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to strike the comma after the word "limit" in section 7, number 3, and to add a comma after the word "bridges". Ayes--all. It was then moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to adopt Ordinance #5 as amended, this being the 3rd and final reading, with the Ordinance to become effective upon publication with these Board minutes. The adopted ordinance being as follows:

BUENA VISTA COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 5

Title. An Ordinance Establishing the Area Service System B road Classification in Buena Vista County, Iowa.

Be in Enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. $\underline{\text{Purpose}}$. The purpose of this ordinance is to classify certain roads on the area service system in Buena Vista County to provide for a reduced level of maintenance.

SECTION 2. <u>Definitions</u>. For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

- "Area Service System" includes those public roads outside of municipalities not otherwise classified.
 - a. "Area Service System A" roads shall be maintained in conformance with applicable state statutes.
 - b. "Area Service System B" roads shall not require standards of maintenance equal to trunk, trunk collector, or area service system A roads. Area Service System B roads shall not mean what is construed in the normal sense as a driveway or a private lane to a farm building or dwelling.
- 2. "Board" shall mean the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County.
- 3. "Engineer" shall mean the County Engineer of Buena Vista County.

 SECTION 3. Powers of the Board. All jurisdiction and control over Area Service System B roads as provided by this ordinance shall rest with the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County.

 SECTION 4. Authority to Establish. The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County is empowered under authority of Chapter 309, Towa Code, to classify secondary roads on the area system to provide for a reduced level of maintenance on roads so designated. The Board shall by resolution declare its

SECTION 5. Notice of Hearing. The Board shall fix a time and place for a hearing and cause notice to be published as provided by law. The notice shall set forth the termini of the area service system B road as set out in the resolution of the Board, and shall state that all persons interested may appear and be heard at such hearing.

SECTION 6. Hearing-Area Service System B Road Established by Resolution. On the day fixed for the hearing or any day to which the hearing has been adjourned, upon proof to its satisfaction made by On the day fixed for the affidavit of due publication and posting of the notice of hearing, the Board shall consider any and all relevant evidence and if the Board finds that the proposed Area Service System B road is practicable, it may establish it by proper resolution.

SECTION 7. Maintenance Policy. Only the minimum effort, expense, and attention will be provided to keep area service system B roads open to traffic. Bridges may not be maintained to carry legal loads but will be posted as appropriate to advise of any load limitations. For the various maintenance activities, the minimum maintenance on Area Service Level B roads will be as follows:

1. Blading - Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.

Snow and Ice Removal - Snow and ice will not be removed nor will the road surface be sanded or salted.

Signing - Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. All Area Service Level B roads shall be identified with a sign at all points of access to warn the public of the lower level of maintenance.

Weeds, Brush and Trees - Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush, and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.

Structures - Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.

Road Surfacing - There will be no surfacing materials applied to area surface system B roads.

Shoulders - Shoulders will not be maintained.

Crown - A crown will not be maintained. 8.

9. Repairs - There will be no road repair on a regular basis.

Uniform Width - Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.

Inspections - Regular inspections will not be conducted. 10.

SECTION 8. Exemption from Liability. As provided in House File 786, Acts of the 69th General Assembly, 1981 session, the county and officers, agents, and employees of the county are not liable for injury to any person or for damage to any vehicle or equipment, which occurs approximately as a result of the maintenance of a road which is classified as Area Service System B, if the road has been maintained

as provided in Section 7 of this ordinance. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Repealer.

ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged

it is the shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 11. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, it has been the policy of Buena Vista County, and

WHEREAS, it is in compliance with Federal and State law BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that Buena Vista County owned vehicles shall continue to be used only for county business, this includes the use for transportation from home to work, and return, when deemed advisable by the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors. This resolution passed unanimously.

