BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIRST MEETING, 1988 SESSION (1) JANUARY 4, 1988

Chemicals for Brush Control in Drainage Districts

The salary is to continue at the current rate (Chapter 309.17). Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, that Darel D. Burns be reappointed Drainage Engineer and Assistant County Engineer for 1988 with his salary to continue at the current rate (Chapter 309.17). Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to appoint Warren Gregg to be the Professional Appraiser to be used in determining right-of-way value in accordance with Department of Transportation Instructional Memorandum #1.M.-3.31. Ayes--all.

Holiday, Vacation, and Sick Leave Policy

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, that the Buena Vista County Personnel Policy with the effective date of December 1, 1986, as amended December 30, 1986 and September 29, 1987, along with the various Departmental Rules and Job Descriptions currently in effect, be declared the governing policy for all Buena Vista County employees under the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors for Buena Vista County, and that the Medical History, Physical Examination, and County Work Release forms be used in conjunction with the Personnel policy. This motion carried unanimously.

Acquisition of Right-of-Way Policy

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, that in order to comply with the provisions of the 1970 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Land Acquisition Policies Act, the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County furnishes the following assurances to the Iowa Department of Transportation: 1. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to acquire right-of-way in accordance with Title III of said 1970 Act and applicable state laws. 2. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to provide relocation assistance benefits in accord with Title II of said 1970 Act and applicable state laws. The above named county will contact the Iowa Department of Transportation for assistance as needed to assure compliance with applicable laws which are summarized in the instructions entitled "Right-of-Way Acquisition" which is Instructional Memorandum 3.31. Ayes--all.

Fence Repair & Replacement Policy

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, that, Buena Vista County agrees to pay actual labor costs to remove any existing fence, and if requested, to blade dirt away before removal, that, if fence is rebuilt within 18 months of completion of road grading, the county will pay the actual cost of fence material that cannot be re-used and the labor to rebuild, that, the County will not participate in material costs or added labor costs to replace a barb wire fence within a woven wire fence, and, that maximum labor payments are: \$6.50/rod to remove woven wire and \$6.50/rod to replace woven wire fencing, and \$4.50/rod to remove barb-wire and \$4.50/rod to replace barb-wire fencing. Ayes--all.

Authority to Close Roads & Detour Traffic

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to authorize County Engineer Donald D. Linnan and Assistant County Engineer Darel Burns to close any and all county roads, on which construction is proposed, in order to facilitate construction, and for the duration of the construction, and to close any county road for necessary maintenance repair, and to mark all detours as necessary, without requiring any further authorization, and furthermore, to be authorized to issue and sign special permits for the movement of vehicles of excessive size and weight upon Buena Vista County Secondary roads in accordance with Chapter 321E Code of Iowa. Ayes--all.

Authority to Issue Warrants

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, that the following resolution be adopted: BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Auditor be, and is hereby authorized, to issue county warrants in payment of salaries for all county employees in the office of the County Auditor, Treasurer, Recorder, Sheriff, salaries of all employed personnel in the County Engineer's office and shop, all utility bills, express and freight charges emergency welfare claims, state tax on fuel, claims that allow a discount if paid by a certain date, and cash allowances when necessary without special authorization of the Board of Supervisors. This resolution carried unanimously.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve hiring Shirley Stucynski for a part-time position in the Recorder's office at \$4.50 per hour retroactive to 12-14-87. Ayes--all.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, January 5, 1988 at 9:00 A. M. for a regular session.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SECOND MEETING, 1988 SESSION (2) JANUARY 5, 1988

The Buena Vista county Board of Supervisors met in regular session pursuant to adjournment on January 5, 1988 at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Bob Rehnstrom, Jim Gustafson, Richard Vail, and Don Harjes, and with Auditor Karen Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed water test wells and the required schooling for chemical applicator licensing. Sponsoring of a school in cooperation with neighboring counties was considered. Linnan was authorized to investigate a gravel source.

Human Services Director Anita Hallquist requested permission to destroy some old records. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to authorize the Human Services Director to expunge the following records: University of Iowa Hospital and General Relief records older than five years. Ayes--all. Hallquist announced that the theme of the Iowa Department of Human Services for the first part of 1988 has been declared "Take Pride in Iowa Families".

Hallquist presented a request for assistance with a dental bill. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve payment of \$1,000.00 of a \$1,925.00 dental bill for one person (J.A.1-5-88) from the Buckingham Trust Fund. Ayes--all.

Hallquist reported that work activity block grant funds are exhausted and, that for the remainder of the year, these services will be paid 100% from county funds. She suggested establishing minimum qualifications for persons receiving these services and, with Board approval, that the project of writing the guidelines and determining eligibility for the services be given to the MH/MR/DD Advisory Board. The Supervisors approved the project.

Jean Eckerman, Deputy Auditor, reported the results of committee discussion on the date processing budget. Several board members will meet with the committee for further discussion.

Director Larry Rohret and Darlene Wise, UDMO, met with the Board to present their report on the 1987 activity of that agency and the budget needs for 1988. No requests were presented at this time.

