Acquisition of Right-of-Way Assurance Statement of 1992

Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, that in order to comply with the provisions of the 1970 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Land Acquisition Policies Act, as amended by Title IV of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987, the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County furnishes the following assurances to the Iowa Department of Transportation: 1. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to acquire right-of-way in accord with Title III of said 1970 Act as amended by Title IV of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987 and applicable state laws. 2. It is the policy of Buena Vista County to provide relocation assistance benefits in accord with Title II of said 1970 Act, as amended by Title IV, and applicable state laws. 3. The above named county will contact the Iowa Department of Transportation for assistance as needed to assure compliance with applicable laws which are summarized in the instructions entitled "Uniform Manual, Real Property Acquisition and Relocation Assistance." Ayes--all.

Fence Repair & Replacement Policy

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, that, Buena Vista County agrees to pay actual labor costs to remove any existing fence, and if requested, to blade dirt away before removal, that, if fence is rebuilt within 18 months of completion of road grading, the county will pay the actual cost of fence material that cannot be re-used and the labor to rebuild, that, the County will not participate in material costs, or added labor costs to replace a barb wire fence with a woven wire fence, and, that maximum labor payments are: \$6.50/rod to remove woven-wire and \$6.50/rod to replace woven wire fencing, and, \$4.50/rod to remove barb-wire and \$4.50/rod to replace barb-wire fencing. Ayes--all.

Authority to Close Roads & Detour Traffic

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to authorize County Engineer Donald D. Linnan and Assistant County Engineer Darel D. Burns to close any and all county roads, on which construction is proposed, in order to facilitate construction, and for the duration of the construction, and to close any county road for necessary maintenance repair, and to mark all detours as necessary, without requiring any further authorization, and furthermore, to be authorized to issue and sign special permits for the movement of vehicles of excessive size and weight upon Buena Vista County Secondary roads in accordance with Chapter 321E Code of Iowa. Ayes--all.

Holiday, Vacation, and Sick Leave Policy

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, that the Buena Vista County Personnel Policy with the effective date of December 1, 1986, as amended December 30, 1986, and September 29, 1987, along with the various Departmental Rules and Job Descriptions currently in effect, be declared the governing policy for all Buena Vista County employees under the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors for Buena Vista County, and that the Medical History, Physical Examination, and County Work Release forms be used in conjunction with the Personnel Policy. The savings come from doing short term, intense treatment in the psychiatric section of the Spencer Municipal Hospital instead of long term care at Cherokee MHI. Those clients who do go to the MHI also benefit from closely monitored care during the inpatient status, and appropriate outpatient services after discharge. Any client whose care is paid for in part, or in full by the county is monitored by the MHC.

To continue the discussion on mental health costs and admission procedures, the following persons joined the Board in the second floor Public Meeting Room: Co. Attorney Corwin Ritchie, Ass't Co. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FOURTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (4) JANUARY 14, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, January 14, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the following meetings were read and approved: 12-31-91, 1-2-92, 1-7-92, and 1-8-92.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reported Army Corps of Engineers and DNR approval on the DD 20 cleanout project. The engineer was directed to prepare plans and specs for letting bids on the project.

Custodian Rollie Sievers discussed facility changes necessary for compliance with the American Disabilities Act (ADA). He will seek additional proposals for the elevator.

Recorder, Shari O'Bannon, Assessor Ted Van Grootheest, and Engineer Don Linnan discussed copier replacement. The consensus of the board was to proceed with their proposal.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed the need for letting gravel contracts soon in order to prepared for necessary spring work. The board directed him to proceed.

The Board discussed the appointment of official county newspapers. John Cullen, The Times, asked for the appointment of his newspaper as of June 29, 1992. Attorney Willis Hamilton spoke on behalf of The Times and in opposition to the January 3, 1992 County Attorney's opinion which states that the County Attorney sees no authority to make a selection for less than a one year period.

GRSO Joleen Brady discussed 1 general relief appeal and 2 requests for general relief. The Board approved assistance in the amount of \$1,500 for medical care for one person (B.S. 1-14-92)

Motion by Harjes, that the recommendation of the B.V. County Compensation Board for increases to elected officials be reduced to 0 due to the state of the economy, second by Rehnstrom. Ayes all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to establish the E911 Surcharge Fund (079) and to establish the E911 Long Term Debt Fund (042), and to authorize (retroactive to January 10, 1992) the transfer of \$15,000 from fund 79 to fund 42 for the purpose of E911 loan repayment. Ayes all.

Greg Anlicker, Executive Director NW IA Aging, and Carl Bjork, Marie Grote and Ina Hansen requested \$8,343.00 in the upcoming FY'93 budget which is \$1.80/each 65+ year olds in the county.

Rose Lee, Executive Director Regional Transit Authority, requested \$5,647.00 in the FY'93 budget for capital replacement of vehicles.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to appoint the following as the official legal newspapers for 1992. Storm Lake Pilot Tribune, Buena Vista County Journal, and the Sioux Rapids Bulletin-Press. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign, the FY'93 case management contract with DHS for Medicaid eligible MR and DD populations, the billing procedures for such services to remain the same. Ayes all.

GRSO Joleen Brady requested assistance for 1 person. Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve payment of 1/2 of the orthodontist's services in the amount of \$620.62 for 1 person (A.S. 1-28-92) from the Buckingham Trust. Ayes all. Brady reviewed a court case. The Board approved garnishment in the amount of the judgment.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to rescind the Board's 1/2/92 action accepting Joleen Brady's resignation, and to re-establish her employment with the county as General Relief Services Officer effective immediately. Ayes all.

Clark Fort requested an agent of record letter for providing an insurance quote with ICAP. The Board will consult with the County Attorney. He also advised the Board that the county care facility building can now be insured separate from Spectra's professional and liability policies.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to appoint Supervisor Gustafson as the Buena Vista County representative on the ISAC MH/MR/DD Community Services Work Group. Ayes all.

Due to the landowners objecting to signing easements for the additional right-of-way necessary to make grade corrections, it was moved by Rehnstrom, seconded by Gustafson, to direct the County Engineer to request a design exception from the I.D.O.T. to eliminate the need to make said grade corrections on C-65 near the SW corner of section 17-90-38, and in the east 1/2 mile south of Section 15-90-38 prior to asphalt resurfacing of C-65 from the Cherokee County line east 4 miles. Ayes 3, Nay Vail. Motion carried.

Motion by Rehnstrom second by Vail to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign, and to

Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to send a letter to the Governor, local legislators, and the Senate and House majority and minority leaders, objecting to the proposed transfer of \$50,000,000 a year from the Road Use Tax Fund to the state's General Fund; further, that the letter emphasize that the user tax is the fairest tax possible in that those who use the highways, pay for them; that a transfer from the RUTF will cause a funding problem there and will not solve the state's budget problem; that Buena Vista County would lose \$90,000 per year if the RUTF is robbed of \$50,000,000; and finally, that the only way to replace money transferred out of the RUTF, is to raise local property taxes. Ayes all.

Ayes all. The following reports were also reviewed: 1991 annual UDMO report, and January NWIPDC.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to employ Michael J. White on a part time basis as a radio operator in the Communications Center, effective January 20, 1992 at \$5.69/hour. Ayes all.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to employ Roger Haakinson on a part time basis as a jailer, effective January 25, 1992 at \$5.00/hour. Ayes all.

Larry Rohret, Executive Director, and Joan Spooner, Agency Supervisor for UDMO, presented the 1991 Annual Report, and a funding request. Rohret will recommend that the FEMA Board award its FEMA housing grants to Buena Vista County in the amount of approximately \$3,500.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING NINTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (9) FEBRUARY 24, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Monday, February 24, 1992 at 9:30 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding, and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Ferne Frederiksen asked about appointing a Veteran's Affairs Commissioner to replace Tom Frederiksen who has resigned.

10:30 a.m. The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on the sale/trade of the County Farm, the Chairman opened the hearing. Six interested persons including 3 media were present in the second floor public meeting room. Harjes reviewed the history of the farm purchased over 100 years ago (in 1882) for \$4,800. Vail noted that the county doesn't qualify for the farm programs because the county is included in the State of Iowa for this purpose. Rehnstrom discussed that the Board has had an appraisal done on both the county farm, and the land that has a gravel deposit which the Board would like to obtain. John Demers, past tenant of the farm, explained why the county farm is not eligible for the farm programs and discussed the number of crop (144.8 tillable acres) and corn acres. There are 54.5 acres of pasture, buildings, lagoon, etc. However, the pasture has not been considered for sale up till now, but may be sold if there is interest.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed the value of having ownership of a gravel source for the purpose of keeping road maintenance at a reasonable cost.

Gustafson would like to see a trade of the county farm for the land with the gravel source. Harjes pointed out that this discussion of the sale/trade of the county farm has been going on for the purpose of finding reasonable gravel resources, and not for any other purpose.


Question - If a trade is approved, does that rule out the possibility of a sale to a third party? Answer - Yes. Question - What was the appraisal price per acre? Answer - \$1,800 for tillable acres only. Question - How do the number of acres compare - county farm vs the land with gravel source? Answer - County farm - 144.8 Gravel source - 80 acres with there being a higher appraised value per acre on the gravel source. In the trade being considered, the owner of the gravel source would pay an amount to the county for the difference in appraised value of the two properties.


Question - What all would be retained on the county farm site? Answer - The care facility, yard, and residence, totalling approximately 10 acres, will not be sold or traded.

Burnside asked for comments on the proposal to sell/trade. One person stated that the \$1800 might be just a bit high based on the type of soil. Another person thought the \$1800 would be about right according to the current market. He favors a trade to eliminate the exposure of an auction. He also recommended that the gravel source purchase or trade be tied down (committed to) prior to disposing of the county farm so that the money does not disappear into the general fund. The Board confirmed that it is their intent, that sale/trade of the county farm be for that purpose only.

Another person asked if the county is interested in another 40 acres east of the Lakeside drive-in.

With no further comments, the Chairman closed the hearing. The Board re-assembled in the Boardroom and adjourned to Tuesday, February 24, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. for a regular session.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, February 25, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding, and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the February 11, 1992 meeting were read and approved.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the new E911 Service Board 28E agreement. Ayes all.

Upon notice from the Iowa D.O.T. that 1 additional name was required, motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to appoint John Lullman to the Realtors portion of the Eminent Domain Compensation Commission for Buena Vista County. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign an agreement with the Iowa Dept. of Human Services for the provision of case management services with the county of Buena Vista as the provider. Ayes all.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the applications of Pronto Market, Storm Lake, for a Class C Beer Permit and a Class C Liquor and outdoor service area permit for Little Sioux Golf and Country Club of Sioux Rapids. Ayes all.

