BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FIRST MEETING, 2016 SESSION (1) JANUARY 4, 2016

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met for the first meeting of the 2016 session on Monday, January 4, 2016 at 8:30 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Arends presiding, and the following members present: Altena, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg, and with Auditor Susan Lloyd as clerk for the meeting.

Prior to the start of today's meeting, Supervisors Altena and Ringgenberg completed the <u>count of</u> <u>cash in the Treasurer's</u> office.

Motion by Merten, second by Altena, to approve the <u>minutes</u> of the 12/29/15 meeting as printed. Ayes—Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none. Carried.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Huseman, to adjourn the <u>**2015**</u> session. Ayes—Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none. Carried.

The first order of business for the 2016 session was election of the Chairman of the Board. Chairman Arends called for nominations for <u>Chairman of the Board of Supervisors</u>. Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to nominate Altena, as Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors for 2016. Motion by Merten, second by Ringgenberg, that nominations cease, and to cast a unanimous ballot for Altena, which resulted in the following vote: ayes—Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none. Abstention—Altena. Carried. The vote on the Chairperson was: Ayes—Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none.

The Chair called for **nominations for** <u>Vice-Chair</u>. Motion by Ringgenberg to nominate Huseman as Vice-Chair, which Huseman stated he would refuse. The motion died for a lack of a second. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to nominate Merten, to serve as Vice-Chair. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, that nominations cease, and to cast a unanimous ballot for Merten, which had the following vote: ayes—Altena, Arends, Huseman, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none. Abstention—Merten. Carried. The vote on the Vice-Chair was: Ayes—Altena, Arends, Huseman, and Ringgenberg. Nays—none. Abstentions—Merten. Carried.

Meal and Mileage Rate Reimbursements

Motion by Merten, second by Arends, to approve the following reimbursements:

<u>meal cost reimbursement</u> to employees, and to others serving on boards and in other appointive positions, shall be: meals eaten out of county during approved schools or meetings may be reimbursed at their actual cost to a maximum of \$25.00 per diem. (Reimbursements for meals, when no overnight stay is involved, will show on the employee's W-2). No reimbursement will be made for tips or alcoholic beverages. To receive reimbursement, detailed receipts must be submitted. If the per diem is exceeded due to a meal/meeting, that fact shall be noted on the reimbursement claim;

<u>mileage reimbursement rate</u> for sheriff's service fees at the current IRS rate (\$.54/mile on 1/1/16);

mileage to employees (including deputy medical examiners) at the rate of \$.04 cents under the current IRS standard mileage rate, for each mile traveled by private vehicle (not for county owned vehicles) for county business in 2016. Carried.

Insurance Coverage including Blanket Bond

Drainage Resolutions and Assessments

Motion by Arends, second by Merten, that the County Drainage Attorney is hereby directed to research drainage and other assessments due and payable on parcels of Buena Vista County property prior to putting them on the list of properties for scavenger auction; to establish 5% as the rate of interest to be paid during 2016 on all stamped warrants, and charged on Improvement Certificates and Drainage District waivers, effective this date (for Buena Vista County drainage districts only); that the beaver control policy in 2016 shall be payment of \$40 per beaver tail for beavers trapped in drainage districts as adopted January 1, 1986, and, the beaver control program shall be \$40/beaver tail for the non-drainage district areas of the county; these programs require that the claimant possess a fur-bearer's license as required by law, and with a payout limit of \$1,000 in non-drainage districts areas in each fiscal year. Carried.

Gary Lalone, Executive Director, and Kristi Davis, Marketing & Activities Director, **Storm Lake United**, reviewed their past highlights and programs, and presented their funding request for FY'17. They thanked the Board for their support in the past. The amount of their request is \$30,000, which is \$15,000 over their approved amount for this current fiscal year.

Hugh Lively, Executive Director of <u>**RIDES**</u>, presented their annual request for FY'17 of \$10,000, for Capital and Operations, which is \$1,000 under the current FY'16 allocation, and the same \$1,300 request for Dinner Date. The current year funds were used as a local match for capital projects, such as on-board computers for their vehicles, and were also used for operations to provide services to Genesis, Elderbridge, and the general public. Continued funding would ensure that the current level of services would continue in BV County, and would also be used to

provide for a local match for capital projects such as vehicles, radios, and related computer equipment.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Merten, to approve the following <u>reports</u>: FY'15 CAASA Audit Report and NW IA Planning Monitoring Report for fall 2015. Carried.

Security Officer Kelly Snyder stopped in to let the Board know that he is one of three officers hired for <u>Courthouse security</u> that will be visible at the Courthouse on Court days and other occasions.

EMA Director Aimee Barritt and Commission Chairman Jon Kruse reviewed the FY'17 budget, requesting \$48,000 for the agency, which is the same as the current fiscal year allocation, and \$19,625 for HAZMAT. Barritt reviewed the highlights of the past year, and also what she has planned for FY'17.