Assessor Ted Van Grootheest reviewed tax exemptions for wetlands with the Board. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, that it is hereby resolved not to grant tax exemptions pursuant to Chapter 427.1.36 of the 1987 Code of Iowa involving Wetlands in Buena Vista County. Ayes--all.

Following discussion of his proposal, the Assessor was authorized by consensus of the Board to make arrangements for expanding his office into the 1st Floor PMR East.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following reports: November Tourism, December ADTU. Ayes--all.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns gave his Engineer's Report on the investigation of D.D. #8. After discussion, Burns recommended that the 2 landowners affected, the County Engineer, and the Drainage Engineer meet to review the Engineer's report and that no action be taken by the Board on the report at this time. The Board agreed.

Dr. T. E. Shea and Verne Campbell, representing the Isaac Walton League, discussed roadside habitat with the Board. The Board suggested that future programs should be developed in conjunction with the Conservation Board before being brought to the Supervisors since that is the function of the Conservation Board. Shea and Campbell agreed to do so. They also discussed that the Isaac Walton League is planning a speaker on the roadside habitat program for sometime in March and requested some dates which would be free for 2 or more Supervisors to attend. March 16th is the tentative date.

Recorder Ferne Frederiksen explained a new law to the Board which provides that the revenue from boat titling is to be deposited into the General Basic fund for the use by the County Conservation Board, if one exists.

Human Services Director Anita Hallquist introduced Mrs. Myron Sievers, Albert City, and Sievers' daughter and grandsons to the Board. Mrs. Sievers is the winner of the Buena Vista County entries in the Iowa Department of Human Services photography contest of the "Take Pride in Iowa Families" program. Mrs. Sievers entered a photo she had taken of her husband and grandson.

Hallquist requested approval to purchase a portable vacuum for use by the Homemaker Home Health Department. The Board agreed by consensus. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPROVAL OF A JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT AND DECLARATION OF TRUST FOR THE IOWA PUBLIC AGENCY INVESTMENT TRUST AND AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION THEREIN.

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 28E.1 (1987 as amended) permits political subdivisions to make efficient use of their powers by enabling them to provide joint services with other Public Agencies and to cooperate in other ways of mutual advantage, and to exercise and enjoy jointly any powers, privileges or authority exercised or capable of being exercised by one Public Agency of this state or private agencies for the joint or cooperative action; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Sections 331.555 and 384.21 (1987 as amended) empowers Cities, City Utilities and Counties to invest their moneys pursuant to a joint investment agreement, and

WHEREAS, the County of Buena Vista is a political subdivision being duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws and constitution of the State of Iowa, and

WHEREAS, the County of Buena Vista has approved the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust and thereby has established the Iowa Public Agency Investment Trust as of October 1, 1987 and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body desires to adopt and enter into the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust, and it is in the best interest of this Governing Body to participate in the Iowa Public Agency Investment Trust for the purpose of joint investment of moneys and other cities, city utilities and counties to enhance investment earnings occuring to each

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved:

Section 1. The Joint Powers Agreement and Delcaration of Trust is approved and adopted. This Public Agency shall join with the other public agencies in accordance with the Joint Powers Act by becoming a Participant of the Turst. The Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust shall be filed in the minutes of the meeting at which this resolution is adopted. The authorized officials of this Public Agency are directed and authorized to take such actions and execute any and all such documents as may be deemed necessary and appropriate to effect the entry of the Public Agency into the Declaration of Trust and adoption thereof by this Public Agency and to carry out the intent and purposes of this resolution.

Section 2. This Public Agency is hereby authorized to invest its available moneys from time to time and to withdraw such moneys from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust. The following officers and officials of this Public Agency and their respective successors in office each hereby are designated as "Authorized Officials" with full power and authority to effectuate the investment and withdrawal of moneys with this Public Agency from time to time in accordance with the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust.

The Turst shall be advised of any changes in authorized officials in accordance with procedures established by the Trust.

Section 3. The Trustees of the Trust are hereby designated as having official custody of this Public Agency's moneys which are invested in accordance with the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust.

Section 4. Authorization is hereby given for officials of this Public Agency to serve as Trustees of the Trust from time to time if selected as such pursuant to the provisions of the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust.

Section 5. Unless otherwise expressly defined herein, words that are capitalized in the resolution

Engineer Don Linnan presented a Resolution Request for Changes in the Federal Functional Classification and in the Federal Aid Secondary System of Buena Vista County, Iowa for consideration. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail,

that WHEREAS: the County of Buena Vista, in reviewing its current road network, finds the present Federal Functional Classification is in need of updating to better reflect the proper functional usage of particular roads and the Federal Aid Secondary System needs to be revised to correct a previous error in proper route description, and

WHEREAS; The City of Storm Lake recently made changes in its urban area boundaries which, in turn, have a reciprocal effect on the Federal Functional Classification of roads/streets which enter/exit

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SIXTEENTH MEETING, 1988 SESSION (16) MARCH 28, 1988

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session for a public hearing on the FY 1988-89 budget on March 28, 1988 in the 2nd Floor Public Meeting Room with Chairman Lorna Burnside presiding, and with the following other members present: Jim Gustafson, Don Harjes, Richard Vail, and Bob Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Karen Strawn as clerk for the hearing.

