Fence Removal & Replacement Policy in Conjunction with Acquisition of New Right of Way

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, that, Buena Vista County agrees to pay actual labor costs to remove any existing fence, and if requested, to blade dirt away before removal, that, if fence is rebuilt within 18 months of completion of road grading, the county will pay the actual cost of fence material that cannot be re-used and the labor to rebuild, that, the County will not participate in material costs, or added labor costs to replace a barb wire fence with a woven wire fence, and, that maximum labor payments are: \$6.50/rod to remove woven-wire and \$6.50/rod to replace woven wire fencing, and, \$4.50/rod to remove barb-wire and \$4.50/rod to replace barb-wire fencing. Upon completion of the <u>canvass</u> of the March 19, 1991 Newell - Midwest Gas (Public Measure "A" 25 year non-exclusive franchise) Election pursuant to Chapter 50.24 of the 1991 Code of Iowa, motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to declare the results as follows, and to direct the Auditor to prepare the abstract of election: Total votes cast: 92; yes - 88, no - 4 Public Measure "A" approved. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the employment of Steve Tjaden as a part time jailer at \$5.00 per hour effective March 11, 1991. Ayes all.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reported on his investigation of the tree count in $\underline{\rm DD}$ #20. Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to enter into a private contract for tree removal in Section 21, Newell Township with Merle Oxley for his R.O.W. and with Robert Witzke for R.O.W. of Catherine and Wilbert Witzke, and to make spray available for the cut tree stubs. Ayes all.

HM/HHA site visit and Annual YES operation.

Engineer Don Linnan reported illegal dumping in the county ROW near Marathon and other areas. Also discussed was progress on the condemnations and contract gravel hauling.

10:30 a.m. The time having arrived for the <u>public</u> <u>hearing</u> for the fiscal year 1992 <u>budget</u>. Chairman Vail opened the hearing with 32 persons present including 3 media persons and 16 departmental personnel. A number of questions were asked by those present. Several department heads discussed the circumstances affecting the increases in their particular budgets. The Chairman offered copies of a report of the State Mandates to Counties Report prepared by ISAC to those interested and thanked all present for their participation in the hearing. Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Liquor License for Outdoor Service Area applications submitted by the Storm Lake Municipal Golf Course and the Little Sioux Golf and Country Club. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign, the FY'92 Secondary Road Budget and Construction Program. Ayes all.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING TWENTY-SECOND MEETING, 1991 SESSION (22) JULY 2, 1991

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, July 2 at 9:00 A.M. in the Board Room with Chairman Vail presiding and with the following other members present: Burnside, Gustafson, Harjes and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the June $18\ \text{meeting}$ were read and approved.

APPROPRIATIONS RESOLUTION

It was moved by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, that the following resolution be adopted: that WHEREAS it is desired to make appropriations for each of the different officers and departments for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1991 in accordance with section 331.434 (Sec 6 1991 Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The amounts itemized by department or office on the certified County Budget for 1991-92 are hereby appropriated from the resources of each fund so itemized, to the department or office listed in the 1991-92 budget.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under Section 1 shall constitute authorization for the department or officer listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the itemized fund

expend, or contract to expend, any money, or incur any liability, or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditure of money, for any purpose in excess of the amounts appropriated pursuant to their resolution.

Section 4. If at any time during the 1991-92 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriation she shall immediately so inform the Board and recommend appropriate corrective action.

Section 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amount charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers monthly during the 1991-92 budget year.

Section 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business June 30, 1992.

The above resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors on July 2, 1991.

RESOLUTION FOR INTERFUND OPERATING TRANSFERS

It was moved by Burnside, second by Gustafson, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to transfer monies from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund and to the Secondary Road Fund; and to transfer from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund; and WHEREAS said operating transfers are in accordance with section 331.432, Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$624,586 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund, with one-half the amount to be transferred no earlier than July 1, 1991 and the last one-half to be transferred no earlier than January 1, 1992. The sum of \$95,000 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred no earlier than July 1, 1991 and the last one-half transferred no earlier than January 1, 1992. The sum of \$935,000 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred no earlier than July 1, 1991 and the last one-half transferred no earlier than January 1, 1992.

Section 2. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund shall not exceed \$95,000 and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund shall not exceed \$935,000 all for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1991.

