BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SECOND MEETING, 1986 SESSION (2) January 7, 1986

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the December 31, 1985 and January 2, 1986 meetings were read and approved.

Rollin Sievers, Custodian, explained that the claim for the December heating bill was in excess of \$6,000.00 but that the Kw used were less than in 1978. He inquired about changing the thermostats now in use to automatic thermostats that turn themselves down at night and back up before office hours The Board instructed him to investigate and report back.

County Attorney Corwin Ritchie and County Treasurer Nina Roberts reported to the Board about the taxes now due on the Farm Fuel Products property. The taxes have been due for more than two years. The Board has the authority to compromise the taxes. After discussion, the Board requested the County Attorney to contact the owner to see if a compromise can be agreed upon. This will be discussed again at the January 21st meeting.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Vail that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS, \$321.40, Iowa Code, as amended by House File 454, Seventy-first General Assembly, provides that the county treasurer can refuse to renew motor vehicle registrations under the circumstances set

BE IT RESOLVED that the Buena Vista County Treasurer shall refuse to renew the registration of any vehicle registered in Buena Vista County if the person applying for renewal shall have an outstanding arrest warrant issuing out of Court within Buena Vista County for a violation arising out of Chapter 321 of the Code of Iowa and as set forth in \$321.40, Iowa Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Buena Vista County Clerk of Court shall by the last day of each month notify the Buena Vista County Treasurer of all persons against whom such a warrant has been issued and remains outstanding. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall not apply to transfer of registration or to new registrations. This resolution was approved January 7, 1986.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney inquired about the replacement schedule for Sheriff's cars. He was instructed to budget for 3 cars in the 1986-87 budget.

Mayor Russ Roberts and councilmembers Elmer Bright, Charles Joss, Ray Pacholke and Police Chief Dave Huntley from Sioux Rapids inquired about having county law enforcement the same as Marathon and Albert City. They asked about the cost and whether any money could be saved by having the county do

Resolution

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to approve a joint application with the City of Storm Lake, Iowa to the Iowa D.O.T. for the approval of the use of R.I.S.E. (Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy) Funds for the paving of the county road on the East side of Section 35-91-37. The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County agrees to provide 50% matching funds from the Secondary Road Fund for the county project. This resolution passed unanimously.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail authorizing the Chairman to sign the contract and approve the Contractors Bond with Giese Construction Company, Eagle Grove, Iowa for project No. B.V.C. 35-85 & B.V.C. 36-85. Ayes--all.

Glen Huntington, John Rodeen, Neal Quirin, Bob Raymer, John Hopkins and Alan Waggie, representing the Storm Lake Industrial Commission, informed the Board as to how the development of a county-wide organization is progressing. Mr. Rodeen related what he has been doing and what he intends to do during 1986. They want to have a county-wide budget for 1986-87 with Storm Lake contributing 1/3, private contributions to be 1/3, and the county to contribute 1/3 (\$30,000.00). This will be discussed further when budgets are considered.

Pastor Steinborn and Craig Bell, representing the Lutheran Family Services Group Home, informed the Board about the work they have been doing and about the services provided at the Home. They requested consideration of a 5% increase for 1986-87 on the perdiem costs, or increasing from \$13.61 per day per resident to \$14.30 per day per resident. This is for each resident from Buena Vista County. This will be taken under advisement and considered at budget time.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson to admit one person (S.P.1-7-86) as a resident from Buena Vista County to the Lutheran Services Group Home, Storm Lake, at a cost to the county of \$13.61 per day. Ayes--all.

John Demers reported on the 1985 crop outcome at the county farm. Crop planting costs amounted to \$85.42 per acre. The supplies necessary for planting the 1986 crop were ordered.

It was noted that a Human Services Fair will be held April 12, 1986 from 9:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. at the Cobblestone Inn, Storm Lake, with about 30 services being represented.

Darlene Peterson, Buena Vista County Nurse, reported on the County Nursing Department activities and the need for Professional Liability insurance. Whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to purchase Professional Liability Insurance from Colburn & Elk Agency, with Creative Underwriters as the Carrier, at a cost of \$1,147.00 and with the policy to be issued in the name of Buena Vista County with Buena Vista County being an additional named insured. Ayes—all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign a contract with Roger Bjork and with Bloom Farms for tree cutting on Drainage District #34. Ayes--all.

A certified letter was received from the Iowa Department of Water, Air and Waste Management informing the Board that they were in non-compliance with the water quality at the Care Facility. They were given until February 14, 1986 to submit a written plan to correct the non-compliance.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, pursuant to adjournment, at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

County Assessor Ted VanGrootheest informed the Board that there would be a meeting of the Conference Board at 1:30 P.M., Tuesday, January 28, 1986 to discuss the 1986-87 budget.

Gary Christiansen, Rick Lampe and Arnie Hicks discussed the need to establish a County Conservation Capitol Improvements fund in order to accumulate funds to expend on the Linn Grove.dam. Where upon it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke that the following resolution be adopted: BE IT RESOLVED that there hereby be established a Buena Vista County Conservation Land Acquisition and Development Trust fund as a part of the Capitol Projects fund in Service Area 0. It is hereby agreed to authorize the County Auditor to transfer \$50,000.00 from the County General Basic fund to the County Conservation Land Acquisition and Development Trust fund to be used for the repair of the Linn Grove dam. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to adopt the following policy for providing access

driveways, free to the landowner, as part of a road grading project:

If desired by landowner, all existing driveways will be replaced at the present location or a location on the grading project chosen by the landowner that does not cause a sight distance problem. If the design of the road necessitates an additional drive or drives to provide reasonable access, the extra drives will be constructed at county expense. All other approved drives will be paid for by the landowner at the current rate being charged for driveways at other locations. Ayes -- all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside that the following schedule for fees and expenses of the Mental Health Advocate be recommended: \$15.00 per hour time expended and 21 cents per mile for mileage transportation required. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County administers all the legally established drainage districts in Buena Vista County, and WHEREAS many of the drainage districts in Buena Vista County consist in part of open drainage ditches, and WHEREAS, beavers are continually causing damage to the drainage ditches and drainage districts by virtue of impairing the flow of water, construction of dams causing flooding and also causing bank erosion, all of which results in considerable additional maintenance expense for the drainage district, and WHEREAS, it is desirable to reduce the population of beavers in drainage districts to reduce the cost of maintenance for said drainage districts. BE IT THEREFORE RE-SOLVED: 1. That the Board of Supervisors in maintaining drainage ditches in Buena Vista County drainage districts agree to pay \$25.00 for each beaver which is trapped in a drainage ditch of a drainage district in Buena Vista County during the existence of this resolution. 2. Said payment will be paid by the particular drainage district in which the beaver was trapped as a part of the costs of maintenance of the facilities of said district. 3. This policy shall become effective upon the date of the adoption of this resolution and shall remain in effect until the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County shall adopt a resolution to rescind this resolution. In the event of rescission of this resolution the payment will still be made for beavers which are trapped during the existence of this resolution so long as appropriate claim is filed as hereinafter provided within sixty days after the rescission of this resolution. 4. In the event the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County do rescind this resolution, they shall publish notice of said rescission in each of the official newspapers published in Buena Vista County within thirty days after the rescission of said resolution. 5. Claim forms shall be provided by the County Auditor's office and the claim for any beavers trapped under this resolution must be filed in writing on the claim form furnished by the County Auditor. Said claim form shall indicate the drainage district and the section number and township where the particular beaver was trapped. The date of the trapping shall be on said form as well as other information which may be required by the Board of Supervisors or County Auditor when said form is furnished. 6. The person doing the trapping must comply with all laws and regulations of the Iowa Conservation Commission in performing said trapping operation. The person doing the trapping shall also obtain the appropriate permission from either the landlord or the tenant of the premises on which the trapping is to take place and the claim form referred to above shall contain a space for the signature of either the landlord or tenant to grant such permission. 7. It shall also be necessary for either the landlo or tenant to certify on said claim form that said beaver was trapped on the described premises and on 7. It shall also be necessary for either the landlord the date indicated by the claimant. Such claim form may provide other information required by the Auditor and Board of Supervisors and said claim form may be modified from time to time accordingly. That payment will not be made on each claim as filed but payments will be made at such intervals as may be determined by the Board of Supervisors and the County Auditor. 9. That this resolution is not intended to eradicate beavers, but only to reduce their population in drainage districts because of the considerable expense incurred in maintenance resulting from the activities of the beavers in 10. That this resolution shall also apply to all joint drainage districts between Buena Vista County and surrounding counties when adopted by the joint board for

joint drainage districts. 11. That the drainage minutes for each of the districts in Buena Vista County shall reflect a reference to the adoption of this resolution. 12. That this resolution shall become null and void if the Code of Iowa or the Administrative Rules of the Iowa Conservation Commission remove beaver from the list of furbearing animals and prohibit the taking of beaver by trapping. Supervisors voted Aye on this resolution. WHEREUPON the Chairman of the Board declared said resolution adopted this date.

The salaries for county employees were brought up and the Chairman informed the Auditor to have the budgets submitted with the salary proposals included, at which time they would be discussed further.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 4:30 P.M.

Rhonda Christensen, Extension Director and Home Economist, and Jerry Weiss, Agriculturist, for the Iowa State Extension Service, informed the Board as to what all is available from the extension service in the way of programs, and also who the extension council is for 1986.

2:00 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the opening of quotes on trucks. 4 persons were present for the opening. One quote was filed at 2:02 P.M. After discussing this it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to allow the late filing to be considered. After opening and discussing the quotes at length, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to purchase Item #1 with option #1, from Fitz-patrick Chevrolet at a net cost of \$11,200.00. Ayes--all. It was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to purchase item #2 with option #1 from Fitzpatrick Chevrolet at a net cost of \$10,200.00. The County Auditor reported that 7 townships had reported on the question of having a consultant review their contracts and insurance. Six felt it was not necessary and one thought it might be beneficial.

The recipient account statement form for Entitlement period 17 General Revenue Sharing was received and it was noted that the county is scheduled to receive \$229,267 this period. The county received \$256,673 during entitlement period 16.

A letter was received from Jack Whitmer in regard to using a summer intern from Iowa State University for accrual accounting purposes. The Board instructed the Auditor to write and try to get one for this summer's use.

Keith Moe, Merle Hogrefe and Kevin Zadow representing the city of Albert City, and Duane Heeney and Jack Hays from the Sheriff's department discussed renewing the law enforcement contract for the next four years. The Albert City Council stated that they believe that 75% of the Deputy's time is spent in Albert City, therefore they should pay 75% of the cost of a Deputy. However, there was a difference of opinion as to what this cost amounts to. Albert City is willing to pay \$21,759.52 and they feel that this is all that they can afford at this time. Sheriff Heeney stated that the cost of a Deputy including car is about \$30,794.86 per year. This will be discussed again at the next Board meeting, February 11, 1986 at 10:00 A.M.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING TWELFTH MEETING, 1986 SESSION (12) February 20 and 21, 1986

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in special session, with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside. This meeting was scheduled for four periods over two days with public hearings to be held at 10:00 A.M. and 1:15 P.M. each day, in order to determine which roads should be classified as System level "B" roads. The meetings were held in the public meeting room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse.

This being the first meeting, it was called to order by Chairman Harjes. He made a few explanatory remarks and then called upon County Engineer Don Linnan to explain why System level "B" roads were being considered. The roads were then discussed as printed in the public notice. 14 persons were present for this 10:00 A.M. meeting. People wanting to be heard were: Phil Lietz whose main concern was that the roads not be abandoned. The roads will be maintained so that farmers may get to their fields. They should not be used during wet weather. Any bridges needing to be replaced will be subject to public hearing. There will be no easing of taxes because of low level maintenance. estimate is that about \$2,000 per mile will be saved because of low level maintenance, and the cost of liability should also be reduced.