Chairman Burnside opened the public hearing at 10:30 A. M. Nine department heads or staff and 21 interested persons were present. There was a quorum of Supervisors present as required by law. The affidavit of publication of Notice of Budget Hearing, which was published March 16, 1988, was available as required by law.

Auditor Strawn informed those present that the rural levy shown on the budget summary was a subtotal and should be added to the urban levy to arrive at the total rural levy, and, that Revenue Sharing funds to be used in Service Area 4 should be shown in the Revenue Sharing Fund column.

Supervisor Harjes suggested a review of the 'Budgeted Expenses Compared'.

Paul Marshall asked whether the ending balance for FY 1989 would exceed that which was estimated for that budget by a percent similar to several previous years, and, if so, could a tax levy be eliminated. It was noted that future revenues are not guaranteed so that an estimation for a time period of up to 18 months into the future could be very different than the actual revenue. Interest, as an example, fluctuates dramatically.

Larry Zubradt stated that in general he supported the budget but he also felt the carryover balances should not be kept at such a high level. He felt that those excess dollars should be in the hands of the taxpayers earning interest for them, rather than existing as excess for the county to earn interest.

Marshall suggested that the budget be lowered and that if needs exceed resources, then implement an emergency levy. Auditor Strawn informed him that, according to the Iowa Code, a county can no longer use an emergency levy. He asked if department heads were required to make requests to increase their budgets in signed, written form. Many department heads do make requests in writing, although this procedure is not required.

Other questions about raises and number of new employees were asked and answered. Engineer Don Linnan answered a number of questions about the Secondary Road budget, what projects were planned for FY '89. He noted that the gravel contracts were not in the '88 budget and are in the '89 budget.

Margaret Koch asked if the Drainage Engineer was being paid by both county taxpayers and the drainage districts. Linnan explained that the Drainage Engineer's wage was paid out of Secondary Roads fund initially Then the drainage districts are billed by the Secondary Road fund for his time according to the proportion of his work done on the several districts and that repayment goes into the county's funds, not to the engineer.

Marshall asked who to complain to about the law which directs that the Compensation Board be appointed by the officials whose salaries are set by that Board. He was directed to speak to his representatives in the legislature.

The Chairman asked for any additional comments or questions. Sheriff Duane Heeney distributed copies of his budget and briefly reviewed the changes.

Supervisor Vail thanked the taxpayers for showing their interest and concern by attending the public hearing. Chairman Burnside echoed that appreciation and stated that if there were no further comments, the hearing was adjourned. The Supervisors will take action on the budget on Monday, April 4, 1988 at 9:00 A.M. during a special session.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session pursuant to adjournment on March 29, 1988 at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Bob Rehnstrom, Don Harjes, and Richard Vail, and with Auditor Karen Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the March 15 & 22nd meetings were read and corrected.

Custodian Rollie Sievers discussed part-time help requirements for his department for upcoming months, a safety rope to be used when cleaning windows, etc. and purchase of a high speed buffer. The Board directed him to check into each of these matters.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns presented his report on additional investigation of D.D. #8. He recommended terminating the investigation due to the unfeasible cost. Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to stop any further investigation into improvements on D.D. #8, to file present plans and survey data in drainage and road records and to assess the Secondary Road Department the costs incurred to date. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to appoint Bob Driver, Linn Grove, to the County Zoning Commission representing Barnes and Brooke Townships. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan reported that testing had been done on a parcel of land. Another person will be needed to run the scale this summer.

The Board approved the purchase of equipment - a Bush Hog Offset Shredder for \$1,800 plus 2 trade-ins from Hultgrens-Gerlach, Storm Lake.

The Board approved patching and sealing additional bridge decks. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to enter into a contract with the Dallas Company of Adel, Iowa, for bridge deck sealing and patching. Ayes-all

The engineer discussed traffic control at the Storm Lake Airport on Labor Day Weekend when Balloon Days are scheduled. The Board of Supervisors were agreeable to working with the Balloon Days committee to provide better traffic control for improved safety during that event.

The Engineer presented the results of a speed study and a speed recommendation from the Iowa DOT for the Lake Creek Country Club area. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to establish the following speed limits on the paved road east of Section 25-91-38 from the junction with Highway #7 North one thousand three hundred fifty-nine (1,359) feet - 35 miles per hour, and, from a point one thousand three hundred fifty-nine (1,359) feet to a point two thousand fifty-nine (2,059) feet north of Iowa Highway #7 - 45 miles per hour. Ayes--all.

Human Services Secretary Charlene Lickiss presented a request for approval of payment for care of one person (J.A.3-29-88) to be placed at Joyful House in Sioux City at \$300 per month. The Board approved.

The Board confirmed that cash allowance previously approved for one person (C.A.3-29-88) was approved at 60.00 per month.

Nurse Darlene Peterson reviewed the March Board of Health minutes.