Section 3. The Auditor is directed to correct her books accordingly and to notify the Treasurer and Engineer of these operating transfers, accompanying the notification with a copy of this resolution and the record of its adoption.

The above resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors on July 2, 1991.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to re-appoint John Massop to the <u>Board of Adjustment</u> for a 5 year term expiring June 21, 1996. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to re-appoint Virgil Jensen to the $\underline{\text{Veteran's}}$ $\underline{\text{Affairs}}$ $\underline{\text{Commission}}$ for a 3 year term expiring July 1, 1994. Ayes all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to <u>transfer</u> the following revenues (originally deposited in General Basic for FY91) to the <u>Conservation Land Acquisition Trust Fund:</u> donations, equipment rental, seedling reimbursement, heater fees and state reimbursement for the Linn Grove boat ramp in a total amount of \$1095.74. Ayes all.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed county $\underline{\text{fuel}}$ requirements. The Board directed him to check with several dealers offering card-trol and 24 $\underline{\text{hour}}$ service.

Communications Supervisor Tom Ling gave an update on the $\underline{\text{E911}}$ installation and conducted a tour of the communications center.

Treasurer Sally Grunig, Sheriff Chuck Eddy, Engineer Don Linnan, Nurse Karole Graen, HM/HHA Project Director Angie McKenna, and Auditor Karen Strawn met with the Board to discuss a proposed hiring freeze. Motion by Gustafson to implement a hiring freeze for a one year period effective July 1, 1991 to be reviewed July 1, 1992. There being no second to the motion, the motion died.

 $\underline{\text{GRSO}}$ Joleen Brady reviewed several general relief and mental health accounts. Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to adopt the following resolution:

Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a <u>resolution</u> authorizing the investment of Buena Vista County funds in the Iowa Trust Pooling Fund for Investments. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize a Board member to sign the following work orders: \underline{DD} $\underline{16-30-92}$ main open ditch tree and brush spraying in Sac and Buena Vista Counties; \underline{DD} $\underline{274}$ open ditch repair in Sac County; \underline{DD} $\underline{181}$ open ditch repair in Little Cedar, Pocahontas County. Engineer Don Linnan reported the completion of two projects. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Burnside, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the <u>asphalt re-surfacing projects</u> L-BV-8-92 and L-BV-7-92 of Rohlin Construction Company, Inc., Estherville, Iowa. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Harjes to designate the road South of Sections 4, 5, and 6-90-36 Providence Township a through road from M-48 to M-50 and to stop all roads entering this through road except M-48 and M-50. The north and south bound traffic to stop at the intersections at the southwest corners of Sections 4 and 5-90-36 and the north bound traffic to stop at the junction of the road north from Sulphur Springs at the designated through road said junction is approximately

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the <u>underground construction</u> application of Daniel Toft of Peterson, Iowa, for placing a waterline across the county road approximately 180' west of the east line of Section 16-93-38, Brooke Township. Ayes all.

Seven representatives of the City of <u>Marathon</u>, met with the Board to discuss the removal of a dangerous building on the main street of Marathon. Brad Howe, city attorney, requested financial assistance from the County to deal with the removal which poses a major liability problem.

Two representatives from the City of $\underline{\text{Linn}}$ $\underline{\text{Grove}}$ discussed acquiring ownership of two properties in Linn Grove to facilitate the removal of the eyesore building on one. The Board was favorable toward working with the city.

<u>Nurse</u> Karole Graen reviewed the August Board of Health minutes. Nursing hours are increasing due to additional vaccinations required by the State. She inquired about transportation for voluntary admission patients to Cherokee.

GRSO Joleen Brady reported that an estimate for eyeware was received. Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to approve a payment of \$205 for glasses for one person (S.H. 8-27-91) from Buckingham Estate funds. Ayes all. Brady presented a revised income guideline for general relief. Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve the amended income guidelines effective this date. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application of People's Natural Gas to install a 4" gas line in the south road ditch on the road north of Sections 32, 33, 34, 35, and 36, Newell Township with the following special conditions. All road crossings will be installed using the specifications listed in a permit application addendum letter dated August 12, 1991 which is attached to and made a part of the permit. There will be placed and maintained a minimum of five warning signs per mile. A \$2,000 per mile installation fee will be paid to Buena Vista County at the completion of the installation. A \$10,000 bond will be provided to and approved by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County prior to start of work. Said bond to cover the work for the construction period plus one year following completion of the installation. A copy of this resolution shall be attached to and become a part of the permit agreement. Ayes all.