Marvin Hinkeldey thinks the roads should be maintained in the winter, and summer maintenance reduced to once per month. Greg Drzycimski said that a priority should be to work with utilities when needed in the winter. If cost savings are necessary the landowners should be asked to spray their own roads for weeds. However the Iowa code states that the county is responsible for noxious weeds. Once a level "B" road is designated it will probably remain in this class unless an awfully good reason develops for it to be changed.

This meeting adjourned at 11:40 A.M., to be continued until 2:30 P.M. on Friday, Feb. 21, 1986.

1:15 P.M. -- The meeting reconvened to discuss the roads scheduled for public hearing at this meeting. 12 persons were present for the hearing. Chairman Harjes opened the meeting and turned the meeting over to the county Engineer to conduct the hearing and explain the procedure to be followed. John Demers inquired as to what all will be done to maintain level "B" roads. He also feels that the farmers should spray their own road ditches. Ken Edwards asked that school bus routes be maintained and he was assured that they will be.

This hearing adjourned at 2:30 P.M. to be continued until 2:30 P.M. the next day.

10:00 A.M., Friday, February 21, 1986. All the Supervisors were present. Chairman Harjes opened the meeting with a few brief remarks and referred to the county engineer to explain the procedure to be followed for the meeting. 22 persons were present for the meeting. Marvin Jesse said that the bridges are needed to get to his land. He was assured that some type of low water crossing would be maintained. Louis Demers Jr. asked what effect this would have on fire protection. Ron Meyer said that a dry weather farm access road is not good enough for \$12 per acre taxes. They feel that partial graveling would be needed in two or three years to maintain the road. Weed control was also considered. The farming of right-of-way is still prohibited as drainage must still be maintained.

This meeting adjourned at 11:15 A.M., to be continued at 2:30 P.M. this same day.

1:15 P.M. -- The meeting reconvened to discuss the roads scheduled for this time period. 16 persons were present for the hearing. Chairman Harjes opened the meeting and referred to the county engineer to explain the procedure being used. Eldon Schmidt asked what criteria would be needed for reopening a road or reclassification. This would be done by a Board of Supervisors resolution. Spraying of weeds and maintaining of bridges were also concerns mentioned. They felt that gravel should be continued but snow removal stopped.

This meeting adjourned at 2:15 P.M., to be continued at 2:30 in the Board of Supervisors room.

2:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived to discuss the action to be taken regarding the public hearings held for Service level "B" roads. After much discussion it was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the following resolution be adopted:

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the April 15, 17 and 21, 1986 meetings were read and approved.

Ferne Frederiksen, County Recorder, introduced Jennifer Foell to the Board as an EBCE student who will be observing the work done in the Courthouse for the next three weeks. She stayed to observe the Board meeting.

G. Richard Burr, former Supervisor and presently the County Advocate for the mentally ill persons who are Buena Vista County persons, reported that eleven of the Care Facility residents are mentally ill Buena Vista County persons. There are six persons from other counties that are involuntarily committed and reside at the county Care Facility.

Marian McNabb reported that she and her husband have been trying to build a nature trail on the abandoned railroad ground near Linn Grove. They have obtained one deed and have tried to present it to the County Conservation Board. That board has refused to accept it until all the deeds needed for the trail can be presented at the same time. Mrs. McNabb asked the Board to accept the deed so the other needed landowners will then contribute their deeds to the land that is needed for the trail. The Board said that this a Conservation Board's decision to make and that the Supervisors would abide by whatever the Conservation Board's decision might be.

Darel Burns, County Drainage Engineer, reported on the repairs recommended for the joint Drainage District #181. Whereupon it was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail authorizing the Interim Committee Member, Lorna Burnside, to sign the approval for repairs at sites 86-5, 86-6, 86-7, 86-8, 86-9, and 86-10 at a total estimated cost of \$2,235.00 plus an estimated cost of \$1,000.00 for tree removal. Minutes of the April 29, 1986 meeting were read and approved.

Railroad Resolution

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside that in accordance with the Federal District Court Ruling as submitted by the Iowa Department of Revenue and the reassessment schedule dated January 15, 1986, received from the Iowa Department of Revenue for the 1983 and 1984 assessments for the Chicago and Northwestern Transportation Company and the Illinois Central Gulf Railroad which decreases the assessment valuations in the various taxing districts as follows:

County Attorney Corwin Ritchie instructed the Board on what procedure to follow when dealing with scavenger properties. There are currently 20 properties so classified. There are 42 properties on the tax sale list coming due in June. The county currently holds the tax certificate on 20 of the parcels. The owner will be served a notice. He then has 90 days to redeem. After 90 days the county takes a tax deed and can then dispose of the property. Mr. Ritchie was given permission to get help to proceed with this action.

The Mental Health accounts were then discussed with the County Attorney and referred to him for processing. Mr. Ritchie will have help with this procedure also. Mr. Ritchie also instructed the Board on how to proceed with the condemnation of the Ann Smeltzer land needed for road purposes.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to amend the bridge policy established May 28, 1985 to read as follows: "on unpaved county roads in Buena Vista County, to lower the height of the angle iron rails to approximately 18 inches above the deck on I-beam bridges when requested by a farm operator who cannot take implements of husbandry across the bridge because of a width restriction. In conjunction with the lowering of the railing, double facing hazard markers on swinging cantilevered arms will be placed at the approach corners of the bridge. The site is to be reviewed and approved by the County Engineer and the County Supervisor who represents the district in which the bridge is located prior to placement of the arms.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to appoint Supervisor Gustafson as delegate and Burnside as alternate on the Committee Against Domestic Abuse (C.A.D.A.) County Domestic Abuse Advisory Board. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside authorizing the Chairman to sign an agreement with the Northwest lowa Mental Health Center to provide comprehensive mental Health care, to the county and its citizens in accordance with the agreement on file in the county Auditor's office. This is at a cost of approximately \$95,000.00 for fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Burnside, to approve the use of Buckingham Trust funds for Dental work for one person (D.W.5-13-86). Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside, authorizing the Chairman to sign an agreement with the lowa Department of Human Services for the use of Donated funds for specific services from public and private sources during fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney stated that the cabinets in the jail are not quite complete. As soon as they are completed, they will be paid for. Sheriff Heeney stated that the county is using 3 unmarked patrol cars; both marked and unmarked cars are needed in doing sheriff's work.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke, authorizing the Chairman to sign a transmittal letter to the State Department of Health regarding Homemaker-Home Health Aide/Chore application. Ayes--all.

1:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing for Drainage District #83. County Drainage Engineer Darel Burns and Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller and 4 interested persons were present for the hearing. Mr. Burns explained that a petition had been filed requesting work in the district that lies southwest of Linn Grove. He recommended that the work be done according to his report. The district encompasses about 8,000 acres with about 6,000 acres paying all costs. If it is reclassified, it would cost about fifty (50) cents to one dollar per acre for reclassification costs. The current classification is inequitable and reclassification should occur. Whereupon, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson, to direct the Drainage Engineer to prepare plans and specifications for reclassification and work to be done. Ayes--all.

2:30 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the hearing of the report from the Condemnation Commissioners for the Ann Smeltzer land. The three appraisers were present and related what was done to arrive at the recommended award. The land was rated according to the top corn suitability rate. Other damages were considered and the appraisers recommend a total award of \$1,961.67. Whereupon, it was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson, to accept the recommended amount of \$1,961.67 and to direct the County Auditor to issue a warrant to the claimant in said amount to be mailed to the recipient using certified mail with a return receipt, and to include a copy of the appraiser's report. 3:00 P. M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing for Drainage District #3. 14 persons were present for the hearing. Five (5) letters of objection were received. Drainage Engineer Burns and Drainage Attorney Schiller were also present. Chairman Harjes opened the meeting and referred to Engineer Burns. Mr. Burns then reviewed the Engineer's report. The district is located in Elk and Washington Townships, serving an area along Brooke Creek. Engineer Burns recommended repair and clean-out at an estimated cost of approximately \$45,740.00. The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in regular session pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the June 9, 10, and 16, 1986 meetings were read and approved.

Brenda Otto, Deputy Clerk of Court, presented a letter in reference to the purchase of a new type-writer for the Clerk's office. They become a state office July 1, 1986 but the equipment remains in the name of the county until it is replaced by the state. She was told to proceed with the purchase.

Corwin Ritchie, County Attorney, and Ted Brown, Assistant County Attorney, discussed the costs of Mental Health with the Board. Karen Strawn presented a list of accounts that were overdue and should be pursued. They will proceed with the collection by sending a letter to all accounts and will probably file about 100 judgments for collection. It was then moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to concur with the request of the County Attorney and grant a salary increase to Ted Brown, Assistant County Attorney, his salary being increased to \$16,800.00 for fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign a roofing Work Agreement with Ed Van Veldhuizen for the County Care Facility main building on a "time and materials" basis with a guaranteed maximum cost of \$17,500.00. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Burnside to adopt the following resolution 6-24-86 to revise Buena Vista County General Relief Rules and Appendix I to the Rules as follows: WHEREAS certain revisions of Buena Vista County's General Relief Rules are recommended by the Director of General Relief and WHEREAS in the judgment of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors it is advisable to revise certain provisions of the General Relief Rules, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, that the Buena Vista County General Relief Rules be and they are hereby revised, effective June 24, 1986: 1) Article IV, subsection 3, i. (1) is revised by replacing the total paragraph with the following: (1) For an applicant to be eligible for relief as a "poor Person", the lowa statute of "No Property" shall be defined as: the value of a single applicant's property may not exceed \$1,500.00; whereas a household of two or more persons, at least one of whom is age 60 or over or disabled, the applicant's property may not exceed \$2,000.00. The following shall be exempt from consideration as property: a) the homestead and adjoining land, b) basic day to day maintenance items essential to day to day living such as clothes, furniture, cookware, and other similarly essential items, c) one automobile up to \$1,500 of equity value, unless the automobile is necessary to provide the medical treatment of the applicant or a member of the applicant's household, in which case the equity value may not exceed \$4,000.00 d) any burial plots, already owned or being purchased by installment payments; 2) Article IV, subsection 3, is revised to add sub-paragraph N: N) Mandatory SSI application 1) any person who is approved for relief as a poor person shall have made or request an application for SSI with the Social Security within three (3) days of approval for relief. The person shall follow through timely with all requests made by that agency. 2) any one deemed ineligible for SSI, except if: for failure to meet SSI minimum disability period, shall not qualify or continue as a poor person upon the initial decision made with regard to any application processed by the Social Security Office unless and until there has been further considerable medical deterioration and it is reasonably certain that the person will qualify for SSI. 3) Article V, subsection 6, is revised to remove the following: An oral-examination-of-the-decision-shall-be-provided-to-the-applicant-with-a-written-statement-placed-in the record. -- If an oral-explanation is not possible, a copy-of-the written statement shall be -sent-to-the applicant-by-ordinary-mail and to add the following: An oral examination of the decision shall be provided to the applicant along with a written decision by the general relief worker when such relief is approved or denied in whole or in part. 4) Article V, subsection 7, is revised add sentence at the conclusion of the paragraph: If multiple medical reports are available, that includes a report from the University Hospital of Iowa City, the final decision by the General Relief worker shall be based on the report (s) from University Hospital of Iowa City. 5) Article V, subsection 8, is revised to add sentence at conclusion of paragraph: a written notice of cooperation shall be provded when return of additional information is requested of the applicant. 6) Article VII, subsection 2, b, "Decision", the last sentence is revised to remove the following: If the applicant is not present at the time the decision—is—rendered—by—the—Board, a written statement of the Board's decision shall be mailed to the applicant within 5 (5) days. 7) Article VII, subsection 3, "Access to File", is revised to add sentence at the conclusion of paragraph: If non-release of third party material is contested by client, an associate district court judge shall determine if and what third party material in a case file that is relevant or material to the denial or an applicant claim for relief and whether it should be made. available to the applicant. The above resolution passed unanimously.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside that if Cherokee County agrees to fund the C.A.D.A. in the amount of \$1,000.00 and Ida County contributes \$500.00, Buena Vista County will then contribute \$1,000.00 to the C.A.D.A. program. Ayes—all.