Following discussion of the damage caused by encroachment-tillage on public road right-of-way, the Board directed the Auditor to have published, once in each official county newspaper, a public notice banning tillage in road right-of-way without approval. The auditor was also directed to have published a "Notice to Destroy Noxious Weeds" one time in each of the official county newspapers.

Neal Kuehl, Kuehl & Payer, met with the Board to discuss the water line project for the care facility site. A proposal for the project was submitted to the Dept. of Economic Development but the grant was not awarded to the County. Kuehl reviewed plans necessary to proceed and the services his firm is able to provide Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to enter into an agreement with Kuehl & Payer for engineering services for construction of a water line to the care facility site upon completion of an agreement between Buena Vista County and the City of Storm Lake. Ayes—all.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING EIGHTEENTH MEETING, 1988 SESSION (18) APRIL 4, 1988

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on April 4 , 1988 at 9:00 A. M. in the Board Room with Chairman Lorna Burnside presiding, and with the following other members present: Jim Gustafson, Don Harjes, Richard Vail, and Bob Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Karen Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Present for the meeting was one interested taxpayer and a representative from the media. The chairman asked for comments on the budget hearing held Monday, March 28. Supervisor Harjes asked Engineer Don Linnan to review the 75% rule which controls the number of road use dollars received by the county. Linnan stated that the county must set the tax asking for secondary roads at 75% of the maximum allowed by the Code (or greater) in order to receive the maximum number of dollars from the road use tax fund. Otherwise, the road use dollars are reduced to the county. It was noted that the carryover balances of last year and estimated for the current year are higher due to having snow seasons not requiring large expenditures but which still needed to be included in those budgets. Also, some projects originally scheduled for the FY'88-89 budget were not done which also increased the ending balance. Supervisor Gustafson stated that he felt some reductions might be possible in Service Areas 1, 4, &.7.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to lower expenditures in Service Area 1 \$25,000, and in Service Area 7 \$100,000. After discussion Auditor Strawn polled the Board with the following results: Rehnstrom-nay, Harjes-aye, Burnside-nay, Vail-nay, Gustafson-nay. Ayes--1, nays--4. Motion defeated.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to lower the ending balance \$250,000. The Board was polled: Gustafson-nay, Vail-nay, Burnside-nay, Harjes-aye, Rehnstrom-aye. Ayes--2, nays--3. Motion defeated.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to lower the ending balance by \$150,000. The Board was polled: Vail-aye, Gustafson-aye, Rehnstrom-aye, Harjes-aye, Burnside-aye. Ayes--5, nays--none. Motion carried.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to accomplish the amendment to the proposed budget, in the following manner: reduce the tax asking for the General Basic Fund \$50,000, reduce the transfer from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund \$50,000, reduce the ending balance of the General Supplemental Fund by \$50,000, reduce the tax asking in the Rural Basic Fund \$100,000, reduce the transfer from the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund \$100,000, and reduce the ending balance of the Secondary Road Fund \$100,000. Ayes—all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, that the Fiscal Year 1988-89 budget be adopted as amended which reduces the tax asking by 5.95% from the FY '87-88 budget year. The results of polling the Board were: Harjes-aye, Burnside-aye, Gustafson-aye, Vail-aye, Rehnstrom-aye. Ayes--5, nays-0. Motion carried.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to direct the Auditor to publish a notice of the availability of the summary of the FY '88-89 budget and the intended uses of federal revenue sharing funds in the Auditor's office for public inspection. Ayes--all.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reviewed HF 2308 regarding drainage districts and suggested drafting a letter to area legislators reflecting the attitude of the Board on this bill. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to send a letter of opposition to HF 2308 to area legislators. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan completed the review of the 1989 Secondary Road budget and construction program including projects in the FY 1990-1993 four year plan. Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to adopt the FY 1989 Secondary Road Budget and Construction Program as presented and to authorize the Chairman to sign the appropriate documents. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to authorize the Chairman to sign Improvement Certificates #'s 6-1988, 7-1988, and 8-1988, all for D.D. #181 Joint-Little Cedar Branch. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the liquor license application for the 3 & 71 Truckstop. Ayes--all.

The business of this special session being completed, the meeting was adjourned at 11:50 A. M. until Tuesday, April 12, at 9:00 A. M. for a regular session.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING NINETEENTH MEETING, 1988 SESSION (19) APRIL 12, 1988

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session pursuant to adjournment on April 12, 1988 at 9:00 A. M. with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Bob Rehnstrom, Don Harjes, and Richard Vail, and with Auditor Karen Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

The minutes of the March 22, 29, and April 4 meetings were read and approved.

Custodian Rollie Sievers reported that UDMO had a person available for part-time help under the unemployed parent program. The Board approved the placement. Sievers also reported that the exterior of the Courthouse is to be inspected this week.

Deputy Assessor Kim Carnine presented two (2) late filings (homesteads and military) for approval. Motion by Harjes, seconded by Vail, to approve the late filings on parcel #'s 5708.00 and 4381.00. Ayes--all.