Bids for salt storage shed to be built on the "Luedke" property on the east edge of Storm Lake were received from Paul Park Co, Storm Lake and Tom Witt, Newell. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to accept and to authorize the Chairman to sign the contract for the low bid of Paul Park in the total amount of \$19,608.00. Ayes all.

Bob O'Brien and Ron Rich, $\overline{\text{IBP}}$, and Neal Kuehl, Kuehl and Payer, discussed the IBP sewage line which runs in the ditch on the east side of the Lakeside blacktop. IBP is working with the City of Storm Lake to design a new line and will be working with the county as the project progresses. The Board thanked O'Brien, Rich and Kuehl for updating them.

DHS District Administrator Bob Peters and DHS Director Anita Hallquist updated the Board on the DHS restructuring. In the past 4 weeks, 22 1/2 staff persons were laid off in Northwest Iowa. Buena Vista County would add 1.5 specialty staff, an Income Maintenance Supervisor, a Social Worker Supervisor and an Area Administrator. There will be 23.5 people in Buena Vista, Cherokee and O'Brien Counties combined.

 $\underline{Sheriff}$ Chuck Eddy discussed paying vs giving compensatory time for overtime worked by $\underline{jailers}$. The Personnel Committee will work with the Sheriff to develop a policy.

Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to adopt the following resolution: Resolution 1991-89. Whereas: People's Natural Gas, Spencer, Iowa, has submitted permit applications for <u>underground construction</u> for installation of a gas line across land located in the following joint drainage districts: Jt DD 16-30-92, Jt DD 1-91, Jt DD 18-42, and Jt DD 19-26; and Whereas the permit forms are found to be in proper order; Be it therefore resolved that pending the approval of the counties of dual jurisdiction, the applications are hereby approved, that the Chairman is authorized to sign, and that Drainage Engineer Darel Burns is instructed to forward the signed copies to the appropriate counties with letters of explanation. Ayes all.

The Board reviewed the maps for <u>Supervisor districts</u> which have been drawn thus far. The Board suggested that the maps be posted for public comment.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-SECOND MEETING, 1991 SESSION (32) SEPTEMBER 30, 1991

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Monday, September 30, 1991 at 7:00 P.M. in the District Courtroom of the Courthouse, with Chairman Vail presiding and with the following other members present: Burnside, Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Twenty-two interested persons were present for the final public hearing on the Re-precincting Task Force recommendations. Task Force Chairman Bob Stoughton reviewed the work of the Task Force. The chairman asked for comments and/or questions. Two persons from Elk Township discussed their activity in circulating a petition bearing 94 signatures. 11 persons were in favor of the proposed merger, with 83 opposed. The reason cited for the opposition was loss of identity in the reporting of election results. Another person suggested that a merged precinct of Lincoln, Scott and Grant might be too large, and that Newell merged with Providence was too large. An alternative would be

from the Linn Grove area regarding its proposed merger with Rembrandt. Several persons suggested an election to determine precinct changes. The Election Commissioner stated that a question could be put on the General Election ballot, but not the Primary. Other comments included: driving a distance to vote is probably not an issue since people drive a distance for most services; township officers could be called upon to serve as election workers, as they had been in past years (re: difficulty of finding workers). The Chairman thanked those in attendance for the interest and attendance at the hearing. The Board will consider the re-precincting at their next meeting, with the adoption of precincts to be done by ordinance.

The public hearing having adjourned, the Board re-convened in the 2nd Floor Public Meeting Room.

Zoning Administrator Don Linnan reported that the recommendation of the Zoning Commission, on a re-zoning request of Gary Tielbur for a property in Sioux Rapids, was to approve the request. Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission, and to approve the re-zoning of a Sioux Rapids property from ag residential to commercial, the property being a part of the Auditor's Subdivision of the South Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section Six, Township Ninety-Three North, Range Thirty-Six West of the 5th Principal Meridian, Buena Vista County, Iowa, more particularly described as:

Commencing at a Point that is Three Hundred Seventy Six and Thirty Nine Hundredths Feet (376.39') East of the Southwest Corner of the Southeast Quarter (SE1/4) of Section Six (6), Township Ninety Three North (T 93 N), Range Thirty Six West (R 36 W) of the Fifth Principal Meridian (5th P.M.), Buena Vista County, Iowa, thence North 08° 10' 00" East a distance of Forty Six Feet (46.00'); thence North 39° 10' 00" East a distance of One Hundred Eleven Feet (111.00'); thence North 51° 50' 00" West a distance of Two Hundred Forty Six and Forty Three Hundredths Feet (246.43') to a point on the original Northwesterly right-of-way line of the Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway, (now abandoned), said point being 150.00 feet distant Northwesterly from, as measured at right angles to the centerline of the original (now abandoned) main line track of said Railway Company; thence North 46° 19' 30" East along the Northwesterly right-of-way line of said Railway company a distance of Three Hundred Eighty and Forty Nine Hundredths Feet (380.49') to a point on the South Line of Lot Seven (7) of the Auditor's Subdivision of said South Half (S 1/2) of the Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Six (6); thence South 00° 34' West parallel with the West Line of said Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) a distance of Two Hundred Nine and Thirty Eight Hundredths Feet (209.38') to a point on the centerline of the original main line track of said Railway Company; thence South 43° 40' 30" East a distance of One Hundred Fifty Feet (150.00') to a point on the Original Southeasterly right-of-way of the Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway said point being 150.00 feet distance Southeasterly from, as measured at right angles to, the centerline of the original main line track of said Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway as distance of Three Hundred Eighty and Forty Nine Hundredths Feet (380.49') to a point on the south line of said Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) of said Section Six (6); thence west along the South line of said Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) of said Section Six (

Storm Lake Mayor Wilbur Tucker reviewed the city's developing plans to consider converting the sewer lines leased to IBP to storm sewer lines, following their replacement by IBP's new force main. IBP would repair the 'blow-outs' before turning the lines back to the city. Storm Lake has inadequate storm sewer drainage on the east side of the city. The Board noted that their concern over the potential collapse of the lines in the county's right-of-way would not be alleviated with this new use of the lines. The Board will take the proposal under advisement.

The engineer presented 2 informal quotes for a sand bunker to be located next to the new salt shed. Quotes were submitted by Paul Park Co. & Tom Witt. Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to accept the low quote of Paul Park Co. in the amount of \$1,100 for a sand bunker to be located adjoining the new salt shed. Ayes--all.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned to Tuesday, October 8, 1991 at 9:00 A.M. for a regular session.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom to approve admission and payment agreements for 1 person at $\underline{\text{Spectra}}$ Health Center (C.T. 10-8-91). Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to approve the following <u>reports</u>: September budget reports, Clerk's Surcharges, NWIPDC, 1st Quarter FY'92 Clerk's Surcharges, Sheriff's fees and Veteran's Affairs. Ayes all. Also reviewed were September 20 refugee arrivals, Annual FY'91 Veteran's grave sites - St Mary's Cemetery, 3rd Judicial District Dept of Correctional Services.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve the following <u>late</u> <u>filings:</u> for 1990 homestead credit on parcel #'s 8632 and 5357; and for 1991 homestead credit on #'s 7221.95, 5825.56, and 4511.00. Ayes all.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns presented informal quotes on a new metal and cable locater. Quotes were received from Schonstedt Ins. Co, Reston, VA; Iowa Engineering Supply, Ames, IA; Municipal Supply Co, Des Moines, IA; A & D Technical. Omaha. NE: and Mathison Co. Sioux Falls. SD.

Burns presented his report on a petition for possible repairs to <u>DD20</u>. He suggested a hearing to determine the interest of the property owners. Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to tentatively accept the Engineer's Report on DD 20, and to set the date, place and time for the public hearing as November 26, 1991 at 10:00 a.m. in the 2nd floor public meeting room of the Courthouse, and to instruct the Auditor to publish notice and to mail notice to each landowner, as to the time of the public hearing. Ayes all.

Neal Kuehl met with the Board to discuss the <u>IBP</u> application for <u>underground construction</u> for the force main. He explained a change to the plan for re-routing water during construction. Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application submitted by IBP to install a 16" PVC/DIP force main through county road R.O.W. on 120th Avenue with the location more specifically described in the application dated this date. Ayes all.