Drainage Engineer Don Etler and Hugh Flannegan (Hugh Flannegan Conservation Service) discussed drainage work and bids to be taken on DD 20 on March 10, 1992.

Engineer Don Linnan explained that there are at least 3 "islands" in the county where an unincorporated parcel is completely surrounded by corporate limits. The Board directed the Auditor (on behalf of the Board of Supervisors) to send notice of legal description of the islands to the Iowa State "City Development Board" so that annexation plans may be developed, and to send a copy to the City of Storm Lake.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

on the Veteran's Affairs Commission replacing Tom Frederiksen effective March 1, 1992. Ayes all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to adopt the following Resolution 1992-39 RESPONSE TO STATE MANDATES INCLUDING MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES MANDATES ON COUNTY GOVERNMENT: WHEREAS, the State of Iowa has shifted costs of state mandated responsibilities, notably costs of mental health services, to county property owners; and WHEREAS, we feel the counties and the county property owners have surpassed their obligations in supporting said state programs, and WHEREAS, the state should be prohibited from requiring any new or expanded activities or from shifting additional tax burdens to counties without provisions being made for full state financing. The state should be further prohibited from reducing the state-financed portion of the costs of any existing activity or service required of counties. Any new activity or service or an increase in the level of activity or service beyond that required by existing law shall not be required of counties by the General Assembly or any state agency unless a state appropriation is made and disbursed to pay the county for any increased costs; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors does hereby proclaim that Buena Vista County will not continue to accept state mandates unless the State of Iowa sends appropriate funding to accompany these mandates. Ayes all. The Auditor was directed to send copies to the Governor, area legislators and the majority and minority leaders of both houses.

Clark Fort asked about an agent's letter of record for an insurance company. His company, ICAP, will provide a quote to only 1 agent. Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to authorize the Chairman to sign an agent of record letter for Clark Fort for ICAP and the Iowa League of Municipalities. The vote being uncertain, a roll call vote was taken. Gustafson-aye, Harjes-aye, Rehnstrom-nay, Vail-aye. Motion carried.

Rhonda Christensen, Extension Director, discussed the changes which are coming to Extension and the "window of opportunity" on the Ag Extension levy. She requested a \$5,000 allocation in the FY'93 county budget to be contingent on any legislative change.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign an agreement with Spectra Health Care for Intervention Care services for Buena Vista County citizens meeting admission criteria, the purpose being to reduce MHI admissions, and to appoint Gustafson, with Vail as the alternate, as the contact person for the county prior to admission. Ayes all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to deny the request of Lutheran Family Service for an increase in rates in both the CSALA (5% increase requested) and Group Home (3.5% increase requested) programs but to continue funding at the present rates. Ayes all.

DHS Director Anita Hallquist reported that the county stands to recover from the state about \$5,000 for case management services paid by the county over the established base expenditures for "maintenance of effort" services.

GRSO Joleen Brady and the responsible person for a mental health account met to discuss a billing problem. The Board agreed to forgive 1/2 if the person would pay 1/2 (E.R. 2/25/92-ex spouse M.R.)

HM/HHA Project Director Angie McKenna reviewed February Board of Health minutes.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve the following reports: Jan Recorder's fees, Feb. Conservation, Spectra lagoons, Medicaid Case Management, NW IA YES Center, 1992 Ag Extension Certificate of Organization, and Board of Health. Ayes all. Also reviewed were: Annual County Fair and Raceway, Cablevision court order, SLADC Revolving Loan Fund Financial.







HM/HHA Project Director Angie McKenna invited the Board to a Community Awareness workshop called "Bridging the Gap" on May 2 at the Buena Vista College Forum - regarding services for the Developmentally Disabled. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING SIXTEENTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (16) MARCH 17, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, March 17, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding, and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Harjes.

After discussion of the road embargo and prevailing weather and road conditions, the consensus of the Board was to lift the embargo at midnight, March 17, 1992.

The Board discussed the details of the proposed contract for the sale of the county farm and purchase of a gravel site.

One interested person inquired about why B. V. County is using private contractors to do the re-graveling instead of using county trucks. Due to the substantial amount of work to be done on graveling this year, outside contractors are being used in order to complete the project by September.

10:30 a.m. The time having arrived for the public hearing on the FY'93 budget, Chairman Burnside opened the hearing with 31 interested persons present including 19 department heads and employees and 3 media. In her introductory remarks, the Chair reviewed Section 331.438 of the Code of Iowa which limits mental health costs to FY92 total expenditures if the General Assembly does not adopt a cost sharing formula. This section of the Code was considered in preparing service area 4.

Greg Ebersole compared the medical examiners program of several years ago to the one currently in place (service area 1). Karole Graen explained several of the programs provided by the Public Health Nursing Department (service area 3). It was noted that Juvenile Detention and Juvenile Attorney Fees comprise the major portion of service area 2. The Sanitarian does food establishment licensing and well testing and closure.

Anita Hallquist discussed the increase in the number of MR clients served in service area 4. She explained the change in licensure of several foster care facilities to IC facilities and discussed different funding plans for different services. Angie McKenna discussed the revenue sources for the HM/HHA.

The Chairman highlighted the Weed Dept. and Landfill expenditure. Don Linnan responded to a question about the change in budgeting for environmental restoration from service area 7 to service area 6, and the expenditures for zoning. Concerns were voiced over the contribution to SLADC.

Linnan reviewed projects planned for the budget year including purchase and set up of the gravel site. Karen Strawn explained the debt service area which is new to the county but is not an additional tax.

With no additional questions, the Chairman closed the hearing at 12:10 p.m.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Fiscal Year '93 budget as proposed. Ayes all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to deposit the second 1/2 General Allocation Funds (Personal Property and County Assistance) in the General Basic Fund as budgeted. Ayes all.


1:30 p.m. The time having arrived for the Public Hearing on the reconstruction of C-63, the Chairman opened the hearing with 30 interested persons present including 2 media persons. Engineer Linnan reviewed the accident history of the road which suggests the improvements being considered including grade corrections and widening of the ROW. The ROW would be widened from 80' to 120'. The project might cost \$500,000. Cherokee County will be doing some work on the road in their county. Farm to Market funds are not directed at particular projects, so F-M funds are a part of the resources available for this and other projects. The hard surface of the road would not be widened but would remain at 22'. Due to the accident history, limiting the project to re-surfacing would probably not be appropriate. Spot patching could be done as a minimum improvement. The current design standards can't be met without widening the ROW. For every mile widened to 120', slightly more than 4 acres of ROW will be added. It has been more than 20 years since work has been done on the road.

The options for work on the road include: complete reconstruction with 120' ROW, making the necessary changes in 2 projects with different degrees of improvement for each and requesting design exceptions, or making no changes except patching.

The greatest concern about complete reconstruction was having to sell the necessary right of way. At the conclusion of the hearing, there seemed to be consensus that reconstruction plans should proceed with the landowners to be kept informed. The Chair adjourned the meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to Tuesday, March 24, 1992 at 9:00 a.m. for a regular session.

Supervisor Rehnstrom left the meeting to attend a meeting at Spectra.

DHS Director Anita Hallquist discussed a MH/MR/DD/BI allocation from the State of Iowa, and the expenditure plan for those funds which needs to be completed.

GRSO Joleen Brady informed the Board that Howard Merlis was willing to be re-appointed to the Veteran's Affairs Commission. Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to re-appoint Howard Merlis as a Veteran's Affairs Commissioner for a term expiring December 31, 1995, this being an extended appointment made to bring commission terms to a calendar year basis. Brady also requested approval to send a letter to our mental health clients notifying them of the county's agreement with NW Iowa Mental Health for managed care. The Board approved.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-THIRD MEETING, 1992 SESSION (33) JULY 14, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, July 14 at 9:00 A.M. in the Board Room with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the June 30 meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer Sally Grunig, who was unable to meet with the Board in person, called to update the Board on the county's fund balances.

Motion by Gustafson, seconded by Harjes, to table the consideration of disability insurance indefinitely due to current financial resources. The Board asked questions of 2 agents regarding premium variation for different options. Some employees might prefer another type of benefit. The question was called. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan reported five of six maintenance gravel contracts completed. Motion by Harjes, seconded by Rehnstrom to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the following maintenance gravel contracts for 1992: Hallett Pit (Sac Co.) and Houska Pit (Sac Co.)--J. W. Readymix and Construction, Inc.; Hallett Pit (Cherokee Co.) and Whitney Pit--Wetherell Excavating & Trucking Inc.; Goldsmith Pit--Gary A. Reese Trucking. Ayes--all.

Linnan reported that the county may be receiving \$235,000 from the farm-to-market road fund for local construction (to reimburse for the bridge project) in about 2 weeks. He recommended increasing the contract fee to Kuehl & Payer because of the length of time required to complete the project. Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to authorize an increase, and to authorize the Chairman to sign, for an increase in project inspection fees to Kuehl & Payer, up to \$7,855.00 for the Newell People's Gas project, the fees to be paid by the applicant--People's Gas. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to authorize the Chairman to sign an application for a special use permit for gravel extraction at the South Hayes Pit. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application submitted by GTE to install buried no voltage fiber cable at the following described location: on county road M-54 2.5 miles south from Marathon. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, as Trustees of DD #86, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign an amendment to the underground construction application of GTE approved May 20, 1992 to include the following additional area: two and one-half miles along the East side of Sections 17 & 8, and along the South half of Section 5 in Fairfield Township. Ayes--all.

The Board reviewed the claims register to determine if payment of some claims could be delayed. Approximately \$26,000 in claims were delayed - 2 were for 25% (instead of 100%) of annual appropriations. Another was payment of charges as audited for FY'89 at Glenwood. The last was a contract amount due for managed care with NW IA MHC, it being an upfront cost which the MHC agreed to delay. The consensus of the Board was to delay a secondary road bridge project east of Section 35, Hayes Township, until fund balances improve.

APPROPRIATIONS RESOLUTION

It was moved by Vail, second by Harjes, that the following resolution be adopted: that WHEREAS it is desired to make appropriations for each of the different officers and departments for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1992 in accordance with section 331.434 (Sec 6) 1991 Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The amounts itemized by department or office on the certified County Budget for 1992-93 are hereby appropriated at 98% from the resources of each fund so itemized, to the department or office listed in the 1992-93 budget.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under Section 1 shall constitute authorization for the department or officer listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the itemized fund effective July 1, 1992.

Section 3. In accordance with section 331.437 Code of Iowa, no department or officer shall expend, or contract to expend, any money, or incur any liability, or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditure of money, for any purpose in excess of the amounts appropriated pursuant to their resolution.