Carnine informed the Board of a **homestead** credit application which had been **disallowed** by the Assessor for the reason that the signers had never moved in and were therefore ineligible for the credit. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail to disallow the homestead credit application on parcel #774.00 in Alta, the applicant being not eligible due to not living in the home, and to direct the Auditor to send written notice by mail of the action and reason. Ayes—all.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns gave his final report on the completion by Kooiker Inc., of the contract for cleanout of Lateral 8 Branch of D.D.#34. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes to tentatively approve the engineer's final report on D.D. 34, Lateral 8, to set May 10, 1988 at 1:00 P. M. in the Board Room as the date, time and location of the public hearing on the report, and to direct the Auditor to have published and notify the landowners of the Public Hearing. Ayes--all.

Burns reported that there had been no progress on the dirt moving in **D.D.#83**, that the completion date is April 15th, and that he had sent a letter to Puhrmann Tiling and Excavating of Havelock advising Puhrmann of his report to the Board. The Board will wait for response from Puhrmann before taking any action.

Engineer Don Linnan presented a number of items. Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the **Contractor's Bonds**, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Bonds for J & W Readymix Construction, for Division I of the gravel letting (for \$96,892) and Gary Reese Trucking for Division II (for \$45,210). Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve an application for underground construction from Iowa Lakes Electric to bury a cable across the road on the south side of 20-91-36, 485' east of the SW corner. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to lower the established **speed limit** from 35 M.P.H. to 25 M.P.H. and to set the advisory sign on the curve at 25 M.P.H., all on Bel Air Beach Road, effective upon the completion of signing. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve proceeding with a 24' instead of a 28' pipe on a **driveway approach** on the south side of Section 3, Washington Township, this being a special exception approved because of its non-agricultural use. Ayes--all.

Human Services Director Anita Hallquist notified the Board of the sale of a property on which the Board had previously approved the suspension of taxes. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to remove the suspension of taxes on parcel #731.00 in Alta. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign, a contract between the Department of Human Services and Buena Vista County in which the county agrees to provide 25% donated funds to match the state and federal 75% contribution for services. Ayes--all.

Supervisor Rehnstrom informed the Board of requests he had received concerning minimum maintenance on Level B roads. The Board and Engineer Linnan discussed the effects of changing procedures previously adopted. Roads discussed are located 1 mile north of the fair grounds and 1/2 mile west. No action was taken at this time.

The following reports were reviewed: March budget reports, Tourism, ADTU and Annual IPERS, 1987 Report of Engineers and Land Surveyors Examining Board.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve the following reports: March Small Claims & District Court Surcharges, 3rd Qtr. '88 District Court Surcharges, Veteran's, Mangold Environmental Testing report for March and 3rd Qtr. Sheriff fees.

Murse Darlene Peterson informed the Board that staffing reports had been completed and that job descriptions were being updated reflecting recent changes.

Joan Sliefert, Mental Health Clerk in the Auditor's office, reviewed current mental health accounts and discussed scheduling of appointments with the persons responsible for payment of the bills. She and Supervisor Gustafson will meet with those persons to discuss repayment of these costs.

Ron Wilson, Disaster Services Coordinator, presented the Disaster Plan for the county. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve the "Buena Vista County-wide Multi Hazard Emergency Operation Plan". Ayes--all.

Supervisor Gustafson asked Wilson, as Chairman of the Communications Commission about hiring a supervisor not from the local area and bypassing current staff. Wilson responded that the job description called for supervisory experience and that the new supervisor was hired due to his experience. Supervisors Harjes and Gustafson both asked about whether the supervisor would be working a shift. Wilson responded that the supervisor will be filling in while employees are on vacation or sick leave and when using accumulated compensatory time. Gustafson restated his concern that hiring from outside the county prevented current county employees from moving up.

Engineer Linnan discussed with the Board changes to the **Zoning Ordinance** as discussed at the Public Hearing in February. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson to change the zoning map as follows: to change from R-2 to A-2 all of the unincorporated area East of Iowa Highway #110 in Sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 8 and 9 of Hayes Township that lies South of the East-West paved road from Iowa Highway #110 to Casino Beach Subdivision except the existing platted subdivision lying therein and Government Lot ${f l}$ in Section ${f 16}$ Hayes Township. Ayes--a11.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING TWENTIETH MEETING, 1988 SESSION (20) APRIL 26, 1988

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session April 26, 1988 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following members present: Jim Gustafson, Richard Vail, Bob Rehnstrom and Don Harjes, and with Karen Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

The minutes of the April 12, 1988 meeting were read and approved as corrected.

Custodian Rollin Sievers discussed personnel and purchases for his department. He also reported on the results of the inspection of the Courthouse by L & M Construction Chemicals, Inc. of Omaha, Nebraska. He was authorized to request that a test of the recommended treatment be done by L & M. The Board approved purchase of a high speed buffer by the Custodian.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns discussed removal of soil and bank material in **D.D. #3 Open Ditch.** He suggested sending a letter to the landowners involved with the proposals he outlined. The Board directed him to send the letters.

Burns presented a quote sheet and general specifications he had developed for handling rip rap in drainage districts. These forms will be circulated among interested contractors to secure quotes

Engineer Don Linnan discussed the dirt that was being aerated at the county farm. The County Farm Committee will visit the site.