Dick Ziebell and Eddie Anderson visited with the Board about a smokeless <u>tire</u> melting project developed for the <u>Allee</u> Research farm at Newell. Products of the process include energy, ethanol, and a feed grain additive. Their request of the Board was a letter committing old tires to their project. The Board, however, does not have control of the disposition of old tires but did offer a letter of encouragement for their project.

Case Manager Mary Harmon requested funding for sheltered work activity services for 1 person. Motion by Burnside, second by Harjes, to approve payment of $\frac{1}{2}$ services for 1 person, (V.A. 10-8-91) for a six month period, to be re-evaluated at that time. Ayes all.

Harjes, discussed the per meal reimbursement <u>policy</u>. Several persons have discussed the new policy with him. The Auditor was directed to notify Department heads of a revised proposal of combined maximum of \$9.00 for breakfast and lunch, and \$10.00 on an evening meal.

The Auditor was directed to draft an <u>ordinance</u> with the following changes to the Task Force recommendations on <u>reprecincting</u>: Brooke and Elk; and Linn Grove and Rembrandt shall not be combined; and, Grant shall be combined with Providence, Scott with Lincoln, and no change to Newell. The Board also directed the Auditor to put the first reading of the ordinance on the agenda for the October 22, 1991 meeting, and to publish the full text of the ordinance in the legal newspapers and the Alta Advertiser, Storm Lake Times, and Laurens Sun the week of October 14, 1991.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve and to enter into an agreement with the City of Rembrandt for snow removal for the 1991-92 snow season, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Harjes, to give retroactive approval for the Chairman to sign (on 9-19-91) an <u>affidavit</u> regarding the provision of details by DHS to Buena Vista County and the opportunity to participate in planning the DHS re-structuring. Ayes all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to authorize the Chairman to sign (in the absence of the Zoning Administrator) the zoning permit submitted for construction of a home on a Dr Scott Wulfekuhler property, the plans now conforming to the county zoning ordinance. Ayes all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Burnside, to approve the complete <u>report</u> text of the September 17, 1991 minutes of the Board of Health. Ayes all.

Chairman Vail left the meeting to attend a funeral.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Burnside, to appoint Don Harjes $\underline{\text{Chairman}}$ $\underline{\text{Pro-tem}}$ for the remainder of the meeting. Ayes all.

Tom Aronson, Albert City, filed an <u>ag area petition</u> for an area in Fairfield Township. Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to set the time, date, and place for the Public Hearing on the ag area petition filed by Tom Aronson, et al, as November 19, 1991 at 11:00 a.m. in the second floor public meeting room. Ayes all.

GRSO Joleen Brady discussed using the services of Iowa Credit Inc. to pursue delinquent $\underline{\mathtt{MH}}$ accounts. The Board approved.

1:30 p.m. The time having arrived for the <u>Public Hearing</u> on the <u>ag area petition</u> filed by Norman Wolff, et al, Chairman Pro-tem Harjes opened the hearing with 33 interested persons present. Jim Gailey, attorney for Wolff, spoke to the purpose of the petition, the elements of Chapter 176B of the Code of Iowa, and land ownership according to Chapter 172D(1). The Auditor read a letter in support of the approval of the petition signed by George S. Spencer, Vice President of IBP.

Willis Hamilton, attorney for Dennis Weinhold, spoke in opposition to the creation of the ag

Chet <u>Brecher</u>, Steve Roth, and David Richter met to discuss the relocation of a <u>road</u> in the Casino area. Chuck Tapley reviewed the mapping on the plans. Roth discussed a re-platting of the area. Brecher reviewed several areas of concern, and requested that the Board consider paying a portion of the proposed road relocation project. The Board scheduled a special meeting for Wednesday, October 16, 1991 for further discussion and to include the County Engineer.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to employ Christine Busch as a full time radio operator in the Communications Center effective October 1, 1991 at a rate of \$6.40 per hour. Ayes all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Burnside, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman Pro-tem to sign, the <u>Contractor's Bond</u> of People's Natural Gas for the gas pipeline project approved August 27, 1991. Ayes all.

Tapley asked for direction from the Board regarding the County's acceptance of the new road, and the vacation of the old right of way. A tentative plan was discussed. Brecher, Roth and Tapley will keep in contact with the Board as the project proceeds.

Engineer Don Linnan reported a potential loss of \$266,000 to Buena Vista County if the State's \underline{road} \underline{use} \underline{tax} \underline{fund} is converted to offset the deficit in the State's general fund.