Minutes of the June 24, 1986 meeting were read and approved.

This was the final meeting of fiscal year 1985-86.

Norman Lund and Roger Sievers reported on the progress being made by the weed sprayer

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail to approve the request for repair of D.D. #181 at sites 86-16 and 86-15 and to authorize the interim committee member to sign the requests. Ayes--all.

Cathy Cackler, Upper Des Moines, Inc., and Anita Hallquist, County Director of Human Services, presented a copy of the insurance policy covering Work Compensation and employer's liability. After explaining the problem created by an Administrative Ruling, and suggesting a tentative solution to the problem, it was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson to continue the Workfare program with Upper Des Moines, Inc. under the present existing insurance policy, which does not have a clause #2, dealing with the Administrative Rules requirement, and with the assurance that the Agency will continue searching for an insurance policy that meets the Administrative Rules requirement. Ayes—all.

Henry Hardt, an attorney who is assisting the County attorney with the scavenger properties, inquired as to how to proceed with the preparation of the properties for sale. Mr. Hardt will proceed to prepare the Notices to be served.

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the Public Hearing for D.D. #177. Drainage Engineer Darel Burns and Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller were present for the hearing along with four interested persons. Mr. Harjes opened the meeting and called on Mr. Burns to relate the reasons for the meeting. Mr. Burns submitted a written report and estimated it would cost about \$5,000 to make the repairs. Approximately 1,200 acres are involved. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke, to accept the engineer's report and to proceed with the repair by hiring Kooiker Construction to do the work at a cost not to exceed \$4,807.52, and that a levy of 360% be made payable October 1, 1986 at no interest, with interest thereafter to be at 10%, and to offer the owners a 3 year waiver plan for payment. Ayes--all.

2:30 P.M. — The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on D.D. #82. Drainage Engineer Darel Burns and Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller were present along with 12 interested persons. Chairman Harjes opened the meeting and called on Mr. Burns for his report. After hearing the report Auditor Julius read the letters of objection, there being 5 letters on file. Lateral 2 is approximately 710 acres, the proposed improvement involves about 365 acres. The objections totaled about 41.26% of the land in the area. Leslie Bruns made an oral report in favor of the improvement. He stated that in 1961 or 1962 he replaced the claytile with concrete tile at his own expense. He presented three letters dating back to 1983 and before showing that this problem has existed for some time. Keith Geyer has a problem that cannot be handled with the existing tile lines. The sum of \$1,020,000.00 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road fund with one-half the amount transferred effective July 1, 1986 and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1987. The above foregoing resolution was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa on July 8, 1986.

Resolution for Interfund Operating Transfer

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to authorize the Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Basic fund and the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund during the 1986-87 year, and WHEREAS said transfers must be in accordance with section 331.432 Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa as follows:

Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986 shall not exceed the sum of \$110,000.00; and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Services Basic fund to the Secondary Road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986 shall not exceed the sum of \$1,020,000.00.

Section 2. Within 30 days of being notified of the apportionment of current property taxes, state replacements against levied property taxes, Mobile Home taxes, Military service tax credit replacements, or livestock credit replacements to the General Basic or Rural Basic funds, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said fund to the Secondary Road fund.

Section 3. The amount of transfer required by Section 2, shall be equal to the apportionment made under section 2 to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic fund, respectively, multiplied by this ratio of said funds maximum transfer to the Secondary Road fund to the sum of said funds total current property tax levy, total mobile home taxes, total military service tax credit replacements, and total livestock credit replacements.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this resolution, total transfers to the Secondary Road fund shall not exceed the amounts specified in section 1.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3, the amount of any transfer shall not exceed fund balances in the transferring fund as of the end of the fiscal year.

Section 6. The Auditor is directed to correct his books when said operating transfers are made and to notify the Treasurer and the County Engineer of the amounts of said transfers.

The above and foregoing resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Board of Supervisors of Buena vista County, Iowa on July 8, 1986.

Nina Roberts, Buena Vista County Treasurer, informed the Board about the need to respond to the states request for \$159.71 caused by the misappropriation of funds at Winnieshiek County. This was Buena Vista's portion of \$17,474.00. The Board complied with the request.

Mrs. Roberts also inquired about investing county funds out of state. She feels the money should be in ested only in Bunea Vista County to serve the taxpayers. The Board agreed that the money should remain within the county for investment.

County Custodian Rollin Sievers informed the board that Burt Martin was willing to trim the trees around the courthouse for \$25.00 per tree if the county would haul the trash away after the trimming. There are 11 or 12 trees needing trimming. Mr. Sievers was instructed to proceed with the arrangements for the work to be done.

The Buena Vista County Conservation Board met with the Board to discuss the salary for the Conservation Board Administrator. Mr. Lampe asked about the budget process and why Mr. Christiansen was granted only a 3% raise by the Supervisors when a 6% increase was approved in the budget. It was explained that just because it was budgeted doesn't make it so, it is not effective until appropriated. After further discussion it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to amend the motion of June 24th and to concur with the recommendation of the Buena Vista County Conservation Board and grant Gary Christiansen a 6% increase in salary effective July 1, 1986. Ayes--all.

John Haaland and Pat Budde, representing Honeywell, Inc., informed the Board about energy saving programs available through Honeywell. Custodian Rollin Sievers was present for the meeting. Mr. Haaland stated that he would like to draw some plans for the county and make some suggestions for energy saving. The Board granted permission to Mr. Haaland to do a preliminary survey and to report back to the Board at 1:00 P.M., Tuesday, July 22, 1986 on his recommendations.