Section 4. If at any time during the 1992-93 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriation she shall immediately so inform the Board and recommend appropriate corrective action.

Section 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amount charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers monthly during the 1992-93 budget year.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

The above resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors on July 14, 1992.

RESOLUTION FOR INTERFUND OPERATING TRANSFERS

It was moved by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, that the following resolution be adopted: WHEREAS it is desired to transfer monies from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund and to the Secondary Road Fund; and to transfer from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund; and WHEREAS said operating transfers are in accordance with section 331.432, Code of Iowa, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$800,000 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund, with one-half the amount to be transferred no earlier than July 1, 1992 and the last one-half to be transferred no earlier than January 1, 1993. The sum of \$95,000 is ordered transferred from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred no earlier than July 1, 1992 and the last one-half transferred no earlier than January 1, 1993. The sum of \$935,000 is ordered transferred from the Rural Services Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund with one-half the amount transferred no earlier than July 1, 1992 and the last one-half transferred no earlier than January 1, 1993.

Section 2. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund shall not exceed \$95,000 and the total maximum transfer from the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund shall not exceed \$935,000 all for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992.

Section 3. The Auditor is directed to correct her books accordingly and to notify the Treasurer and Engineer of these operating transfers, accompanying the notification with a copy of this resolution and the record of its adoption.

The above resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors on July 14, 1992.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following late filing(s) for homestead credit and military exemption on the following parcels: for 1991 homestead-on #2673.50; for 1992 homestead-on #2673.50, 5955.00, 2926.00, 2752.00, 5495.00, 9499.00; for 1991 military-on #2673.50; for 1992 military-on #2673.50, 5495.00, 9499.00, as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Ron Shultz, ADTU Counselor, reported the current activity at his office, and reviewed April-June services.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING
THIRTY-FIFTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (35)
AUGUST 11, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, August 11, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Minutes of the July 28 meeting were read and approved.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed his Monday meeting with consultants for the developer of a Casino subdivision, the meeting being to discuss the moving of a road. Linnan recommended contacting the city to see if they wished to exercise their 'within 2 miles of city limits' authority. In order to proceed, several agreements will need to be prepared and a bond may be required. The county is prepared to cooperate in the process but does not plan to invest any money in the project.

Linnan recommended corrections needing to be made to alleviate drainage problems on the Lakeside blacktop following the IBP construction project. The consensus of the Board was to agree with the Engineer's repair proposals which will not be the county's obligation.

The Board approved sending Shop Foreman Brad Raveling to an OSHA workshop at Kirkwood Community College. Linnan informed the Board that beginning January 1, 1993, county fuel purchases must be ethanol. Department Heads will discuss this at their next meeting. Linnan provided updates on the construction projects in progress.

The following department heads met with the Board to discuss a proposed change in the frequency of paying claims from every 2 weeks to once per month: Assessor, Treasurer, Recorder, Engineer, GRSO, Auditor. The Treasurer estimated a possible increase in interest earned over the course of a year, and depending upon the current interest rate, from \$3-\$6,000. Deputy Auditor Kennedy reported that approximately 40 warrants could be saved monthly by changing to single payment of warrants per month. The total time required for claims preparation may be reduced by doing the process once a month. The Auditor noted that the shift in workload might have some effect on other workflow, particularly with deed processing, if the once-a-month claims payment was scheduled at the end of the month. By avoiding the end of the month, the Recorder felt that this change would not be a problem for her department. The Assessor noted that some vendors who charge interest on payments received after a closing date may be unwilling to change the billing cycle for the county, and so some interest might be charged to the county. After working through several suggested time frames, motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to change the frequency of expenditure claims payment (excluding payroll), to one time per month with the claims to be submitted to the Auditor by the 11th of each month, claims to be approved by the Board of Supervisors on the 4th Tuesday of the month, and payment to be made the following day, this change to be for a trial period. Ayes--all.

Department Heads also discussed their county attorney assistance needs. The Treasurer has between 50 and 100 delinquent tax properties which, with legal research and sale of tax sale certificates by the Board, the properties could be put back on the tax rolls. The Assessor has had to prepare his own interrogatories in preparation for court cases. The GRSO would find it helpful to have quicker access to an attorney to write letters or answer legal questions. The Board would find it helpful to have an attorney present for their meetings, or at least have quick access so that questions could be answered more timely. The chairman suggested it would be useful to also discuss this with the County Attorney to get his input on the current workload for his staff. Most agreed that most all departments would benefit from having greater access to counsel, but whether a change from part-time to full-time status or increasing the number of attorneys would be a desirable change for our needs would need to be studied. No action was taken at this time.

The appointment of a zoning commissioner was tabled until August 25 pending a response from a potential appointee.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve the following late filing(s) for homestead credit and military exemption on the following parcels: for 1991 military #8408.20, for 1992 homestead #6071.00, 65.00, 6457.00, 982.75, for 1992 military #6071.00 and 982.75, as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the work order for Jt. DD #64-105 for proposed tile repair in Section 2, Delaware Township, Sac County, and to approve, and to authorize the Interim Boardmember to sign the work order for Jt. DD 181 Little Cedar Open Ditch at site 92-5 for filling the washouts and reconstructing the spoil bank in Section 10, Cedar Township, Pocahontas County. Ayes--all.

Area DHS Administrator Lyle Fleshner discussed the MH/MR/DD/BI Planning Council structure. Buena Vista County has opted to work with Crawford, Sac and Ida Counties for the Planning Council, this being the same as Buena Vista County's DHS Cluster group. Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to appoint Supervisors Harjes and Rehnstrom as Buena Vista County's supervisor representatives to the MH/MR/DD/BI Planning Council. Ayes--all.

The Board directed the GRSO to provide the required notice to the Iowa Dept. of Human Services that Buena Vista County may wish to consider changing its MR/DD Case Manager for FY'94.

Nancy Peters and Bonnie Fokken, Protection Plus Specialists, presented their American Heritage Cancer Supplement which they would like to offer to county employees by payroll deduction. The board will review the current companies and will decide after review whether any changes will be made in the companies which have access to payroll deduction.

to approve transfer from the county to the state of that portion of present County Road M-48 beginning at its south junction with present U.S. 71 near the northeast corner of Section 12, T-90N, R-37W, and extending north approximately 6.2 miles to its north junction with present U.S. 71 near the southeast corner of Section 1, T-91N, R-37W,

and to agree to other terms of this transaction as detailed in the agreement, and lastly, to authorize the Chairperson to sign this agreement for the Board of Supervisors. This resolution was approved unanimously by the Board of Supervisors this date: August 11, 1992.

RESOLUTION 1992-103

WHEREAS, the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Authority is making application for funding of additional rent assistance under the Section 8 _____ Housing Program the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and

WHEREAS, and in accordance with Section 403A.5 of the Iowa Code which states:

"A municipality or a 'Municipal Housing Agency' may not proceed with a housing project until a study or a report and recommendation on housing available within the community is made public by the municipality or agency and is included in its recommendations for a housing project. Recommendations must receive majority approval from the local governing body before proceed on the housing project."

AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH Section 213(c) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, which states in part that we must determine whether or not there is a need for such housing assistance, taking into consideration any applicable State or areawide housing assistance plan as well as generally available data with respect to population, poverty, housing. An application may be approved only if our determination is in the affirmative.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors has determined there is a need for such additional assistance AND is aware of the project and the study or report on available housing that is required by said statute AND that majority approval of the proposed project within its jurisdiction is hereby granted.

This resolution is meant to serve as the County of Buena Vista's final notice to HUD of such approval; no additional comment shall be forthcoming from the County of Buena Vista.

The foregoing resolution was adopted unanimously by the Board of Supervisors on this date.

The Auditor advised the Board of the resignation of one staffmember and requested approval to hire a full-time replacement. She also requested approval to engage the services of another person for a one-month period of time due to the school election 9/8 and the length of time which will be required to advertise, interview and select a full-time employee, since the development of revised hiring policies and procedures required under ADA has not been completed. Four members approved, with one dissenting.

Supervisors Burnside and Gustafson left the meeting to attend a meeting with Lyle Fleshner and others on the subject of supportive employment. Vice-Chair Harjes presided over the remainder of the meeting.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve payment of a claim to employee Nancy Brady in the amount of \$438.54 for services not yet billed to her, the motel services being provided to her by Seattle Sheraton Towers whose policy does not permit direct billing the county, to direct that appropriate documentation be attached to the claim for verification as soon as possible, with the Board noting that this exception to the rule of payment of claims only for services which have been received and billed, is excepted in this case only due to the unusual circumstances. Ayes--all.

A letter received from Attorney Schiller requesting direction from the Board in Schiller's correspondence with the Army Corps of Engineers regarding DD #34 was discussed by the board with Drainage Engineer Darel Burns. Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to direct Drainage Attorney Greg Schiller to respond to the Army Corps of Engineers suggesting a minimum amount of policing up of the area and removal of foreign material but allowing the rip-rap to remain, asking what limits the Corps will place on future maintenance activities in other areas of DD #34 and other

open ditch drains, and further, upon receiving confirmation from the Army Corps on the first two points, that Schiller assist in the development of a plan for future maintenance work procedures. Ayes--all. Vice-Chair Harjes will sign a letter notifying Schiller of the Board's direction.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve the following reports: July Clerk's fees, 7/14 & 7/21 Conservation. Ayes--all. 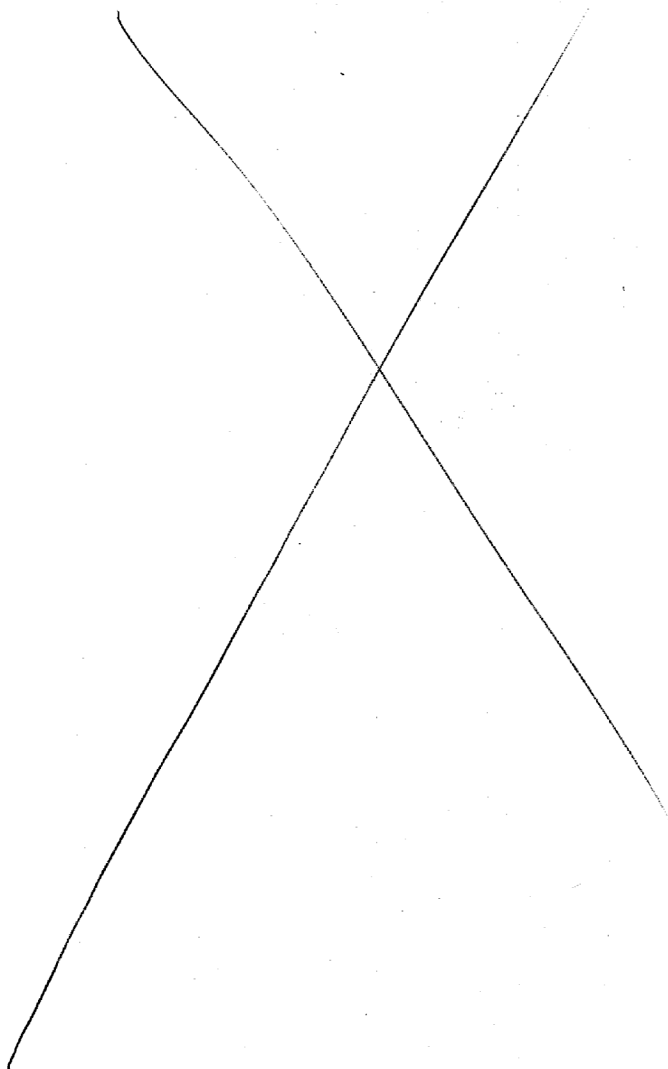


BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-SIXTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (36) AUGUST 20, 1992


The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Thursday, August 20, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Vail.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed secondary road items and a number of projects including underground fuel storage tanks, liquid calcium chloride for treatment of icy roads, right-of-way for a culvert, development of the Luedke building site and improvements to the existing building, equipment purchases for calendar 1992, People's Natural Gas project, the C-49 east and C-49 west projects, seeding waterways at the South Hayes pit and at Sturchler bridge, and "Do Not Spray" signs and permits. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING THIRTY-SEVENTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (37) AUGUST 25, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, August 25, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent Vail for family reasons.

Minutes of the August 11 meeting were read and approved.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve the following late filings: for '91 Homestead-#9796.00, for '92 Homestead-#9796.00, 2132.10, 835.00, 10321.50, 6502.00, and 4006.00. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to change the status of the General Relief Services Officer from part-time to full-time effective August 31, 1992, with no change in pay, and with evaluation in 6 months. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to make the following appointments to the MH/MR/DD/BI Planning Council: Bob Reis-client/family representative and Jim Simpson-provider representative; and further, to appoint Gustafson, Vail and Burnside as alternates for the Supervisor representatives. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan presented a petition to vacate a road. Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to set the date and time of public hearing regarding the petition to vacate a road in Section 30, Providence Township, as Tuesday, September 22 at 2:00 p.m. Ayes--all.

The Board set the date to accept fuel quotes as September 22 at 1:15 p.m. in the Boardroom.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to authorize stop sign placements at the following locations: at the intersection on the NW corner of Section 33-91-37 to stop the northbound traffic, and at the NW corner of Section 34-91-37 to stop northbound traffic. The foregoing will complete the designation of stop signs on all roads entering or crossing route C-49 from M-36 to U.S. 71 thus making this 2.5 miles of C-49 a through road. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the underground construction application from Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative for burying a line in the east road ditch east of Section 5, Fairfield Township, and East of Sections 29 & 32 in Poland Township, and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes--all.

Treasurer Sally Grunig discussed her inquiry of Attorney Henry Hardt regarding delinquent property taxes. Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to adopt, and to authorize the Chairman to sign, the revised Buena Vista County Investment policy, to become effective this date. Ayes--all.

Deputy Auditor Jean Eckerman reported that she had not received information from one company currently providing a cancer insurance policy to employees. Action on PPS's request was tabled until the information is complete.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the Countywide Cost Allocation Plan certification for FY'91 prepared by David M. Griffiths and Associates. Ayes--all.

Nurse Karole Graen reviewed Board of Health minutes. She has also reviewed with the custodians the safety precautions to be taken to avoid risk from bloodborne pathogens.

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Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve continued services at Buena Vista Work Activity Center for 1 client (D.H. 8-25-92), and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes--all. GRSO Joleen Brady reported that Polk County is requesting reimbursement of general relief funds provided to former Buena Vista County residents. She will deny the request.

Brady reported on a new program for certifying Veteran's Affairs Commissioners.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to direct the Auditor to transfer \$28.08 from the FEMA fund (075) to the General Basic fund (001), as reimbursement of administrative costs for the FEMA shelter program. Ayes--all.

At 1:30 p.m. the Board recessed to move the meeting to the Public Meeting Room in order to accommodate a larger group. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the County Attorney's current status as a part-time County Attorney, and the insufficient access that some department heads have to the Attorney. Prior to the meeting, Attorney Corwin Ritchie had requested that Department Heads be present. Attending the meeting were: Ass't County Attorney, Assessor, Sheriff, Treasurer, Nurse, Custodian and Auditor, 3 media persons, and Attorney John Duffy. Mr. Ritchie discussed some of the inaccuracies in a recent newspaper article, and asked what the individual concerns were of the various departments. He explained that even if his status were changed to full-time, the case load is still too large, and department heads would not likely have any better access then they do currently. Ritchie then made a request for additional help due to the caseload which has increased significantly faster in Buena Vista County than the statewide average. It was mentioned that there isn't sufficient space in the Courthouse to accommodate an attorney and secretary. Duffy spoke in support of Ritchie's request for additional help, and stated that Ritchie was doing a good job. The Sheriff said that he did not have any problem with the current arrangement. The Ass't Co. Attorney stated that finding a fulltime attorney with sufficient experience would be difficult and the county would probably not be as well served. No action was taken at this time. The Chairman thanked all persons present for their participation in the discussion, and reconvened the meeting back in the Boardroom.

DHS Area Administrator Lyle Fleshner spoke briefly with the Board about the MH/MR/DD/BI Planning Council. Supervisor Harjes will serve as Vice-Chair, with Dale Schnirring, Sac County Supervisor, as Chairman until an organizational meeting is held and officers are elected.

Supervisor Gustafson left the meeting for family matters.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to approve the temporary employment of Jodie Schumacher for 1 month in the County Auditor's office retroactive to August 17 at \$5.20 per hour. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to approve the following reports: July Medicaid MR/DD Case Management, Recorder's fees, Clerk's fees, August Board of Health minutes. Ayes--all. 

SEPTEMBER 8, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, September 8, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Harjes, due to illness.

SCS District Conservationist Jeff Kestel, and M & M RC&D Director Noel Wellborn, discussed the historical development of RC&D's and potential activities for the Iowa Lakes RC&D. An application will be submitted for Iowa Lakes RC&D by Buena Vista, Clay, Dickinson, Emmet and Palo Alto Counties. The federal government provides a coordinator and secretary for those RC&D's which are approved. Wellborn suggested that Iowa Lakes apply now for 501 C 3 tax exempt status.

Engineer Don Linnan presented prices from Hallett for production of a stockpile from the railroad pit. The consensus of the Board was to proceed.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the Rohlin Construction Company A.C.base project L-BV-G-6-92. Ayes---all.

As natural gas is an unacceptable choice for the courthouse generator because it is an interruptible source of fuel, approval was given to proceed with a fuel storage tank.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve placement of stop signs to create 4-way stops at the following intersections: at the southeast corner of Section 20-91-37 and at the southeast corner of Section 21-91-37 Washington Township. Ayes--all.

In response to a letter from the Army Corps of Engineers, Drainage Engineer Darel Burns recommended hiring Kooiker Inc. or Secondary Road to remove objectionable material from DD#34. The Board approved employing Kooiker since Secondary Roads does not have the appropriate equipment for the project. Kooiker will try to complete the project by November 1.

Burns also requested and received approval for computer hardware and software upgrade for the Engineer's office primarily to keep the CAD system compatible with outside information sources.

Treasurer Sally Grunig reported that the state legislature has capped the amount of franchise revenue returned by the state to local governments from local banks, and recommended contacting our legislators on the subject. Anything over the cap which is paid in by the local banks will be kept by the state.

Grunig also requested part-time help for the Treasurer's tax department for the last 2 weeks of the September tax collection period.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to abate the current and delinquent taxes and penalties, and to cancel tax sale certificate #1739 on mobile home VIN# 11-W003827 as recommended by the Treasurer, the mobile home is uninhabitable. Ayes--all.

HM/HHA Supervisor Mary Waggoner noted that 9 aides will be honored on September 15, HM/HHA Recognition Day.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to provide an employee list to Capitol American, along with a letter to be used by the Capitol American agent advising employees that the Board is considering consolidating the payroll deductions for cancer supplement insurance into a single vendor. Ayes--all. The effect of this resolution is to deny the request for PPS to offer their product by payroll deduction.

Custodian Rollie Sievers will check pricing on vertical blinds for the Judge's chambers and will change the ventilation on the courthouse generator. He will proceed with ordering the installation of a leveling valve for the elevator, and request quotes for the fire alarm system revisions for inclusion in the FY'94 budget.

Supervisor Vail left the meeting to attend a funeral.

Area DHS Administrator Lyle Fleshner informed the board that the FY'91 Title XIX case management rate has been established as \$140.64 for Buena Vista County. GRSO Joleen Brady will investigate to see if a reimbursement is due the county from NW IA MHC. Fleshner and Brady will review county day care guidelines and write revisions if needed.

GRSO Joleen Brady reviewed several general relief applications and mental health accounts.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the EMS grant application for training funds from the State of Iowa in the amount of \$6,605.00 for FY'93. Ayes--all.





The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Friday, September 15, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

With Engineer Don Linnan and Shop Foreman Brad Raveling in attendance, Rod Henning, Ziegler-Caterpillar representative, discussed his company's used motorgrader lease/purchase program, including the options which are currently installed on the machines and are different from those on the most recent grader purchase. Delivery in late FY'93 would offer the option for payment in FY'93, FY'94, or split between the 2 years. After discussion, motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to purchase a 140G Caterpillar motorgrader (including snow equipment but without plow), with extended warranty, with the option to pay in either FY'93, FY'94 or split between both, and with a trade-in of a 1968 12F Cat. grader, for a total price of \$111,600.00. Ayes--3, Nays--1. Motion carried. The engineer noted that both Pocahontas and Clay Counties were asked, and both declined, to share the purchase of the grader.

NW IA Mental Health Center Director Jim Simpson explained a recent decision of the MHC Board. The Center will not turn any client away due to legal settlement in an outside county because of the results of 2 court cases - in Dubuque and Polk Counties. The court said that legal settlement is valid in only those cases where persons are inpatients in state institutions, not outpatients at other facilities. Member counties will continue to decide individually whether or not to bill clients for services received, with assistance in the determination being provided by the Mental Health Center.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to employ Leigh Madsen as a full-time clerk in the Auditor's office effective September 21, at 40% of the Auditor's salary, to be evaluated after 6 months. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve, and to authorize the custodian to sign the quote for replacement of the leveling valve in the Courthouse elevator. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the following late filings: for 1991 & 1992 Homestead and Military on parcel #4366.00, as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Harjes reported on his meetings last week at NW IA YES Center.