DHS Director Anita Hallquist presented a tax suspension notice for release. Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to lift the <u>tax suspension</u> on parcel #5488.10 pursuant to Chapter 427.11 of the Code of Iowa. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign an intergovernmental 28E agreement with the DHS of the State of Iowa for the emergency assistance program. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve a $25c/hour \underline{raise}$ for Custodian Carl Lewis retroactive to September 27, 1991, and the wage to be reviewed again \overline{July} 1, 1992. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a renewal of the State Legalization Impact Assistance Grant (SLIAG) for October 1, 1991 to September 30, 1992. Ayes all.

Hallquist reviewed the programs scheduled to be cut March 1, 1992 due to the 3.25% across the board cut in the State's budget.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve the following reports: Sept. Medicaid Case Management, Recorder's fees, October Board of Health, and annual B.V. County Nursing Service for FY'91. Ayes all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Burnside, to approve the first reading of $\underline{\text{Ordinance}}$ $\underline{1.6}$ to Establish Voting Precincts, to suspend the second reading pursuant to Chapter $\underline{331.302(5)}$, and to set the date and time for the third reading as November 5, 1991 at 1:15 p.m. Burnside - aye, Gustafson - aye, Rehnstrom - aye, Vail - aye. The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, November 19, 1991 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Vail presiding, and with the following other members present: Burnside, Gustafson, Harjes, and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to authorize TMC Corp as the long distance telephone carrier for Courthouse offices effective immediately. Ayes all.

Minutes of the November 5 and November 12, 1991 meetings were read and approved.

Upon final reading of $\underline{\text{Ordinance}}$ $\underline{\#5.2}$ - Groundwater Protection, the second reading having been suspended by a vote of the Board pursuant to 331.302(5) of the Code of Iowa, motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve the final reading of and to adopt Ordinance #5.2 as published November 2, 1991 in the Storm Lake Pilot Tribune with the following change: ...permit fee shall be established by the Board of Health, with notice to be provided to the Board of Supervisors and the County Auditor, and to authorize the members to sign. The roll call vote was as follows: Burnside - aye, Gustafson - aye, Harjes - aye, Rehnstrom - aye, Vail - aye. The ordinance was declared adopted.

The Board recessed to the second floor Public Meeting Room to hear the concerns of 18 interested persons regarding snow clearing following the October 31 storm. Sue Morrow gave her concerns, and those of her staff, regarding the condition of the county road where Spectra Health Care is located. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTIETH MEETING, 1991 SESSION (40) NOVEMBER 26, 1991

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, November 26, 1991 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Vail presiding and with the following other members present: Burnside, Gustafson, Harjes, and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Sandy Lloyd, Administrator of the $\underline{B.V.}$ Work Activity Center, with several employees and members of her board, requested a letter of support for a grant to expand the glass and plastic recycling, and to purchase equipment for shredding confidential office papers.

Jon Green, Manager of the Harold Rowley Recycle Center, apprised the Board of the need to retain the recycle and shredding business until other counties can be brought in to bring the center up to full capacity. The Solid Waste commission is not opposed to the BVWAC project, but needs to preserve its revenue sources until additional sources are found.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve a letter of support for the BVWAC request. Burnside indicated that she would abstain due to serving on both the BVWAC and Recycle Center boards. The Chairman called the motion. Ayes - Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom. Abstain - Burnside. Motion carried.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reviewed his report on \underline{DD} $\underline{\#20}$ and the business of the public hearing.

10:00 a.m. The time for the DD 20 Public Hearing having arrived, the Chairman opened the hearing with 5 interested persons, 1 media person, and Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller present. Drainage Engineer Burns discussed the origin and history of the drain located in Coon Township (T 91N R 35W) and reviewed the request for repairs for which he had filed his report. His estimate to return the ditch to its 1910 condition (initial construction) was \$30,095.50. An additional \$15,684.78 would pay for previous work, survey and administrative costs. Burns recommended a clean out beginning with tree and brush removal. Burns also advised those present of a recent letter from the Army Corp of Engineers relative to rip rap placed in DD34. He recommended filing a copy of the report with the Corps and Iowa DNR to notify them of the proposed activity. Schiller has requested a determination from the Corps of Engineers on whether the maintenance of the drainage district actually falls under the regulations as they were intended.