- The time having arrived for the opening of insurance quotes for 1986. One person was present for the opening. One quote was received. Don Elk presented the ISAC insurance program and the costs were compared with the 1985 costs and found to be considerably higher. After opening the bids and finding that Temple Construction's bid on Division 2 did not meet the qualifications, and with Puhrmann Construction withdrawing their bid on Division 2, the rest of the bids were read and considered. It was then moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail to return the certified checks to all bidders except the two low bidders in each division Ayes--all. It was then moved by Vail, seconded by Harjes to accept the low bids, this being from Puhrmann Construction on Division 1, at a cost of \$38,656.48, and Giese Construction on Division 2, at a cost of \$9,008.00, and to retain the certified check on the second low bids for each division pending the signing of the contracts and furnishing of bonds. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-THIRD MEETING, 1985 SESSION (43) December 17, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, pursuant to adjournment, at 9:00 A.M. for the main purpose of discussing the purchase of heavy equipment. Chairman Radke conducted the meeting with the following members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside. Also present were the Caterpillar representative, John Deere representative, and Buena Vista County Maintenance Shop Foreman Brad Raveling.

The Caterpillar representative presented his recommendations for the purchase of a Caterpillar 6S Bulldozer. The John Deere representative then requested a chance to bid. The Board then discussed the request, deciding to not let the Deere representative quote on the Dozer but to let him quote on the Loader. The discussion was then delayed until later in the day.

A letter was received from the Sioux Rapids-Rembrandt Community Development Committee stating that they support the concept of the proposed Buena Vista Industrial Corporation. This letter was placed on file.

The Compensation Board's letter of recommended salaries for elected officials for fiscal year 1986-87 was then discussed. Information was presented by the County Auditor showing the increases given by the schools, cities and County Hospital. A chart showing the effect of the 4% increase on the elected officials salaries and their deputies salaries and the amount of tax increase this would make on a \$50,000.00 house was also considered. After further discussion and consideration the Chairman asked for a motion. There was no motion made. Further discussion followed. Whereupon it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to accept the compensation Board's recommendation and grant a 4% increase to all elected officials. The vote on this motion was: Ayes-2, Nays-2. Whereupon the Auditor polled the Board with the results being: Ayes-Vail, Gustafson. Nays-Harjes, Burnside, Radke. The motion was defeated. After further discussion and consideration a motion was made by Harjes, seconded by Burnside to grant a 3% raise rather than a 4% raise, thereby reducing the Compensation Board's recommendation by 1%. Further discussion followed. The Chairman called for the vote with the result being: Ayes-Burnside, Harjes. Nays-Gustafson. Abstain-Vail. This was declared no decision since it did not constitute a majority. After further consideration Vail changed his vote to Aye. Therefore the motion carried. This resulted in the salaries for fiscal year 1986-87 to be as follows: County Attorney-\$21,698.82; County Auditor-\$22,424.69; County Clerk of Court-\$21,901.65; County Recorder-\$21,901.65; County Sheriff-\$25,740.00; County Treasurer-\$21,901.65; Board of Supervisors: Chairperson-\$12,780.00, Members (each)-\$12,355.20.

The two salesmen returned to the meeting and the discussion on heavy equipment resumed. The salesmen each explained the warranty on their loader to the Board. The price quoted for a 1986 model John Deere Loader was \$77,494.00 with delivery to be the first week in March. The price for the Caterpillar Loader was given as \$81,000.00 with immediate delivery. The Board then asked the Deere salesman to leave the room and they negotiated with the Caterpillar salesman for the purchase of a Loader and a Dozer. After much discussion it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes to purchase a Caterpillar Dozer and Loader. They accepted the bid of \$148,000 from Gibbs-Cook, Inc., Des Moines, Iowa, for a new Caterpillar Loader and Dozer, plus the trade-in of a 1946 D-7 Push-Cat, a 1950 Cat Dozer and a 1973 International Dozer. The payment is to be made for each piece of equipment upon delivery.

A letter was received from NACo asking for a special contribution to be used for trying to get Congress to reinstate Revenue Sharing for a 3 year period. Whereupon it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson to contribute \$255.00 to the National Association of Counties to be used for lobbying for the reinstatement of Federal Revenue Sharing. Ayes--all.