Kirk Reetz, <u>EMS</u> President, thanked the Board for their past support and requested \$7,500 for FY'17, the same as the amount received in the current fiscal year. The funds received in the past paid for 600 hours of continuing education and saved the balance to pay for new EMT classes starting in January, 2016. Future funds received will be used to pay for EMS training for all EMS providers in BV County, with their first commitment to pay for new provider education and then pay for the continuing education to maintain a current EMS certification, which amounts to 12-72 hours a year depending on the level of certification. The Board thanked Reetz and the EMS Association for what they do, as they provide a valuable service to the residents of Buena Vista County.

Arlin Hinkeldey, <u>Hanover Historical Society</u>, presented their funding request for FY'17. They are requesting \$1,000, the same as the current year. The current funds were used to help pay for the two bands that played at their annual festival, which draws from 700-800 people. The proposed use of the funds would be to help pay for the rental of the tent, which costs about \$1,700. He thanked the Board for their support, and the Board thanked them for what they do for the community.

Matrix Construction Evaluation

Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to approve and to authorize the Chair to sign **<u>Resolution</u>** <u>**2016-01-04-A**</u> adopting the matrix construction evaluation process. Carried.

RESOLUTION #2016-01-04-A CONSTRUCTION EVALUATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors wishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and **WHEREAS,** by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2016 and January 31, 2017 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Buena Vista County Environmental Health/Zoning Director, Kim Johnson or Inspector Steve Haldin, are hereby designated as the contact persons for the county for DNR site investigations for animal confinement building construction applications.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Merten, to approve the <u>utility permit</u> for Interstate Power & Light, along 120th Ave. & 480th St., west and south of Rembrandt, rebuilding existing overhead. Carried.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Huseman, to approve the Stratford Gravel contract to crush at the **<u>Goldsmith Pit</u>**, with a lump sum pumping fee of \$76,980, with a minimum of 250,000 ton crushed at \$3.31/ton, extra dozer fee, if requested at \$192/hr, and if a primary crusher is requested, the fee would be \$231/hr. Carried

<u>Secondary Road Report</u>: They have been plowing a lot of snow, working in the shop, doing repairs; they are getting quotes for larger doors on the East Shop; they are putting specs together for a chassis to replace the current sign truck.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson discussed the current **salary** of Maintenance Supt. Bruce McGowan. Wilkinson stated that McGowan puts in a lot of hours, but is a salaried employee, so doesn't get overtime or comp time. Wilkinson would like to see McGowan get a larger increase over what the other employees receive. Merten would like to see a straight percentage increase for a salaried employee.

Bldg/Grounds Supt. Steve Hammen reviewed Iowa District Court <u>Third Judicial District</u> <u>Administrative Order #2015-1223-18</u>, regarding Courthouse closings. When the Courthouse is closed to the public, due to a holiday or other emergency, the State employees will either work behind closed doors or the employees will take a vacation day. Hammen asked the Board if they were okay with him locking the Courthouse doors when there is a County holiday, such as the upcoming Presidents Day in February. The consensus was to follow the Order, and the Courthouse doors will be locked when the County has a holiday.

Case Management Administrator Alicia Gatzemeyer reviewed the **FY'14 Case Management Cost Settlement** with the Board. FY'14 was the first year of the 23% limitation, and Gatzemeyer had projected the payback amount to be \$67,429.98. The Cost Settlement Report actually shows the payback to be \$67,159.71, which will be paid back to Iowa Medicaid, from the Mental Health Fund. There is \$7,813 of indirect costs that will be paid back to the General Basic Fund from the Mental Health Fund.

<u>Hear the Public</u>: Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson informed the Board that she has received a variance request, so the Board will need to appoint Board of Adjustment members at their meeting next week.

<u>Hear the Public</u>: John Murray updated the Board on the Dakota Access Pipeline, and thanked the Board for appointing members to the Eminent Domain Compensation Commission. Murray stated that Dakota Access is seeking power of eminent domain over some landowners, which will likely be decided in February. Murray stated that land restoration standards will be different with Dakota Access.

In January Captain DeMuth taught an ALICE training with the Alta School District. In March, DeMuth will be training in Sioux Central. A body cam policy is near completion. Sheriff Elston is following Iowa legislation regarding body cam policies. The body cams will be ordered in March and training is planned for April. January's average jail population was 14. Sheriff Elston recognized his jailers and dispatchers for their dedicated work during the last 2 snow storms. Several of the jailers and dispatchers spent 1 or 2 nights at the LEC to make sure the shifts were covered. Deputy Hayes is still at the academy. Sheriff Elston has received good reports on Deputy Hayes' training.

Env Health/Zoning Department update: Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson_stated on February 9th & 10th the DIA did an audit of the Food Inspections Program. This is the first audit the county has had. Eleven deficiencies of 43 were found with 3 of them being major. They were told that they were not writing up enough violations. Johnson will have 60 days to respond. Johnson will be starting work on updating the comp plan and the zoning ordinance. The Env Health/Zoning office continues to do well testing. Recent tests have shown high levels of arsenic in one location. There is a \$1,000 grant that is available for promotion of well testing. Beach monitoring may resume again this summer at Sturchler Pit area and Gabrielson Lake. Testing results are posted on the DNR website. If levels are high, signs are posted at the location.