The results of the testing of gravel samples have been received. The Board agreed to take no action at this time. Another possible site was also discussed. No action was taken.

Linnan reported activity regarding a property on the south side of Storm Lake. The Zoning Commission will meet May 9th on this property.

Linnan reported a site distance problem. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to authorize the placement of a **stop sign** to stop the eastbound traffic at the intersection at the northeast corner of Section 28-91-35 Coon Township, Buena Vista County, Iowa. Ayes--all.

The Newell secondary road shop and Truesdale storage shed have roofs that have deteriorated due to roof design. Linnan will investigate the cost for repairs.

The Board approved the purchase of an "engineering copier" for the Engineer's department.

Linnan reported that the insurance Committee discussed the need for an appraisal of the Courthouse and Care Facility buildings and contents. Rehnstrom and Harjes will investigate available appraisers.

Human Services Director Anita Hallquist requested approval to place one person (I.H. 4-26-88) at Dickinson County Care Facility. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve the placement of 1 person (I.H. 4-26-88) at Dickinson CCF and to authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement. Ayes--all.

Hallquist reported the settlement of a dispute between Buena Vista and Clay Counties regarding legal settlement of one person. The costs for care in question will be split 50/50 between the 2 counties.

Nurse Karole Graen reviewed the April Board of Health minutes.

Treasurer Sally Grunig informed the Board of the level of delinquent taxes compared to last year and noted that the publishing costs would be substantially higher than last year if published today.

Motion by Harjes, second by Vail to **employ** Louis Lill, Albert McKenna and O.G. Anderson as part-time scale personnel at an hourly rate of \$4.50 per hour. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the Class C beer permit and cigarette permit applications for Pronto Market (former location of the Country Store) and to authorize the Chairman Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to sign the applications. Ayes--all.

Auditor's Clerk Joan Sliefert discussed problems with several M.H. accounts. The Board instructed her to notify 3 magazine companies to cancel the unpaid subscriptions of one mental health patient. Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to forgive the mental health and/or substance abuse accounts of the following persons D.L., D.R., A.L., I.N., D.S. as of this date. Ayes--all.

Albert City Mayor Kevin Zadow, councilpersons Keith Moe and Doug Anderson presented a letter requesting renewal of the law enforcement contract between Albert City and Buena Vista County. Action will be taken following the consideration of raises on May 24.

Linnan told the Board of a request for placement of a sign identifying Bluebird Creek. The Board directed him to respond that the Board has no policy for providing such signs. However, it would be agreeable for the 2nd grade students of Sioux Valley School to purchase and maintain a sign for that

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to designate the road east of Section 25-91-38 from Iowa Highway #7 north to the northeast corner of said Section 25-91-38 officially as **Villa Road** and that signing and maintenance thereof to be done at no cost to the county, as per request of the Lake Creek Homeowners Association. Ayes--all.

The Board discussed **insurance** on Secondary Road equipment and agreed to list equipment with a current value greater than \$50,000. Linnan suggested that the schedule for consideration of the various insurance quotes include November 22, 1988 as the date for the Board to receive the quotes.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to authorize the Chairman to sign I.C. #11-1988 on D.D. #181 L.C. Ayes--all.

Burnside reported a request by the City of Marathon to buy a small piece of ground from the county on which to burn diseased trees. The consensus of the Board was not to sell any portion of B.V. County property for that purpose.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following reports: Recorder's 3rd Qtr. '87-88. Ayes--all. Also reviewed were April Mangold Environment Testing, UDMO-UP, and 1st Qtr. Farm to Market Funds. 187-88.

Jean Eckerman, Auditor's 1st Deputy, met with the Board to discuss a "Staywell Committee" meeting held April 25. A survey will be circulated and Eckerman will report back to the Board.

Clarence Krepps, Storm Lake City Administrator, met with the Board to discuss an agreement regarding weed spray application within a defined area around the city test well area. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve the agreement regarding control of weeds in Storm Lake's test well area, and to authorize the Board to sign. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve repair orders on sites 88-8 and 88-9 of D.D. #181 and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes--all.

Seven written proposals were submitted with brief presentations by the following: Mike Sharar - Planning Systems, Susan Fitzpatrick - Cherry Corners Agency, Sue Pate (Iowa Benefits) and Clark Fort - Colburn & Elk Agency, Dennis Freeman - Freeman Insurance Services, Rick Angell - John Hancock, Steve Kappenman - New York Life - Washington National, Bill Peterson (ISAC) and Art Kahler - Blue Cross and Blue Shield, all except Blue Cross from Storm Lake. The Board thanked them for their presentations and answered questions. The Board had requested proposals for several reasons including: local agents had requested an opportunity to make presentations, the Board wished to make comparisons between available and current coverage. The agenda was reviewed with several additions made.

Well permits are currently issued by the county. New state requirements are more stringent. Kurtz stated that the Board of Health leaves it to the Supervisors as to whether the county will continue to issue the permits. The supervisors tabled the discussion for future consideration.