Don Elk and Clark Fort approached the Board in regard to the furnishing of insurance for 1986. Mr. Elk stated that PENCo would not quote on the insurance this year. After much discussion it was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside to accept the quotes for the ISAC sponsored insurance program as stated in the Colburn and Elk letter dated December 10, 1985 with the following exceptions: item #2 dealing with Contractors Equipment is to be excluded; item #4 dealing with Comprehensive liability is to have a \$250.00 property damage deductible at a reduced premium of at least \$1,000.00; and to consider item #6 dealing with Umbrella coverage when it becomes available. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail to approve the detour of part or all of Highway M-54 from Highway #10 north for approximately one mile on the east side of section 20-93-35, Poland Twp., due to the construction and installation of a sewer line in the road ditch. The contractor is to reimburse Buena Vista County for all expenses incurred in setting up and maintaining of detour signs and the removal of same, plus any cost of clean-up of pavement or right-or-way needed to restore the road to original condition. Buena Vista County will not allow the detour to be in place from December 21, 1985 to January 2, 1986. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson to adjourn to Monday, December 23, 1985 at 9:00 A.M.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-FOURTH MEETING, 1985 SESSION (44) December 23, 1985

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Radke presiding, and with the following others members present: Harjes, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside

Minutes of the December 10th and 17th meetings were read and approved.

Darel Burns, County Drainage Engineer, presented three requests for tree removal along D.D. #34. The requests were by Ray Spragg, Bloom Farms, and Roger Bjork to remove trees on their own land. Mr. Burns explained the difference in the prices quoted for doing the work and the fact that the stumps should be treated after cutting. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside that whereas quotations to remove trees from drainage district right-of-way were received from Roger Bjork for 300% of IDOT tree schedule for trees in SE½ Section 34-93-35 and Bloom Farms for 300% of IDOT tree schedule for trees in NE½ Section 34-93-35; and from Jerome Loving and Ray Spragg for 400% of IDOT tree schedule for trees in SW½ Section 28-92-35; BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the above individuals be invited to sign individual contracts with Drainage District #34 in the amount of 300% of the IDOT tree schedule with the provision that all parties are agreeable to treat the cut tree stumps, within 24 hours of the cutting, with brush killer furnished by the Drainage District. The Drainage Engineer is to prepare contracts in that amount and notify each individual of the decision of the Board of Supervisors. The vote on this motion was: Ayes--all.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson to increase the base rate for residential care at the Buena Vista County Care Facility to \$25.00 per day effective February 1, 1986. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson to permit one person (T.P.12-23-85) to receive training at Hope Haven, Inc., for an indefinite period. Ayes--all.

Steve Afdahl and Rick Blahauvietz, representing Hawkeye Bank and Trust of Spencer, Iowa presented a letter concerning the Farm Fuel Products Company land, buildings, and machinery and equipment on which delinquent taxes are owed in an amount exceeding \$100,000.00. They are requesting a settlement of approximately \$25,000.00 for all taxes now due. The Board took this under consideration and will consult with the County Attorney and County Treasurer before reaching a decision on what course of action to follow.

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Vail that the "fellow employee exclusion" be deleted from the General Liability policy for a 10% surcharge to the General Liability premium. Ayes—all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside authorizing the Chairman to sign a contract between Drainage District #49 and Puhrmann Tiling and Excavating, Havelock, Iowa in the amount of \$38,656.00 and to approve the performance bonds and payment bonds for same. Ayes--all.

R.O.W. Resolution

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Burnside authorizing the purchase of right-of-way at one and one-half (1½) times the assessed valuation as of this date and for calendar year 1986, and the county also agrees to pay the actual labor cost to remove any existing fence and if requested will blade the dirt away before removal. If the fence is rebuilt within 18 months of the completion of the road grading, the County will pay the actual cost of fence material that cannot be reused and the labor to rebuild. The County will not participate in material costs or added labor cost to replace a barb wire fence with a woven wire fence. The maximum labor payments are: \$6.50/rod to remove woven wire and \$6.50/rod to replace woven wire fencing; and \$4.50/rod to remove barb wire and \$4.50/rod to replace barb wire fencing. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Gustafson that the following resolution be adopted: For economic reasons the Buena Vista County Board of Suervisors will study and review the feasibility of allowing an outside party to contract the services provided by the Buena Vista County Care Facility. This resolution carried unanimously.

It was noted that Iowa Electric Light & Power Company has requested a rate increase as of December 23, 1985.

Buena Vista College has invited all city and county employees to be their guests at a "basketball night out" on Tuesday, January 14, 1986. The Supervisors plan to attend. There will be a reception following the game.

A resolution to assist in collecting fines of Buena Vista County residents was submitted by the County Attorney at the request of the Iowa State Patrol. This was taken under advisement pending discussion with the County Treasurer and Clerk of Court.