SEPTEMBER 22, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, September 22, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the transfer of \$15,000 from the E911 Surcharge Fund (079) to the E911 Long Term Debt Fund (042). Ayes--all.

County Attorney Corwin Ritchie discussed the increasing workload for his department over the last several years and requested support for the addition of a 2nd part-time assistant county attorney to assist with the criminal workload, the request including financial support of \$30-\$35,000 for a 12-month period. Ritchie's proposal would provide access to another attorney for department head requests. Ritchie would like to begin the program November 1, and requests \$23,300 for the remainder of the current fiscal year. Gustafson asked if, instead of another assistant, a number of local attorneys with different areas of expertise could be employed on an as needed basis at an hourly rate. Ritchie responded that at the rate of \$50 per hour, the cost would quickly exceed his estimate for another part-time assistant. The part-time option would deliver many more hours of service to the county. Due to the next scheduled appointment, the board agreed to pick-up the discussion at 1:00 p.m. today.

Spectra Health Care Administrator Sue Morrow was asked what the ridership has been on the "After Hours" transportation project. She will provide a report to the Board. Morrow encouraged the board to consider appointing a local Medical Decision-Making Board. This board would be asked to make decisions on the medical care to be administered to persons not able to make their own decisions, and who don't have any relatives able to make the decision for them. This board would not be asked to decide on continuation of life support treatment. Morrow related a recent situation with one of Spectra's residents where a local family member was not willing to provide this input, and no other person was available. The Board will give consideration to appointing such a board.

Treasurer Sally Grunig suggested an amendment to the county's depository resolution. Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to note a name change as follows: First Trust & Savings Bank, Alta, to Heritage Bank, N.A.- Alta branch, and to approve the Heritage Bank as an official depository in the amount of \$500,000. Ayes--all.

Grunig discussed a Department of Revenue proposal to change the formula for distribution of bank franchise fees. Currently, the money is returned to the county where it originates. The proposal would re-distribute the money based on population. Buena Vista would suffer a significant loss of revenue under this proposal.

RESOLUTION 1992-114

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to adopt the following resolution: "BE IT RESOLVED, that Buena Vista County is opposed to any change in the bank franchise tax allocation for reasons as follows:

that, the present method of distribution is most fair and equitable;

that, funds deposited by residents of Buena Vista County in banks located in this county, which are taxed according to bank franchise law, should have the tax on their deposits allocated to local governments in Buena Vista County as prescribed under the current formula in Iowa Code Section 422.65;

that, we also strongly object to the cap placed on franchise tax allocations to be returned to counties and cities according to HF 2486 approved by the 1992 legislature, as this change will create a significant loss to county revenues without the additional loss caused by changing the method of allocation.

The vote on this resolution was: Ayes--all.

Gary Zeutenhorst, NW IA Mental Health Center Case Management Supervisor, and GRSO Joleen Brady, discussed the provision of case management services for MR/DD populations by NW IA MHC. DHS currently provides these services to the county, with a higher unit cost than MHC would charge.

DHS Case Management Supervisor Pat Braesch reported to the board the terms of the agreement under which DHS provides services. DHS has served the MR/DD populations with case management services since 1989, with an average of 9-13 clients per year. In the event that an audit of the unit cost computation finds additional due from the county, DHS will be responsible for the difference, not the county. No action was taken on the provider of case management for MR/DD clients for FY'94.

DHS Area Administrator Lyle Fleshner requested information on procedure for administering county day care funding. The board agreed that clients who receive a notice of decision that they are over DHS guidelines, will be referred to the GRSO who will determine eligibility based on county guidelines.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve funding to Iowa Central Industries for supervised apartment living services for 1 person (T.M.9-22-92) for the period ending with the close of the 1992-93 school year. Ayes--all.

The Board took up the discussion of the county attorney's request for additional personnel. Rehnstrom indicated that he would like input from the public before making this type of change. The board decided to make their decision at the next regular board meeting.

1:15 -- The time having arrived for opening fuel quotes received from Larson Oil, Agland, Newell Elevator, and Farm Service, Engineer Darel Burns read the bids. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to accept the low quote of Farm Service for the following fuels: Diesel #1, Diesel #2, and ethanol cardtrol. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve the following late filings for homestead credit and military exemption on the following parcels: for 1991 homestead -#6168.00, for 1992 homestead -3639.00, 4928.00, for 1992 military - #6579.00, as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

2:00 p.m. -- The time having arrived for the public hearing on the proposed Juniata road vacation petition filed by Norman Beckman, the Chairman opened the hearing in the 2nd Floor Public Meeting Room with 5 interested persons present. Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reported that all landowners affected by the vacation had signed the original petition, and additionally, each had received a letter detailing how the changes would effect them and any future implications of the vacation. Dick Anderson, representing Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative, informed the board that vacating the road will deny the REC access to their aerial lines. If vacated, Iowa Lakes would review their liability for the overhead lines with the farmer farming right up to the pole. If the REC determined that additional liability existed, they would need to bury the cable at an approximate cost of \$3,000. Burns suggested that if the Board wanted the engineer's input, the hearing could be continued to Sept. 29. Motion by Harjes, second by Rehnstrom, to continue the hearing to 9:00 a.m. on September 29. Ayes--all. All interested parties will be notified.

Due to occasional necessary absences from her office to attend meetings away from the courthouse, GRSO Joleen Brady requested that another person be authorized to sign general relief vouchers in emergency situations. The board approved Strawn and Nelda Kirkholm in the auditor's office to sign general relief vouchers.

Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve the following reports: Annual Report-Conservation, August DHS Medicaid case management, September Conservation. Ayes--all. The following reports were also reviewed: Revised Essential Job Functions for law enforcement and jail personnel, August NWIPDC minutes, September 11th & 18th NW IA YES Center minutes, July Hwy 20 minutes.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING

FORTY-SECOND MEETING, 1992 SESSION (42)

SEPTEMBER 29, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, September 29, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the 2nd Floor Public Meeting Room with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Supervisors Harjes was absent to attend an interjurisdictional legislative conference with the Iowa D.O.T. in Des Moines.

9:00 a.m.--Four interested persons were present for the continuation of the September 22 Public Hearing on the road vacation in Providence Township (formerly Juniata) pursuant to a petition filed by Norman Beckman. Mark Galbraith, for Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative, restated that the REC is concerned about the vacation if farming is done right up to the distribution line poles, and if access is needed for repairs. He noted a \$3,000 cost for burying the cable. Engineer Don Linnan suggested an easement from S&S Farms Inc. to Iowa Lakes with provision for crop damage should access be needed. The Board discussed whether to proceed with the vacation subject to reaching agreeable terms on the easement, or continuing the hearing to a future date. The board moved the meeting to the Boardroom and suspended discussion until Galbraith could inquire about an easement with his supervisor.

Engineer Don Linnan discussed a letter of concern from Bill Lanphere regarding a field drive located quite near the Storm Lake airport access. The engineer stated that the county does not have authority to control access to a landowner's property, and, the owner is entitled to access to his property. Linnan will contact Lanphere on the matter, and also encourage him to meet with the board regarding the Hwy 71 bypass signing issues mentioned in Lanphere's second letter.

Because county vehicles must use ethanol beginning January 1, 1993, stickers have been ordered for all vehicles.

Several sites where trees create a sight distance problem or snow problem were discussed.

Mark Galbraith, REC, reported that he had contacted his supervisor regarding the easement. Since there was not simple agreement on the terms of the easement, the board will consult the County Attorney before proceeding with the vacation of the road. Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to continue the public hearing to October 20 at 1:00 p.m. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a contract with Hallett Materials stockpile gravel at the Railroad Pit, the project to be completed during the winter, with further agreement that payment could be deferred until July or October of 1993. Ayes--all.

Linnan reported that Buena Vista County will soon likely receive a request to reduce the number of roads in the county eligible for federal aid.

The board generally discussed changing the snow and ice policy including sanding, salting, and treating with liquid calcium chloride, the hours of work during and following storms, snow routes, etc. and the current Ordinance #4.2. The board will review the ordinance and draft their individual, specific revisions by October 20 when another date will be set to consider the revision proposals.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the contract for gravel hauling from the Hallett (railroad) pit with Gary A. Reese Trucking, Albert City. Ayes--all.

By consensus the Board agreed to advance the schedule for the budget process by one month, with December 15 being the deadline for returning departmental budgets to the auditor, and to request additional budget detail for purchases over \$500. The board also approved the temporary employment of Jodie Weber in the Auditor's office for half days through November 3, 1992.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, October 6, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the following late filing(s) for homestead credit and military exemption: for 1991 homestead - 6064.00, 5854.00, 3974.00, 783.00, 9992.00, 7116.00, 9348.50, 3942.00, 2132.50, 4402.00, 4902.00, 9789.00, for 1992 homestead - 6064.00, 5854.00, 3974.00, 753.00, 9992.00, 7116.00, 9348.50, 3942.00, 2132.50, 4402.00, 4902.00, 5542.00, 10288.00, 2132.22, 4522.00, 5963.06, 6169.00, 6515.50, 4884.00, 8936.10, 9581.50, 9789.00, for 1991 military - 6064.00, for 1992 military - 6064.00, 4522.00, 6515.50, 4884.00, as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to accept the resignation of Marvin Hirsch, Newell, and to appoint Michael Lenz, Storm Lake, to the Buena Vista County Zoning Commission, representing Newell and Providence Townships. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to deny the tax refund request submitted by Hubert McClary pursuant to Section 445.60 of the Iowa Code which does not permit a refund of the taxes paid on the property in question, and to direct the auditor to send notice of the Board's decision and a copy of the County Attorney's Opinion. Ayes--all.

The Chairman opened the discussion on the County Attorney's request for a second assistant, which had been postponed to permit input from the public. After preliminary discussion, motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve the request of the County Attorney to hire a second assistant county attorney effective 11/1/92 with the agreement to amend the County Attorney's budget up to a proration of \$32,500 per year according to the 1st day of employment for the attorney, and with the county attorney to provide an itemized budget for the expenditure of the new funds. Rehnstrom then stated that the county has had no change in the staffing of the county attorney's department for 60 years, but in the same time, the sheriff's department increased from 1 deputy to 7. Perhaps a 2nd assistant is justified. Harjes disclosed the results of his informal survey of attorneys in the county, with the majority indicating that they felt the county attorney was very busy. Gustafson was concerned about approving a dollar increase in the budget without having documentation of how the money will be spent. Harjes agreed that itemization is required for all other budgets, and would be important to the final approval of the request. The motion was called with the following results: Ayes-1, nays-3. The motion was declared defeated.