- The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 5. section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amount charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The sum of \$764,943.00 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund, with one half the amount to be transferred effective July 1, 1988 and the last one-half to be transferred on January 1, 1989. The sum of \$102,000.00 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred effective July 1, 1988 and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1989. The sum of \$928,000.00 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred effective July 1, 1988 and the last one-half transferred effective January 1, 1989.

The Auditor is directed to correct her books accordingly and to notify the Treasurer of this operating transfer, accompanying the notification with a copy of this resolution and the record of its adoption.

RESOLUTION FOR INTERFUND OPERATING TRANSFERS

It was moved by Harjes, seconded by Rehnstrom, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to authorize the Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Basic Fund and the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund during the 1988-1989 year and WHEREAS said transfers must be in accordance with section 331.432 Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa as follows:

Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988 shall not exceed the sum of \$102,000.00; and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988 shall not exceed the sum of \$928,000.00.

Section 2. Within 30 days of being notified of the apportionment of current property taxes, state replacements against levied property taxes, Mobile Home taxes, Military service tax credit replacements or livestock credit replacements to the General Basic or Rural Basic Funds, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said fund to the Secondary Road Fund.

Section 3. The amount of transfer requried by Section 2, shall be equal to the apportionment made under Section 2 to the General Basic or Rural Services Basic Funds, respectively, multiplied by this ratio of said Funds maximum transfer to the Secondary Road Fund to the sum of said Funds total current property tax levy, total mobile home taxes, total military service tax credit replacements, and total livestock credit replacements.

Section 4. Not withstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this resolution, total transfers to the Secondary Road Fund shall not exceed the amounts specified in section 1.

Section 5. The Auditor is directed to correct her books when said operating transfers are made and to notify the Treasurer and the County Engineer of the amounts of said transfers.

The above resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors on July 5, 1988.

The media and I interested person were present. Armstrong reviewed the Commission's activities for the past few years and described the option for separation of wastes as selected by the Commission. They propose to have the county borrow the money to finance the project, and to have the county sell or lease-purchase the facility to the Buena Vista County Landfill Commission. The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, August 16 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Harjes, Gustafson, Rehnstrom and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Vail.

Minutes of the August 2 meeting were read and approved.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to authorize the **auditor** to destroy IPERS Quarterly Reports for 1966-79. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to **employ** J. Joyce Fielder as a temporary part-time employee in the Auditor's office for 2 days per week in August and September and 5 days per week October 1st through November 15th at \$4.50 per hour. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a **fireworks** permit for September 5 submitted by Balloon Days/Mike Morrow, the fireworks to be set off from the jetty with Buena Vista County assuming no liability or responsibility for safety. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the **late filings** for homestead credit on parcel $\#^1$ s 6645.00, 999.40, 2852.00, 5868.00, 8604.50, 7311.50, 6657.00, 4300.00, and 805.00, and military exemptions on parcel $\#^1$ s 4450.00, 7311.50, 4300.00, and 805.00, all as recommended by the Assessor. Nurse Karole Graen reported the hiring of two **home health aides**. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to employ Rochelle Thies and Candy Streed as Homemaker Home Health Aides at \$4.50 per hour. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to appoint Dr. Scott Wulfekuhler as the physician on the Local Board of Health with his term expiring 12-31-89. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a placement and payment agreement with Spectra Health Inc. for 1 person (D.J. 8-16-88). Ayes--all.

Sheriff Duane Heeney discussed a law enforcement contract for the City of Marathon. After review the Auditor was directed to prepare a proposed contract for the City Council's consideration.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to authorize and direct the auditor to transfer \$129.74 from General Basic Fund #1 to Conservation Land Acquisition Trust Fund #68, this amount being \$59.50 for heater use and \$70.24 for restitution. Ayes--all.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 A.M. on October 11, 1988 in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the September 27th meeting were read and approved.

A request to amend the **agenda** to include a telephonic joint drainage meeting at 10:30 A.M. with the Calhoun County Board of Supervisors was approved. Drainage Engineer Darel Burns discussed the proposed permit for installation of a fiber optic cable through a joint drainage district in Calhoun County which was to be the subject of the meeting. He discussed some portions which he felt should be changed. Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller discussed the 3 changes in the permit. Schiller has contacted Calhoun County Drainage Attorney Kent Willis about the changes and has found him to be in agreement with them.

10:30 A.M. The time having arrived for the telephonic meeting of the joint boards of **D.D. #181** and **#16-30-92** the Board recessed to conduct that business. Upon its conclusion the Board resumed the business of its regular meeting.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to appoint Dr. K.M. Johannsen, Medical Examiner for Buena Vista County, and the following as deputy medical examiners: Dr. M. Schultz, Dr. Joan Nilles, Dr. Scott Wulfekuhler, and Dr. David Crippin, the appointments to be effective immediately for a term ending 12-31-1991 with the rotation of their service to be worked out by the doctors and reported to the appropriat persons, to approve the following fee schedule for medical examiner services: \$125.00 per call plus \$150.00 per hour for each additional hour after the first, and mileage of 21c per mile. Ayes--all.