Pat Rooney, representing Teleconnect, told the Board about his company and the fact that they are now servicing Buena Vista County with their system. It gives a 21st century advantage for transmitting information. He was granted permission to run a 60 day test for the courthouse for an initial cost of \$60.00. If not satisfied at the end of 60 days the money will be refunded. The state department of Human Services located in the courthouse is also going to try the service.

Bob Elmitt and Don Elk, representing the ISAC Insurance program, explained the insurance coverage that the county has at present. They reviewed the current policies and explained the coverage. Mr. Elmitt is going to send a written report back to the county for reference and use when seeking insurance. Their report was well received.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to accept the low bid of Graves Construction Company, Inc., Melvin, Iowa in the amount of \$115,620.54 for bridge project #BROS-9011 (2)--5F-11 and authorize the Chairman to sign the contract. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the contractor's bond of Graves Construction Co., Inc., in the amount of \$115,620.54 for project #BROS-9011(2)--5F-11 and authorize the Chairman to sign same. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to approve the following reports: April, May and June Recorder; June Court Revenue, Small Claims, Court Revenue distribution, ADTU, Conservation report and engineering service agreement, 4th quarter 1985-86 Recorder, Clerk's fees, Sheriff; Engineers report on D.D. #123. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Vail to rescind the resolution of April 29, 1986 which authorized health insurance to be deducted from each paycheck, and to return to deducting the health insurance payment out of the first paycheck of each month for all county employees using the payroll deduction method of payment. This resolution was adopted unanimously.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to concur with the Grant Township Trustees and appoint Leonard L. Peterson Grant Township Clerk to fill the vacancy. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to sign the General Allocation request for payment form and report, and the county's General Allocation Expenditure plan for fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to employ Robert Oglesby in the Secondary Roads Department effective May 16, 1986 with a starting salary of \$7.50 per hour. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson authorizing the Chairman to write the Court Administrator to the effect that the cost for use of the computer by the Clerk of Court will be \$10,400.00 for fiscal year 1986-87. If the Administrator wishes to appeal the ruling she may do so by appearing before the Board at a regular meeting. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail authorizing the Chairman to submit a letter of support to the Northwest Iowa Mental Health Center supporting a request for a grant for a group home for the chronically mentally ill. Ayes—all.

struction of the project has not commenced by the date shown in the timetable, this agreement is null and void and the commitment of RISE funding is revoked. The City and County may request the approval of I.D.O.T. to revise the beginning of construction date. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, each of the parties hereto has executed Agreement No. 86-R-033. This resolution passed unanimously.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-SEVENTH MEETING, 1986 SESSION (37) SEPTEMBER 2, 1986

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in regular session pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the August 19, 1986 meeting were read and approved.

Rick Lampe, Gary Christiansen, Margaret Koch, and Russ Neville, representing the Buena Vista County Conservation Board discussed the Linn Grove dam situation. They have obtained a preliminary Engineer's estimate for the repair of the dam. It is approximately the same figure that has been used in previous discussions. Kuehl & Payer furnished the estimate. No money is available from the state conservation commission for the dam repair as no new fishing has been created, it only serves the old fishing area already being used. The Department of Natural Resources will not fund "low head" dam repair as their staff is against it so it would be necessary to get the state commissioners to overrule their employees. Any money obtained would be a loan, possibly interest free but perhaps subject to prevailing interest rates being paid by the state at the time of the loan. The lowa Natural Heritage Association will loan the money to the county as a 5 year loan, money being obtained from local londers at whatever rate the state would have to pay. This geome like the only obtained from local lenders at whatever rate the state would have to pay. This seems like the only way to go at this time so the Supervisors told the conservation board to proceed with this plan. T bid letting for the repair will probably be about the middle of October.

County Sheriff Duane Heeney stated that the Sheriff's Department is having trouble with one of the 1985 Sheriff's cars. It surges very badly. They may have to use the new "lemon law" to get this corrected. Firestone is no longer in business in Storm Lake so the "lifetime oil change" contract has been cancelled. They will again be paying for servicing their vehicles. Deputy Sheriff Paul Bergman has resigned and it will be at least two months before a replacement can be certified, therefore it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to authorize the Sheriff to employ a part-time person to serve on a part-time basis at the rate of \$6.00 per hour until such time as a permanent replacement can be employed. Ayes--all. It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to authorize the County Sheriff to employ a new Deputy with the starting salary to be between \$7.50 and \$8.82 depending upon experience, with the maximum salary for the Deputy to be \$19,708.00 per year (approximately 78% of the Sheriff's salary). Ayes--all.

Charles Joss, Sioux Rapids, spoke to the Board as a concerned taxpayer, not as a member of the Sioux Rapids City council. He is concerned about police protection for the City of Sioux Rapids and for the rest of the county. He feels that those cities with contract deputies are not paying the entire cost, for their police protection, therefore, the rest of the county is subsidizing their program. These are his personal views and not necessarily those of the council. The Board will take this under advisement.

Jan Hartwig, Public Health Department secretary, presented the minutes from their August meeting which called for a 30 cents per hour increase in salary for Pat Patten, part-time nurse. Whereupon it was moved by Radke, seconded by Burnside to approve the Board of Health minutes for their August, 1986 meeting. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke, to approve the following reports: August County Board of Health, NWIPDC, ADTU; July county conservation; 4th quarter 1985-86 Child Support Recovery. Ayes--all.

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the opening of bids for work to be done on Laterals 3 and 5 of Drainage District #34. Six persons were present for the letting. Four bids were received. After opening and discussing the bids it was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to accept the low bid of Boggess Construction Co., Emmetsburg, Iowa for Division 1, lateral 3 in the amount of \$25,718.80 and authorize the Chairman to sign the contract. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to accept the low bid of Estherville Sand & Gravel Co., Estherville, Iowa for Division 2, lateral 5 in the amount of \$14,777.50 and authorize the Chairman to sign the contract. Ayes—all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to retain the checks from the 3 low bidders until the contracts are signed and then to retain the check of the low bidder until the contract is completed. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside that the public letting for the clean-out of D.D. #3 be held at 1:30 P.M., Tuesday, September 30, 1986 in the Board of Supervisors Room of the Courthouse. Aves--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to approve a Class "C" Beer permit and Sunday Sales permit for Lake Oil Co., Route 3, Storm Lake, Iowa. Ayes--all.