It was noted that there is little likelihood that the workload of the County Attorney will be decreasing in the foreseeable future, and therefore the program was not being considered on a short-term basis. Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to authorize the County Attorney to search for a 2nd Assistant County Attorney, with final approval of budget to be given after the selection of the attorney is made. Ayes--all. Nays--none. Motion carried.

Patrice Peterson, Buena Vista County Conservation Naturalist, introduced herself to the board and reported on her activities since beginning her job. She asked for assistance in locating a room for presentation of Conservation programs.

Nola Jensen, City Attorney for Albert City, presented a proposal to correct a problem concerning a building on the right-of-way easement on a road adjacent to Albert City. She requested assistance from the Board in removing the encumbrances on the easement. The Board agreed to help in correcting the problem.

The Chairman discussed the changes that will need to be made to the budget to reflect the new 'in-home detention' program in the Sheriff's department. With the program having just been developed, no provisions were made when the current budget was adopted to allow for revenue which will be received from participants, and for expenditures to the vendor for 'in-home detention' devices. There will be no cost to the taxpayer, as the prisoners cost will cover the expenses paid to the vendor.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to direct the Auditor to deposit the proceeds of the county surplus inventory auction \$7,666.00 held October 3, into the General Basic fund, and to authorize the transfer of \$283.50 to the Conservation Land Acquisition Trust Fund-068 (this amount attributable to items contributed by Conservation), and \$6,888.00 to the Secondary Road Fund-020, (for items from the Engineer's and Secondary Road departments). Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the minutes of the 9/22 and 9/29 meetings as printed. Ayes--all.

The Chairman noted that a good worker's compensation loss report has resulted in a dividend being paid to the county in the amount of \$2,162.57.

GRSO Joleen Brady distributed proposed day-care guidelines for county funds. The board will review and take action on 10/20. The Board denied a general relief application for assistance with a hospital bill for 1 person.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to enter into an agreement with NW IA MHC to provide case management services for the MR/DD/BI populations for FY'94 at a unit cost of \$115.00 per client per month. Ayes--all.

Nurse Karole Graen reviewed September Board of Health minutes. Graen will contact Dr. Ronald Eckoff for additional information on a Substitute Medical Decision-Making Board. The board requested input from the Board of Health in suggesting names for appointment to such a board.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following reports: August Medicaid Case Management, September budget reports, Clerk's & Small Claims fees, Sheriff's fees, 1st Qtr FY'92 Clerk's fees, Board of Health minutes. Ayes--all. Other reports reviewed: September NWIPDC minutes.

DHS Case Managers Marcia Stoeber and Julia Gillespie reported on their clients and requested consideration of retaining their services for approximately 2 clients when Buena Vista County changes providers from DHS to NW IA MHC for MR/DD/BI clients.

Vocational Rehabilitation Specialist Renee Barnes requested space in the courthouse for her client consultations. The Board approved Wednesday and Friday each week in the office adjacent to the GRSO which is used two Thursdays each month by the Veterans Service Officer.

Ken Hayes, Director of Lutheran Family Services, described a proposal for a 6 month trial in LFS facilities of supervised apartment services to 3-4 persons with mental illness. Also present were Jim Simpson, Jerry Fritsch and Mary Harmon, NW IA MHC; Sue Morrow, Spectra Learning Center Administrator; BV County Judicial Hospital Referee Hugh Perry; MH Advocate Char Anderson; and GRSO Joleen Brady. The service cost for the program would be the same as for the MR supervised apartment services. Those present encouraged the Board's favorable consideration of the program which would provide the final link in the continuum of MH services for Buena Vista County residents, a transition being needed from the Learning Center to independent living to assure success. The Board approved the proposal to the extent that LFS can proceed to train staff and be prepared to accept referrals. Applicants with legal settlement in Buena Vista County would be approved for funding by the Board on an individual basis.

Jerry Fritsch reported on the Managed Care project of NW IA MHC for BV County. By utilizing the most appropriate services and providers for the clients, the cost to the county for the 1st Qtr of FY'93 for the 5 persons served was \$150.00. The Board agreed that state cases (persons whose legal settlement is not found to be in any of the 99 Iowa counties) will not be paid by Buena Vista County.

GRSO Brady reported that Anita Hallquist will take her place in February while she is on leave of absence.

Brady reviewed the status of her microfilming project. With her increased responsibilities for other services, there may be a need to reassign microfilming, perhaps to another department. Recorder O'Bannon confirmed the need to bring microfilming up to date for the long-term protection of the county's records. The Board discussed purchasing additional new or used equipment, and employing another person for the duty. Further discussion was tabled until November 3, 1992.



BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING
FORTY-FIFTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (45)
NOVEMBER 3, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, November 3, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Harjes, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes to approve the minutes of the October 20 and 27 meetings as printed. Ayes--all.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Harjes, to approve the following late filings for homestead credit and military exemption on the following parcels: for 1991 homestead - #3667.00, for 1992 homestead - #3667.00, 6557.00, 603.00, 5729.60, all as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--all.

Nurse Karole Graen reviewed October Board of Health minutes.

Pursuant to the Board's resolution of October 20, Engineer Don Linnan reported receiving the signed agreement between S & S Farms and Iowa Lakes Electric. The Secondary Road Dept. will proceed to remove the Juniata road.

Linnan presented the Weed Department's list of encroachment locations for the Board's review.

The Board approved sending a removal notice to property owners who have installed gates in the road ditch (county right-of-way) to county-owned bridges. Owners will be given 30 days to remove the gates. There are currently 7 sites identified.

The consensus of the board was to include mailbox turnouts in the road construction contracts to be let next year. Instead of borrowing ahead on farm-to-market funds, the board agreed to delay the M-27 project so that adequate funds are available without borrowing for the bridge on the C-65 project.

A request for re-zoning and a special use permit for the property known as the Anderson junkyard has been received from John Foster who has an option on the property. Due to pending action on a junkyard ordinance, the board will delay action until the progress on the ordinance is determined.

Linnan will prepare a response to the DOT's request to close a number of railroad crossings in the county, most of which are part of postal and/or schoolbus routes.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application of Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative to replace the buried electrical line in the south road ditch on the north side of Section 30-91-37, Washington Township, the cable to be 42" deep in the edge of the backslope. Ayes--all.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Harjes, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application of U.S. West Communications to bury a cable 36" deep and near the bottom of the backslope starting 454 feet East of the East R.O.W. line of M-50 near the NW corner of Section 3-90-36, then North across the East-West gravel road, then West to the East backslope of M-50 then 4 miles North to the North backslope of the East-West road near the SW corner of Section 10-91-36 thence East along the toe of the North backslope to 31' East of the Raccoon River Bridge then South across the road to the South R.O.W. line. Ayes--all.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the quit claim deed to the City of Albert City, Iowa for all rights, easements, title and interest in all land used as street and highway right of way situated in Buena Vista County, Iowa, to-wit: That portion of former County Secondary Road System located in Section Fourteen (14) of Fairfield Township, Buena Vista County, Iowa located approximately Thirteen Hundred Feet (1,300') North of the South Line of said Section Fourteen (14), beginning on the East Side of the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of said Section Fourteen (14) and running West to the Depot Grounds of the former Chicago, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company, and established as Sixty-Six feet in width on November 15, 1900. Said road being an extension of Main Street as platted in the Town of Albert City, Iowa. Said street being further evidenced on the plat of Auditor's Sub-Division of the E 1/2, SW 1/4 of Section 14, T92N of R35W of the 5th Principal Meridian in Buena Vista County, Iowa, dated April 15, 1904. Ayes--all.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign maintenance agreements with the city of Rembrandt for the 92-93 snow season. Ayes--all.

DHS Area Administrator Lyle Fleshner submitted a response in the Board's behalf, to the findings of the administrative expense reimbursement audit. He asked about a claim submitted by Mercy Shelter Care for 1 juvenile. The consensus of the board was not to pay the expense, (which is not a mandatory expense for the county).

Treasurer Sally Grunig presented her resignation as County Treasurer effective December 4, 1992 to County Auditor Karen Strawn, and to the Board of Supervisors. Boardmembers wished her well and expressed their appreciation for the accomplishments of her department, as well as her service to the County Treasurers' Association and the residents of Iowa with her work on the tax code.

Supervisor Rehnstrom left the meeting due to family illness.

GRSO Joleen Brady presented a request for assistance with wisdom teeth extraction for one child from the Buckingham Trust Fund. The Board approved paying 50% of the bill if the parents will pay the other 50%. General relief payment for medication for one person was approved for 1 month. 1:30 p.m. --At the time set for a general relief appeal, the appellant did not appear, and the board denied the appeal.

Motion by Harjes, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign the case management agreement with NW IA MHC for provision of services to MR/DD/BI populations for FY'94. Ayes--all.

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Koch Brothers, Des Moines 87-482

County Attorney Corwin Ritchie introduced Attorney Phil Havens to the Board, his selection for the 2nd Assistant County Attorney. Ritchie highlighted the proposed division of caseload: Ritchie-felony and misdemeanors, civil; Havens-partial felony & misdemeanors, partial magistrate court, partial civil; Brown-juvenile court, hospitalization, partial magistrate court. Ritchie also presented a budget proposal for the remainder of FY'93 based on an annual figure of \$31,917.00. Supervisor Gustafson expressed concern over implementing a new program so soon after its proposal, and before the additional expenditure could be budgeted for rather than amending the current budget. Ritchie indicated that the need was immediate, particularly with the probability that recent cases would come to trial requiring substantial preparation. Harjes asked if Brown was agreeable to the salary differential proposed for Havens, with Ritchie assuring that Brown had no objections. Motion by Harjes, second by Vail, to accept the County Attorney's proposal as written with the division of responsibility as noted above, an annualized salary for Havens of \$25,500.00, \$3,417.00 for FICA & IPERS and with an annual \$1,500 for support staff for each Brown and Havens for a total annualized amount of \$31,917.00. The roll call vote was: Gustafson-nay, Harjes-aye, Vail-aye, Burnside-aye. Motion carried. Motion by Vail, second by Harjes, to approve the employment of Phil Havens as an Assistant County Attorney at an annualized salary of \$25,500.00. The roll call vote was: Gustafson-nay, Harjes-aye, Vail-aye, Burnside-aye. Motion carried.

Supervisor Harjes left the meeting.