Vail asked what the cost of tree and brush removal would be if that were the only action ordered now - \$2,000.00. The costs incurred so far, plus the survey, and report would be assessed back to the landowners according to the original assessment schedule. Landowners have the right to petition for a re-classification and the Board could order it at a cost of about \$5,000 or more. Burns recommendations do not include re-classification.

Whether or not livestock in the ditches should be banned was asked. If the Board were to order the ban, the policy would need to be in place and enforced for all drains. Several questions were asked about payment of assessments and Rurns described the difference between stamped warrants and

and/or hold another public hearing if the bids were too high.

The Engineer read a letter of objection to an assessment, of which there is none currently ordered, and suggested a letter of explanation regarding inclusion of the writer's private tile in the district.

Motion by Burnside, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the Engineer's Report, and to adopt the following resolution: The Board having heard all objections regarding the feasibility of proposed repairs to Drainage District #20, determines that the complete list of repairs set forth in the Engineer's Report of September 30, 1991, with an estimated total expense of \$45,780.28, constitutes the most desirable and feasible repair plan, that said repair work, however, shall not commence until prior approval or exemption is obtained from the Army Corps of Engineers, and should such approval or exemption not be obtained, the Board reserves the right to reconsider the Engineer's Report; further the Board also assumes, in adopting the full list of repairs outlined in the Engineer's Report, that the bids for said work will not greatly exceed the projected cost of \$45,780.28, so that should the bids exceed said estimate, the Board does reserve the right to schedule a public hearing and reconsider the repair report. Ayes all. The resolution was declared adopted.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FORTY-SECOND MEETING, 1991 SESSION (42) DECEMBER 17, 1991

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, December 17, 1991 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Vail presiding, and with the following other members present: Burnside, Gustafson, Harjes, and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the December 3, 1991 meeting were read and approved.

DHS Director Anita Hallquist reported on the progress of one client at Horizon's Unlimited and requested approval for an additional 6 months at the facility. The Board approved (D.B. Jr. 12-17-91). Hallquist reviewed the funding sources for a number of different services. She also requested funding for 1 developmentally disabled person (D.B. 12-17-91) for supervised apartment living services at Horizon's Unlimited and work activity and job coaching (to be paid by Vocational Rehabilitation). The Board approved funding for a 2 month period.

Engineer Don Linnan presented the results of the bid letting on the grading project of $\underline{\text{C-49}}$.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to accept the low <u>bid</u> of <u>Wetherell Excavating</u> and <u>Trucking</u> for project #SN-3017(1)--51-11 in the amount of \$153,331.78 and the "tied" project #FM-11(21)--55-1 in the amount of \$66,516.87 for the grading of C-49, and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Burnside, to accept and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Contractor's Bond of Wetherell Excavating and Trucking for the above named projects. Ayes all.

The lights at the intersection of $\underline{\text{M-}50}$ and the railroad tracks have been vandalized nearly resulting in the collision of a train and an automobile. The <u>engineer</u> discussed the icy condition of gravel roads due to the unusually severe winter weather. (Additional calcium chloride treatment as applied in Clay County might be helpful.) Scarifying might be possible on some of the worst roads in the problem areas. The pavement on the Lakeside blacktop has been damaged due to heavy equipment. The engineer also discussed the policy he had been working on with Sue Morrow to provide access to Spectra when road conditions are bad due to storms. The Board will schedule an all day meeting with the engineer for discussion of secondary road items.

<u>CADA</u> Director Karen Paulson and Gerry Whitney, new staff member, visited about looking for a new office in Storm Lake. Whitney works 20 hours/week in Buena Vista and Sac Counties. NW IA MHC will be starting a "Batterers Program" to comply with legislation requiring programs to be started by January 1992. It is based on a Minnesota program.

Rich Michaelis, Iowa D.O.T. District Planner, Sioux City, met to discuss the <u>Highway 71 bypass</u>. Highway 71 has been identified as part of Iowa's major commercial-industrial network - the D.O.T.'s priority route. Michaelis wants to work with the Board to reach a mutual agreement on the transfer of jurisdiction of old 71. The D.O.T. will not continue development of the project until an agreement is reached on the transfer of jurisdiction. Projected traffic counts were reviewed. The consensus of the Board was support of the transfer of jurisdiction, but with strong reservations about the traffic counts and the condition of the road at the time of the transfer of jurisdiction. The Board will discuss the subject further and contact Michaelis.