Rich Michaelis and Tom DeWitt, from Iowa Department of Transportation, approached the Board regarding the cut-off road for Highway #71 going straight north from "Connell's corner" and if the Board would accept the present Highway #71 in exchange for the cut-off road. The Board would not commit themselves feeling that this is a decision for the D.O.T. to make. The IDOT proposes only a two lan facility for the cut-off road. This will be presented to the State Highway Commission at their October meeting.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson approving the application from Murray Farm, Ltd., for underground constructon of a 6" tile line in the west road ditch east of section 8-90-36 from 713' north of the railroad to 1,440' north of the railroad. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside, to approve the Contractor's Bond for Boggess Construction Company, Emmetsburg, Iowa, in the amount of \$25,718.80 for D. D. #34, lateral 3. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail, to approve the Contractor's Bond for Estherville Sand & Gravel in the amount of \$14,777.50 for D.D. #34, lateral 5. Ayes--all.

Resolution

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail, that the Chairman be authorized to sign the following agreement dated the 16th day of September, 1986, by and between the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority, 2311 West 18th Street, Spencer, Iowa and Buena Vista County, Iowa:

WHEREAS, there now exists a joint exercise of powers agreement known as the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority which is made up of numerous counties and cities in Northwest Iowa, and WHEREAS Buena Vista County hereby agrees to participate in the multi-county housing authority known as the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority and under its direction herein-before established pursuant to Chapter 28E of the 1980 Code of Iowa as amended. FORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions as set forth in 28E Agreement of Joint exercises and powers for multi-county housing which was signed on the 21st day of March, 1979, and which is made a part hereof by reference and which is on file in those counties participating in said Agreement and with the Secretary of State's office of Des Moines, Iowa, Buena Vista County hereby agrees to join with the other cities and counties in the 28E Agreement, heretofore referred to and further agrees to join with the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority and its members for purposes of participating in and abiding by the terms and conditions of said 28E Agreement as on file and incorporated in this Agreement by reference. The purpose of this Agreement for Buena Vista County is to join the unified action of local governments in the Region III Area to develop solutions to the multi-county housing, low income housing problem as set forth in their existing 28E Agreement which has already been established and which this county was not a part of at the time of formation of said agreement to participate. The original 28E Agreement dated the 21st day of March, 1979, provided for its amendment from time to time by mutual consent of all the parties and the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority being the organization formed as a result of the 28E Agreement does hereby consent through its signature hereto to permit Buena Vista County to join said Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority and said county by its signature hereto agreed to abide by all the terms and conditions of said Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority as established by their 28E Agreement on the 21st day of March, 1979. This resolution carried unanimously.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail, to appoint Ray Kurtz as the representative on the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority Board for Buena Vista County. Ayes--all. Howard Hogan, representing ISAC, presented an ISAC sponsored Wellness program. He stated that health care costs continue to rise about 15-18% per year. The Staywell program is designed to help a healthy person stay healthy and therefore reduce health care costs and absenteeism. It is a 3 phase program. The first phase is EAR - to help employees with a wide variety of programs, both personal and work related that may interfere with productivity, through counseling and is available 24 hours per day through use of a WATS line. The second phase is a health news magazine. The third phase is a health risk profile, working with the County Nurse to provide a family health history to be analyzed, using a blood sample. The cost is \$38.25 per employee with ISAC contributing \$50.00 per subscriber providing 50% of the subscribers participation in the program. The \$38.25 is paid to Control Data for use of the program. The other money is spent locally as seen fit for health purposes. It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Gustafson, to participate in the ISAC "Health Now" program for a one year period. Ayes--all.

The question of what to charge the State for the use of the computer by the Clerk of Court for Fiscal year 1987-88 was raised. The Board will investigate what other counties are charging the state before setting a fee.

Frank Lorch, IDS representative asked about establishing a "457" Government Deferred Compensation plan. The Board decided not to sponsor such a program at this time.

Jim Eaton and Chuck Kronaizl, representing Olson-Eaton-Svendsen Insurance inquired about insurance coverage for the county. They would like a chance to bid if there is to be a bid. The Board will discuss this further before deciding on what course to follow.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in regular session, pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside.

Minutes of the September 12, 16, 23 meetings were read, corrected and approved.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to approve the application for Military Tax Credit for Monica Golden on Lot 12, Block 76 Storm Lake Corporation for taxes due in fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

Henry Hardt, an assistant County Attorney, consulted the Board concerning the mental health accounts that were being processed. Six of the persons have moved out of the state and the amount due is so small that they are not worth pursuing. Forty-one accounts have been filed with the Clerk of Court. These persons now have 20 days in which to make an appearance and answer at small claims court. If they do not appear or file an answer the county will then get a default judgement against these persons. These judgements can then be used at any time in the future when such person may acquire any financial means. The Board of Supervisors can dismiss the action within the 20 day period if they determine that such action is warranted. After the 20 day period the Court takes jurisdiction of the case. The Board instructed Mr. Hardt to listen to all persons desiring to be heard to determine if further compassion would be in order.

Steve Stille, representing Stille, Pierce and Pertzborn Insurance Company, stated that their company would like consideration if the county is going to obtain bids for county insurance coverage. After much discussion and consideration there was a consensus of the Board that due to the instability of the insurance market, Buena Vista County will continue with I.S.A.C. coverage until the insurance industry stabilizes.

Darlene Peterson, County Nurse, reported that the audit completed by the Iowa Department of Public Health, Public Nursing Section, disclosed two discrepencies, that have now been corrected. This covers the work done by the department for fiscal year 1985-86.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to approve the September report for ADTU and the Recipient Account Statement on Federal Revening Sharing. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Burnside, seconded by Vail authorizing the Chairman to sign the "Health Now" agreement with the Iowa State Association of Counties for fiscal year 1986-87. Ayes--all.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to pay for hearing aids for two children from the same family (T.P.-9-30-86) using Buckingham estate Trust Funds. Ayes—all.