Recorder Shari O'Bannon and GRSO Joleen Brady discussed microfilming county records. Purchase of additional equipment was dismissed from further current discussion. Options on personnel and supervision were discussed. Brady will prepare an estimate of the time required and O'Bannon will estimate the number of books to be filmed. The Board will address the subject again November 9.







BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING

FIFTIETH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (50)

DECEMBER 1, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, December 1, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Harjes.

Services description, sample facility lease, sample 28E agreement, and a grant application regarding the proposed establishment of Northwest Iowa Residential Treatment Center for persons with a primary diagnosis of chemical dependence & or non-chronic mentally illness were discussed. The consortium of counties proposing the RTC requested a commitment from counties for participation and support of the facility. The board tabled action until after an additional meeting on December 7.

Auditor's Clerk Nelda Kirkholm reviewed the FY'92 Juvenile Justice reimbursement report and advised the board that there may be some transporting of juveniles by the Sheriff's deputy instead of the DHS social worker, therefore at county cost instead of the state. The board will review the circumstances.

Engineer Don Linnan reported that he had discussed snow policies with school superintendents. Clay County sent a notice that the number of tillable acres at the Whitney Pit were reduced by 2.7 acres, with an appropriate adjustment in the cash rent. Under changes in the rules for treatment of medical situations, new safety kits are being developed for use by secondary road employees, with the new kits to be approved by the Board of Health. Reporting that Buena Vista County does not issue such certificates, Linnan noted that he had received a request for a certificate of occupancy for a residence in the rural area. The ISAC presentation on the new Ethics bill identified the need to educate all county employees on the points of the law. The Board agreed that each employee should receive a copy of the summary prepared by ISAC.

The secondary road shop is accumulating used oil and oil filters which require special handling. Past and current practice permits employees to use the facility during non-work time to change oil and filters. Linnan asked whether the practice should continue to be permitted in light of the problem with disposal of the waste not generated by county activity, and how should the county's waste oil and filters be handled. Additional research will be done on current requirements for disposal before addressing the issue. Changes in federal employment law have been posted. Recent changes in state law will also need to be posted.

By consensus, the Board approved of Supervisor-elect Jack Voss riding in a county-owned vehicle to the 12/8/92 conference in Des Moines on -The Iowa Budget...Prospects for the Future.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

Deb Westvold, ISAC Case Management, and GRISO Joleen Brady, met to discuss the program, and to invite the county to participate in the ISAC Case Management program. ISAC provides technical assistance and training services for counties which have been approved as providers for case management. The consensus of the board was to agree to participation, but to reserve action until Westvold sends a sample 28E agreement for their consideration.

Nurse Karole Graen reviewed November Board of Health minutes. The amount of data which has been entered into the Health Dept's computer occupies 80-85% of the capacity causing the programs to run so slowly that valuable time is being lost waiting for processing. Graen proposed 2 options: a short term memory purchase for approximately \$2,000, and a 8-10 year solution at a substantially higher cost. The consensus of the board was to approve the first option (from the Health Board budget) due to the possibility of substantial computer technology changes in the 8-10 year period.

GRISO Brady and Mental Health Advocate Charlene Anderson discussed the advocacy program. Anderson stated that to date there have been 21 mental health involuntary commitments since 1/1/92. Four other cases resulted in no commitment. Anderson voiced her concern over the lack of required patient status reporting by NW IA MHC doctors. She has made repeated requests, and has also made her request through the court system. Supervisors Gustafson and Vail will contact the Executive Director about the matter.

Representatives from the Soil Conservation Service - Keith Arends, Dwight Young and Jeff Kestel - reported on their education program. Now that the program has been running successfully for a couple years, they feel that their annual budget appropriation request can be reduced from \$3,000 to \$2,500 since some of the initial program costs are no longer recurring costs. The Board thanked them for their report.

Marilyn Munson and Kim Sievers, representing the Newell Historical Society, gave a slide presentation highlighting the progress on their Allee Mansion project. In an effort to reach their goal of completion in time for Newell's 125th anniversary, they are stepping up their restoration schedule and requesting \$5,000 in the FY'94 budget, up from \$1,000. No action was taken at this time. Munson and Sievers also requested assistance with a bill from secondary for work on the ditch, entrance and driveway at the site. The bill came in at \$2,375.37, which was considerably higher than a guesstimate of \$500, due to this summer's particular weather conditions. No action will be taken until the board consults with the engineer.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the minutes of the 11/17 and 11/24 minutes as read. Gustafson-aye, Rehnstrom-aye, Vail-aye, Burnside-aye. Motion carried.

At the request of the media, the board discussed whether or not to make the county treasurer applicants' names public. On the advice of the County Attorney, names will be released unless the applicant requested confidentiality. The applicants are: Kathy Bach, Nyles (Bud) Myers, Dale Martin, and Lorna Currie. (A fifth application was determined to be for a position in the treasurer's office.) After discussion, the board moved up the interview schedule from 12/8 to 12/3 if a full board could be present to participate in the interviews and decision, as not all 5 would be available on any day in December after 12/4.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Vail, to approve the family farm credit applications as recommended by the Assessor with the following exceptions due to non-compliance with the Code for the identical ownership requirement: parcel #'s 8524.00, 8524.10, 8542.00, 9542.10, 8542.20, 2391.00, 11835.50. Ayes--all. The Auditor was directed to notify the owners (with explanation) whose applications were denied.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a letter of support for the Gingerbread House community development block grant application. Ayes--all.

The Chairman appointed a committee, Gustafson and Burnside, to count the cash for the Treasurer's financial settlement with the board as required by Chapter 452.11, upon resignation of the officer.

Action to set the date of public hearing for the ag area petition filed by K-Webb, Inc. was tabled until the meeting on the 15th of December.

The consensus of the Board was to deny the request of the Alta Community School Board to split the bill for the upcoming special school election, with the Auditor to notify Superintendent Tom Narak.

In discussing the budget worksheet for capital expenditures, the board will request that departments purchase equipment items that were not budgeted only if other purchases are not made in that line item and sufficient funds available for the unbudgeted purchase. The board will also ask that requests for departmental budget amendments be made in person with the board.

By consensus the board agreed to request an independent audit of the Buena Vista County Fair Board and the Raceway Association due to the appropriation by the county to them. The chairman will send a letter requesting the audit.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the following reports: Oct. RTA night taxi ridership, Medicaid Case Mgt. (2 reports), Nov. budget reports, Conservation, Recorder's fees, Board of Health minutes, and 11/6 Mangold-Spectra lagoon. Ayes--all. The following reports were also reviewed: Nov. NWIPDC minutes, DHS Planning Council minutes, Hwy 20 West minutes, 3rd Qtr '92 Flo Crit Home Financial report, FY'93 budget for Western Iowa Tourism.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m. to Thursday, December 3 for a special session to interview applicants for the position of County Treasurer.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIFTY-SECOND MEETING, 1992 SESSION (52) DECEMBER 15, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, December 15, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Harjes and Rehnstrom.

DHS Area Administrator Lyle Fleshner reported that he had successfully responded to the DHS administrative budget audit, and the previously disallowed items have been approved. DHS may consider contracting for the cleaning services for the Annex. Transportation of juveniles by social workers vs. law enforcement was reviewed. The Chief Juvenile Corrections Officer will be sending instructions for reimbursement of transportation costs. State mental health dollars allocated for Buena Vista County residents with certain brain injury problems are not currently being utilized because no one has been identified who fit the tight criteria. Fleshner will explore using the dollars for family centered services, another approved use of the dollars.

Representatives from 7 departments discussed the trial policy of paying claims once per month. A number of problems were discussed: late charges, interest costs, 2nd notices, cut-off notices, double payments, expense of time needed for employees to check on the status of claims, long distance phone expense incurred in checking status, excessive delay of employee reimbursement of expenses and the potential issuance of 1099's for same, cash flow problems for major providers, and processing time. An estimate of the interest earned in November by delaying payment two weeks for those claims which would have otherwise been paid earlier was \$414.00. A number of variations were suggested including returning to the prior procedures. Casual surveys of other counties by 2 persons were reported with no dominant trends identified. Department heads were asked to submit a list of claim types they want to have paid every 2 weeks, and of the remaining types of claims, whether the first or second regular board meeting would be the better choice for payment. Action on the matter was tabled until December 22 so that additional information could be compiled.

10 persons for the Buena Vista County Library Association met with the Board to request an increase in tax levy from 13 cents to 16 cents per thousand dollars of rural valuation. Nola Josephson (Albert City) discussed needs due to changing information technology. Ron Ewing, Rose Peterson, and Dick Euchner spoke about current activities and needs in the Storm Lake Library. A letter from Rembrandt Librarian Carolyn Reiling was read. Esther Haahr and Marlene Hansen (Newell) and Betty Pace (Alta) each spoke to their concerns about meeting the needs of their patrons. Brenda Bachman and Casey Langley, VISTA Volunteers, were introduced to the Board. No action was taken at this time.

Treasurer Kathy Bach has received notice that Buena Vista County will receive \$65,376.15 in Iowa Trust funds from a California settlement, but no specific date for the return has been announced. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve the Treasurer's deputy appointments as follows: Joan Martin - 1st Deputy, Tax at 78% of the Treasurer's salary, and Brenda Koeppe - Motor Vehicle Deputy at 68% of the Treasurer's salary, both effective December 14, 1992, and, to authorize the Chairman to sign the Certificates of Appointment. Ayes--3. Carried. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve a raise in the surcharge for returned bad checks in the Treasurer's office from \$10 to \$15 per check. Ayes--3. Carried. In order to balance the books, and count cash by 4:30 p.m. on December 31, the board approved closing the motor vehicle window at 4:00 p.m. The Treasurer will notify the public.

Dr. Thomas Shea visited with the board about an integrated roadside vegetation management program. He explained that the Iowa D.O.T. has a Living Roadway Trust Fund available to assist

counties with the program, the funds having been raised by charging utilities which bury cabling in the road right-of-way. The first part of the project is a comprehensive roadway inventory with an estimated cost of \$4,500. The Board requested that he work with Gary Christiansen, Conservation Director.

Following Supervisor Gustafson's discussion of a December 7 meeting on a chemical dependency social de-tox unit in Cherokee, motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve and to authorize the Chairman to sign a letter of support to accompany the grant application to the state of Iowa for funding for the proposed Northwest Iowa Residential Services. Ayes--3. Carried.

Burnside reported that the County Attorney was satisfied for his purposes with an audit of the Buena Vista County Raceway Association prepared by a CPA member of the Buena Vista County Fair Board. However, the board also discussed the need for an independent audit of the Fair Board since the county annually provides funding to the organization. Every organization requesting funding needs to provide some type of financial reporting for board review. The Board will discuss the matter further with Fair Board representatives scheduled to meet with the Supervisors on December 29.