Darwin Munson, $\underline{\text{Iowa}}$ $\underline{\text{Electric}}$ $\underline{\text{Light}}$ $\underline{\text{and}}$ $\underline{\text{Power}}$, thanked the Board for the responsiveness of the county to his company's requests for assistance during the winter storm recovery.

Treasurer Sally Grunig updated the Board on the ISAC meeting with the Governor to discuss the County Treasurers' proposal to provide drivers license services and the Lowa Trust situation. Grunig requested that departments put off all expenditures except the essentials from now until March 31 to preserve the County's fund balance. Motion by Harjes, second by Burnside, to authorize the Treasurer to contact the County Attorney with instructions to investigate Buena Vista County joining with other counties in planned litigation to retrieve the county's funds in the Iowa Trust, and to pursue the retrieval of the money withdrawn by Polk County and the City of Marshalltown prior to the December 11 freezing of the funds of the Iowa Trust. Ayes all.

GRSO Joleen Brady reported on a general relief application completed with false information and recommended suspension for 1 year according to the general relief guidelines. The Board agreed. Motion by Burnside, second by Gustafson, to pay 1/2 of the orthodontist treatment for 1 person (A.G. 12-17-19) from the Buckingham Estate Funds. Ayes all.

Motion by Burnside, second by Harjes, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the cover letter and application to the Iowa Army Corps of Engineers for repairs to be done on $\underline{\text{DD20}}$. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Burnside, to approve the following reports: November Clerk's surcharges, Recorder's fees, '91 County Farm grain summaries, November budget reports. Ayes all. Also reviewed were 3rd Qtr '91 Child Support Recovery, FY'91 UDMO Financial report, and December YES Center.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to approve the following $\underline{\text{late filings}}$ for homestead credit on the following parcels: for 1990 homestead -#3695.00, for 1991 homestead - #6437.00, 1074.00, and 3695.00. Ayes all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to adopt, and to authorize the Board members to sign, a <u>proclamation</u> encouraging all Iowans to ratify the <u>Equal Rights Amendment</u> when it comes to a vote in the 1992 General Election. (Proclamation on file as resolution 1991-124.) Ayes all.

Minutes of the December 17, 1991 meeting were read and approved.

Sanitarian Ray Kurtz and Martin Glienke discussed manure run off into a county road ditch at a site in Maple Valley Township. Iowa State Administrative Code does not appear to prohibit the action. The run off problem appears to have developed as a result of last spring's excessive rains and is not a willful discharge. For future needs, a silt and solids restraining fence could be installed and periodically cleaned, and then clean the ditch when necessary. It was agreed that Glienke will install the silt fence, the County will clean the ditch next year.

Kurtz informed the Board that wells are being closed only as the state grant funds are received by the county. He suggested that $\underline{\text{well}}$ $\underline{\text{testing}}$ funds, which aren't currently in such great demand, be used for expanding the $\underline{\text{well}}$ $\underline{\text{closure}}$ $\underline{\text{program}}$.

 $\underline{\tt Engineer}$ Don Linnan reviewed a proposed agreement for maintenance of county line roads to be negotiated with border counties.

 $\underline{\text{Nurse}}$ Karole Graen reviewed December Board of Health minutes and requested information for budget preparation.

Treasurer Sally Grunig asked for the disposition of state general allocation funds. Motion by Burnside, second by Harjes, to approve the deposit of the county general allocation funds (formerly county assistance and personal property) in the amount of \$66,556.94 into the General Basic Fund (001) per the FY'92 approved budget. Ayes all. Grunig also updated the Board on the Iowa Trust. At the recommendation of the County Attorney we will not enter into litigation independently since Buena Vista County is included in the class action lawsuit.

Vail appointed Burnside and Harjes to the end of the calendar year <u>cash count</u> committee.

The Board discussed a letter from the Sac County Board of Supervisors inviting Buena Vista to join with Sac, Ida, and Crawford Counties in forming a $\underline{\text{DHS}}$ cluster in the DHS re-organization. The auditor will respond with an affirmative answer.

Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following $\frac{\text{reports:}}{\text{FY'91}}$ Veteran's pensions, Nov. Medicaid Case Management, Dec. Board of Health. Ayes all. The following reports were also reviewed: Dec. Highway 20.