Mike and Sue Morrow presented an agreement for the leasing of the Care Facility as a private Non-profit corporation, with the new facility to be known as Spectra Health Care, Inc. A petition for the reclassification of D.D. #181 Little Cedar Branch was discussed to see if it is economically feasible, also the petition for improvements on D.D. #73 and the costs involved in annexation. This will receive further consideration.

County Nurse, Darlene Peterson, reported on the ISAC "Stay Well" program. Their department will be supervising the program.

Don Strauch, representing Lutheran Social Services, related the history of his organization. They are a state certified Mental Health organization. They want to open an office in the Courthouse if funding can be obtained, which they do not and will not know until the next meeting of the Storm Lake Community Chest Board. After further discussion, it was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Vail to authorize a 6 month trial starting January 1, 1987 contingent on the transfer of funds from the Storm Lake Community Chest. Ayes--all.

Harlan Johnson discussed a stop sign which had been damaged. Things were resolved satisfactorily.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Vail to approve the following reports: October NWIPDC, County Conservation, 1st Quarter Youth Shelter Care, Farm-to-market; September site visit by HM/HHA. Ayes--all

1:30 P.M. -- The time having arrived for the opening of quotes for a new pick-up truck. 2 persons were present for the hearing. 3 quotes were received. After opening the quotes and finding all in order, it was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to accept the bid of Fitzpatrick Motors for a 1987 Chevrolet Pick-up truck for a net delivered price of \$9,250.00 plus the option for a front towing hook for \$35.00. Ayes--a11.

Pat Rooney, representing Teleconnect, informed the Board that they had trouble inter-facing with the Centrex system and that was the reason for the delay in offering their services to the county. They are now ready to offer the service to the county on a 60 day free trial basis. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside authorizing the Chairman to sign for a 60 day free trial of Teleconnect services with a one time charge of \$221.49 for installation charges which will be refunded if the services are not satisfactory. Ayes—all.

Mike Berry from Berry Motors, Danbury, Iowa discussed tandem trucks with the Board. This is a Ford dealership for tandem trucks. After discussion it was moved by Vail, seconded by Radke to purchase two 1987 tandem Ford Trucks from Berry Motors, Danbury, Iowa at a net delivered cost of \$83,000.00 for the two trucks with no trade-in. Ayes--all.

Ron and Craig Neulieb, representing Control Systems, presented a system for energy management with the cost of the system being \$36,995.00. After much discussion it was agreed to have them develop a system in steps and submit it for approval at a later date.

The Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County met in regular session, pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. with Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Radke, Vail, Gustafson, Burnside. Also present was newly elected Supervisor Rehnstrom.

Minutes of the November 10, 11, and 18, 1986 meetings were read, corrected and approved.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson to purchase the following Henke truck snow plow equipment from Swaney Equipment Company, Fort Dodge, Iowa: 2 MDW-9 truck wings with Senotex coating; 2 HDV9.3 V-plows; 2 Indiana Expressway plows 12' with Senotex coating and enclosed spring trips for a total cost of \$29,664.00 F.O.B. Waverly, Iowa mounted on our trucks. Ayes--all.

Ray Kurtz, County Sanitarian, discussed the inspection of Buena Vista County restaurants and food vending machines. They would be licensed by the state but the county would do the inspections for a fee. This would be under the supervision of the county Board of Health and would mean a little additional revenue for the county. Whereupon it was moved by Vail, seconded by Burnside to authorize the county to contract with the State Department of Health for inspection of the county restaurants by the county Sanitarian or his designee. Ayes--all.

Bob Cayler, representing Iowa State Prison Industries, discussed the products made by the prisoners that are for sale to public institutions. This program is not tax supported but is supported by the revenue received from sales. It does give training and rehabilitation possibilities to the prisoners. There are four programs, Mitchelville has screen printing; Fort Madison has furniture and upholstering, Anamosa had traffic signs and license plates and custom woodworking, Mount Pleasant has prison uniforms and clothing. The county has purchased some furniture and signs in the past. The Board thanked Mr. Cayler for the presentation.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Burnside to appoint Mrs. Ruth Tucker as the Buena Vista County representative on the Cherokee Mental Health Advisory Committee as the replacement for Mrs. Carol Burr who resigned. Ayes--all.

An Order was received from Judge McDonald appointing Mrs. Ruth Tucker as Advocate for Buena Vista County on mental health cases. Ayes—all.

Tania Gutz, representing the Human Services Department, reported on the "Adopt a Family" program that the Human Services department is sponsoring this year. The response to this has been outstanding. Thirty-nine families, 90 children under the age of 18, and 23 Senior citizens have been the recipients of the program to date.

It was moved by Radke, seconded by Gustafson that the public hearing on the acceptance of the Estherville Sand & Gravel contract for lateral #5, of Drainage District #34 be held at 1:30 P.M. on December 23, 1986 in the Public Meeting room of the Buena Vista County Courthouse. Ayes--all.

A final accounting report on the auction sale of the former Farm Fuel Products property in Storm Lake, Iowa was received from Hawkeye Bank & Trust, Spencer, Iowa. After discussing at length it was moved by Vail, seconded by Gustafson to accept \$41,350.09 for the sale of parcels #6229.00, 6229.10, 6966.00, 6966.50 shown in the name of Farm Fuel Products Company, as full and complete settlement of all delinquent and current taxes due on said property. The above resolution passed unanimously.

It was moved by Gustafson, seconded by Radke to accept the Engineer's report on D.D. #34 tree cutting contract as satisfactorily completed and to authorize payment. Ayes--all.

Communication Center employees Denise Kleen, Myron Nourse and meeting with the County Sheriff and Board of Supervisors but the Sheriff sent word that he would be unable to attend the meeting. Miss Kleen had a prepared statement not be satisfied until he has control of the Communications Cneter is time to put their differences aside and work together.