Upon review of the reason for his 'no-show' on 12/1 for his scheduled general relief appeal (D.B.), the Board agreed to hear the appeal at this time. Due to insufficient time for discussion, the decision was tabled to Wednesday.

Vicki Baxter, Vista Addiction and Recovery Center Director, and Marcia Schaller, Buena Vista County Hospital Boardmember, discussed the Vista program and its value to Buena Vista County residents. They requested consideration of funding from the county. A specific dollar request was not made. The board encouraged them to meet with the Director of Northwest Iowa ADTU to discuss cooperative efforts between the two agencies. Supervisor Gustafson will assist in setting up a meeting.

GRSO Joleen Brady, and Jerry Fritsch, NW IA MHC, discussed certain mental health patients, who do not have Buena Vista County legal settlement, and their commitment to the Spencer Hospital vs. Cherokee MHI. Managed care will work most effectively if the J.H. Referee can commit some persons to Cherokee MHI, depending upon legal settlement. Brady will draft a letter for the Board's approval and signature. Fritsch also reported that action had been taken to obtain more prompt patient status reports from doctors.

Ann Johnston and Betty Silverberg, CADA Boardmembers, discussed current activities of CADA. In FY'92, there was a 62% increase in crisis calls from Buena Vista County. Their request for funding was \$5,000, down from \$7,000 last year.

RTA Director Rose Lee presented the RTA annual report and discussed the ADA adaptations they have made to their fleet. RTA's request is the same as '93, \$5,647.00 which is used for fleet rehab & replacement.

Steve Tjaden proposed a new program for the county - applying for grants as an alternative source of revenue to meet one or more of the following goals: 1) save current expenditures, 2) purchase new equipment, 3) improve services to county residents. He is willing to work with NWIPDC, which provides a certain number of hours of grant writing to the county in its annual dues fee. Tjaden proposed an \$18,000 plus 5% commission on successful grants for the program. The board will consult with the County Attorney on contracting with the Tjaden for the services, as Tjaden is already an employee.

Supervisor Vail left the meeting.

Weed Commissioners Norm Lund and Roger Sievers visited briefly with the Board about equipment and personnel for their department.

Due to the late hour, the Chairman recessed the meeting at 4:00 p.m. until Wednesday, December 16 at 9:30 a.m. following the supervisors session with the legislators.

9:30 a.m., 12/16/92-- Engineer Don Linnan reported to the Board that the People's Natural Gas 'Fonda gas line project' was completed, and that the \$2,000/mile fee is now due and payable. Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the People's Natural Gas Fonda gas line project, and to direct the Chairman to so notify People's of this date, as the term of the bond was for one year after the completion of the project. Ayes--3. Carried. The auditor will provide a copy of the letter to the County Attorney.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to accept as satisfactorily completed as of this date, the 1992 contract with Reese's Trucking for maintenance gravel from the Hallett (railroad) Pit. Ayes--3. Carried.

Linnan noted that the Lakeside asphalt blacktop has not yet been repaired by IBP as per the agreement with them. The Board agreed that a request for information on IBP's action on the matter is in order. Burnside will ask the County Attorney to write a letter to Bob O'Brien requesting some type of action. Linnan will provide the necessary information to Ritchie.

The large number of tires dumped into county road ditches has resulted in increasing cost to the county for disposal. The board approved funding the activity (6020) in the '94 budget.

The current secondary road budget will see a loss of \$100,000 in projected road use tax revenue for the current budget year, with more expected next year. Together with the new ISTEAL legislation, Linnan foresees substantial pressure on the upcoming secondary road budget.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to deny the general relief appeal heard on December 15 due to the applicant being above Buena Vista County general relief income guidelines (D.B.12-15-92). Ayes--3. Carried.

GRSO Joleen Brady suggested a settlement on one mental health account. Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to accept \$750 as payment in full on 1 mental health account (C.R.12-16-92). Ayes--3. Carried.

Supervisor's Record No. 18

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to authorize a general relief payment in the amount of one half of a Buena Vista County Hospital bill for 1 person in the amount of \$1,111.22 (C.K.12-16-92). Ayes--3. Carried.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to authorize GRSO Brady to temporarily approve veterans' affairs claims, when V.A. Commissioners are unavailable. Ayes--3. Carried.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the minutes of the 12/1 and 12/3 meetings as printed. Ayes--3. Carried.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to set the date and time of the public hearing on the petition for an agricultural area designation filed by K-Webb, Inc. as January 4, 1993 at 1:30 p.m. in the 2nd Floor Public Meeting Room. Ayes--3. Carried.

Upon completion of the Canvass and pursuant to Chapter 50.24 of the 1991 Code of Iowa, motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to declare the results of the December 15, 1992 Special Alta School Election as follows, and to direct the Commissioner of Elections to prepare abstract and certificates of election:





BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIFTY-THIRD MEETING, 1992 SESSION (53) DECEMBER 22, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, December 22, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Vice-Chairman Harjes presiding, and with the following other members present: Gustafson, Rehnstrom, and Vail, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Burnside.

Assessor Ted Van Grootheest reviewed his proposed FY'94 budget, and reported that the Conference Board would meet on January 4th at 2:00 p.m. for their preliminary review of the Assessor's budget.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns reported that the cleanout of D.D. #20 near Newell has been completed. A public hearing will be set after the 1st of the year. Burns reviewed several bills for work done by the Secondary Road Department. The Board directed that the bills be sent to the appropriate parties.

Motion by Vail, second by Rehnstrom, to approve, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the underground construction application submitted by the Iowa D.O.T. to bury approximately 150' of electrical cable as follows: along the south right-of-way line from a power pole at Station 1527 + 35 to Station 1528 + 40, then straight north approximately 45' to a weigh scale open/closed sign. Ayes--all.

Engineer Don Linnan reported on the DOT's practice of charging utilities for burying lines and cable in right-of-way along the interstate. The fees range from \$2,500/mile for rural areas to \$4,500/mile in urban areas, with a \$7,500 minimum. The funds go into the Integrated Roadside Vegetation fund for exclusive use in roadside vegetation programs.

Linnan has received a request for a special use permit for an site near Marathon. The board agreed that a letter be sent to the applicant advising the applicant that the Board is currently working on a junkyard ordinance.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Vail, to approve a retroactive wage payment of \$695.23 to Ron Buske, secondary road employee, whose anniversary date of February 12 had been inadvertently overlooked. Ayes--all.

Linnan presented estimations of the available road use tax monies for construction due to a change in the formula and other factors, and the impact on upcoming construction budgets. He also reviewed the status of personnel, equipment, building projects, historical figures for tax askings and equipment expenditures, current equipment rental rates, comparative engineering and administration costs, and non-secondary road related tasks and duties performed by his department. The Board agreed that the first draft of the Department 20 budget be based on the current year's tax asking. Linnan will survey nearby counties regarding equipment rental rates and zoning permit rates.

Buena Vista County, Iowa

The board briefly discussed claims payment, and tabled action until January 4 for when a full board will be present.

Motion by Vail, second by Gustafson, to approve the following reports: Sept. school election bills, Nov. Recorder's fees, District Court and Small Claims fees, Ayes--all. The following reports were also reviewed: U.S.F.&G. W/C '90-91 premium audit, 12/7 NW IA Residential Treatment Center minutes, NW IA YES Center minutes, HM/HHA employee report, Peavey corn sale receipts.

Boardmembers approved adding rock to the Spectra Health Care, Inc. (CCF) driveway.





BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING

FIFTY-FOURTH MEETING, 1992 SESSION (54)
DECEMBER 29, 1992

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, December 29, 1992 at 9:00 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Burnside presiding and with the following other members present: Gustafson and Rehnstrom, and with Auditor Strawn as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Harjes and Vail.

Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to approve the minutes of the 12/15 and 12/22 minutes as printed. Ayes-3. Carried.

The second letter received from Alta Community School District Superintendent Tom Narak requesting a cost sharing of the expenses of the December 15th special election was considered. The consensus of the boardmembers present was to have the Chair respond by letter to Narak that the Board's opinion had not changed. Taxpayers from elsewhere in the county should not bear the cost of an Alta School District election. Therefore, the request is denied.

Motion by Rehnstrom, second by Gustafson, to approve the following late filings: for 1991 & 1992 Homestead-#'s 4719.00 & 5118.00; for 1991 & 1992 Military-#4719.00, all as recommended by the Assessor. Ayes--3. Carried.

The Chair appointed Rehnstrom and Burnside to count cash in the Treasurer's office at the close of business on 12/31/92.

Auditor Strawn reviewed the formula which determines the maximum amount of tax asking available for Buena Vista County for the FY'94 budget under SF 2393 (property tax freeze), and the conditions under which the additional amounts are available.

Engineer Don Linnan reported that requirements for road design standards have been relaxed. Previously, re-construction of all of C-63 would have been required before re-surfacing. Now, only a portion of the re-construction may be required for the project. With that change, and by breaking up the project into several parts, completion of the entire project might be more feasible due to reduction of cost.

Drainage Engineer Darel Burns presented his final report on DD #20. Motion by Gustafson, second by Rehnstrom, to tentatively accept the Engineer's final report, to set the date and time of public hearing as 1/18/93 at 9:00 a.m. in the 2nd Floor PMR, and to notify landowners that any claims for damages against either the contractor or the drainage district should be presented on or before the time and date of the public hearing. Ayes--3. Carried.

BV County Fair Board Secretary Wanette Movall, and members Tom Witt and Norm O'Bannon provided a slide presentation of the County Fair program and facilities. Their funding request of \$39,300 was discussed with relation to the projects planned. They requested approval from the Board of Supervisors to do some fundraising to increase their revenue. The Board agreed. The Raceway Association is negotiating with an Omaha promoter on a lease of the raceway facility. The promoter would run the racing program and be responsible for the costs of upkeep and repair. Chairman Burnside re-confirmed the Board's request for an independent audit for the Fair Board and Raceway Association, and suggested that the board would consider assistance with the cost of the audit. The Board thanked them for their presentation.

GRSO Joleen Brady discussed state mental health funding for the FY'94 budget, asking the Board's assistance on reporting the amount of revenue.

Brady requested an advance on her sick leave for maternity leave, with an additional portion to be unpaid leave. The Board will consult the County Attorney and consider her request. Former DHS Director Anita Hallquist will fill in while Brady is on leave.




Motion by Gustafson, second by Voss, to appoint Joleen Brady to the Representative Council for NW IA Mental Health Center. Ayes--all.