After review of the law, recommendation from the County Attorney and discussion with Communication Center Head Radio Operator Tom Ling and Disaster Services Coordinator Ron Wilson who had attended an E911 workshop, motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to adopt the following resolution: It is hereby resolved by the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors pursuant to Chapter 477B, Code of Iowa 1988 (House File 2400) that a Joint 911 Service Board be established this date to carry out the requirements and provisions of HF 2400. Further, that the voting membership of the Joint 911 Service Board consist of the Chairman of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors and representatives from each of the following: Sioux Rapids, Newell, Storm Lake, Alta, Marathon, Albert City, Rembrandt, Truesdale, Linn Grove, Peterson, Aurelia, and, the Regional Head of State Radio. Paul Henze is designee of the Iowa Department of Public Safety, Division of Communications in Storm Lake. Further, that the non-voting membership of the Board consist of the Disaster Services Coordinator, the Head Radio Operator of the Communications Center, and, one representative from the Buena Vista County Hospital. The vote on the resolution was ayes--all. The Auditor was directed to so inform the members and to request that they reply with name and address of each representative.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to amend the appropriation for line 602 - weeds by \$100.00 down to \$14,615.00 and line 621 - animal bounties by \$100.00 up to \$100.00, these appropriations being a part of the FY '89 budget. Ayes--all.

Neal Kuehl, Kuehl & Payer, Storm Lake, Albert City Mayor Kevin Zadow, City Council members Keith Moe, and Virgil Wenell, Maurice Ringgenberg, and City Clerk Lenore Youngberg met with the Board to discuss a water drainage problem on the north end of Albert City. Kuehl explained that D.D. #81 waters are going into the sanitary and storm sewers of the city and that the drainage district drain tiles are inadequate for the volume of water. The city is in the process of seeking 2 community development block grants to fund the changes needed. They are also seeking the county's interest in improving D.D. #81 which is central to correcting the city's problem. Drainage Engineer Darel Burns suggested that if the Board of Supervisors is interested in investigating this problem with the city that the county and city attorneys should draw up a legal document to outline the relationship between the two entities. Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, that the Board, acting as trustees of D.D. #81 will cooperate with the city of Albert City to draw up a document outlining the legal relationship between the city and D.D. #81 for preparing the application for block grant funds with the preliminary costs to be shared equally, all subject to approval of the project by both entities. Ayes—all.

Chairman Burnside left to attend another meeting. Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, that Supervisor Vail act as temporary chairman in her absence. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan reported that the monitoring wells have been completed. Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to accept the contract with Seneca Corporation, Des Moines, Iowa, for the installation of 22 monitoring wells project #ENV88131B as satisfactorily completed as of this date. Ayes--all.

A response has been received regarding a variance granted at Casino Beach. No response has come from Cherokee County regarding Buena Vista County's offer to help maintain the roads used by us for gravel hauling.

The Board agreed to set October 25th at 1:00 P.M. as the date and time for receiving bids on a salt shed to be constructed in Sioux Rapids, the project completion date to be 12-16-88.

Human Services Director Anita Hallquist discussed a new placement at Webster Health Care Inc. and also another patient currently placed there. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve payment of community support group fees of \$7.00 per day for 2 days per week for 1 person (C.A. 10-11-88), and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes--all.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, October 25th at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the October 11th and 18th meetings were read and approved.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to authorize the Chairman to sign the 1989-90 Application for General Allocation Funds for MH/MR/DD, and, to appoint the following persons to the MH/MR/DD Advisory Board: Emily Jackson, Chairperson, Ruth Tucker, Julie Rehder, and Maureen Kelsey - advocates; Kim Wilson, Sue Morrow, Penny Wilson and Sandy Lloyd - service providers; Jim Gustafson - funding provider; Anita Hallquist - program monitor; and Joan Sliefert - Auditor's staff, the appointment to be effective 1/1/89. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve **late filings** for homestead credit on parcel#'s 10346.20 and 9339.50 and for military exemption on parcel #2510.00, all as recommended by the County Assessor. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a Grant Agreement with Friesen of Iowa, Inc., specifying the conditions of the \$15,000.00 grant to Friesen. Ayes--all.

Excess 55 gallon barrels will be sold for \$2.00 a piece for trash containers.

The Board directed the Engineer to commence the work to close the road between Sections 3 & 4, Newell Township immediately.

Nurse Darlene Peterson reviewed the October Board of Health minutes with the Supervisors.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the **employment** of Karen Barnes at \$4.50 per hour as a HM/HH Aide effective 10-18-88. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, that Harjes serve as **Chairman** Pro-Tem in the absence of Burnside. Ayes--all.

1:00 P.M. The time having arrived for the opening of the bids for a salt shed to be built in Sioux Rapids, Chairman Harjes called for Engineer Linnan to open and read the bids. Bids were received from Tom Witt, Newell, and K & D Construction, Storm Lake. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to accept the low bid of \$18,341.00 from Tom Witt, to authorize the Chairman to sign the contract, and to return the proposal guarantee to the unsuccessful bidder. Ayes—all. Supervisor Burnside returned and Chairman Pro-Tem Harjes relinquished the Chair.

1:30 P.M. The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on the Engineer's Final Report on D.D. #83, the Board recessed for the hearing and reconvened upon its conclusion.