RESOLUTION TO PARTICIPATE IN STEPPING UP MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year; and

WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are there to three to six times higher than for the general public; and

WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance use disorders; and

WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and, upon release, are at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and

WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and

WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS, Buena Vista County and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and

WHEREAS, Buena Vista County in association with the Rolling Hills Community Services Region has developed and is implementing a jail diversion program; and

WHEREAS, through Stepping Up, the National Association of Counties, The Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails.

NOW, THERFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, THAT BUENA VISTA COUNTY does hereby sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jail, commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in my state and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials, employees, and residents to participate in Stepping Up. We resolve to utilize the comprehensive resources available through Stepping Up to:

Convene or draw on a diverse team of leaders and decision makers from multiple agencies committed to safely reducing the number of people with mental illnesses in jails;

Collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify adults entering jails with mental illnesses and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program and case levels;

Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance abuse disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community;

Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while considering identified barriers;

Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan; and

Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on successes.

Bids were received from Pro Elect, for \$3,293.92, and from Tyco Simplex, for \$6,265. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Huseman, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the bid of Pro Elect for \$3,293.92, for a <u>fire alarm control panel</u> to support the new elevator upgrade. Carried.

The Board moved their meeting to the Public Meeting Room for the <u>DD #34 Lat 6 Public</u> <u>Hearings.</u>

The Chair opened the public hearing on the completion of the **DD #34 Lat 6** project with I & S Kuehl & Payer Engineer Brian Blomme, Drainage Clerk Kristina Konradi, and John Demers present. Engineer Brian Blomme reviewed the history of the project, verified with the Auditor that publication in the newspaper was done, that there were no objections filed, and that there were no claims for crop damages filed. The Auditor responded that she had proof of publication on the public hearing, and that no objections or claims for crop damage had been received. The original contract price was \$166,921.95, the final contract price is \$203,940.45. The increase over the bid estimate was due to a major rain event that caused unstable banks at 11 sites along the facility, requiring additional rip rap to ensure bank stabilization. There were crop damages recommended by Engineer Blomme, totaling \$9,151.40. The Engineer opened it up for questions. Merten asked if the sluffs had been taken care of, and Blomme stated that there are two more that need to be done, but would be taken care of under the District Watchman duties, not under the contract. Demers commented that it doesn't appear that the area was seeded. Blomme stated that he will be watching the area to see if grass grows. Demers also informed Blomme that fence posts and barbed wire were scattered around and needed to be cleaned up.

cleaned up the area, but stated that the contractor needs to be more careful in the future. Blomme recommended the Board consider approve the completion contingent upon investigation for debris removal in Section 12. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to close the public hearing. Carried. Motion by Merten, second by Arends to approve the payment of crop damages as outlined in the crop damages letter to the landowners of <u>DD #34 Lat 6</u>, in the amount of \$9,151.40. Motion by Arends, second by Huseman, to accept the completion report, filed with the Board of Supervisors, for the <u>DD #34 Lat 6</u> project, subject to investigation in Section 12 for debris removal, and authorize the final payment, 30 days from today, in the amount of \$21,589.07. Carried.

The Chair opened the **Public Hearing** on the **DD #34 Lat 6 Annexation** of 342.61 acres of land and right-of-way in 138 parcels, with Engineer Brian Blomme, I & S Group, Drainage Clerk Kristina Konradi, John Demers, and Jeff Chindlund present. Blomme reviewed the information on the proposed annexation, then opened it up for questions. Chindlund had been in to talk with Blomme, about his dad's land in Section 8 of Scott Township. Currently, the Chindlund land is in DD #83, and he didn't realize that land could be in more than one drainage district. Chindlund questioned the flow of the water, and wanted assurance that he can continue to maintain the existing tile, and to be able to add surface tile in the future. Blomme stated that he didn't find any surface pipes on the west line of Section 8, and stated that Chindlund's drainage rights will be maintained in DD #83, and that his assessment will go down in DD #83, but will go up in DD #34 Lat 6 because the water flows that direction. Auditor Lloyd stated that the required notice was published, and no objections were received. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Merten, to close the public hearing. Carried. Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to accept the necessity of annexation and approve the Engineer's Report on Annexation on DD #34 Lat 6, annexing 342.61 acres of land and right-of-way in 138 parcels. Carried.

The Board moved back to the Boardroom to complete the rest of their meeting.

Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to accept and authorize the Chair to sign the bid from CG Contracting, LLC, for \$2,955, for <u>remodeling</u> the supervisor's office at Public Health. Carried.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING FOURTEENTH MEETING, 2016 SESSION (14) MARCH 29, 2016 The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 at 8:30 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Altena presiding, and the following members present: Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg, and with Auditor Susan Lloyd as clerk for the meeting.

Unless otherwise indicated, all of the following **motions** offered at this meeting were carried with the following vote: Ayes: Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays: none. Abstentions: none.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson updated the Board on the IDOT <u>Hwy 7</u> project. Wilkinson attended the informational meeting in Alta, and was able to see the maps and talk with the Engineers about the project. IDOT plans to resurface Hwy 7 from the intersection of Hwy 3 to Northwestern Drive in Storm Lake. The project has an anticipated start date of June 6, with completion by mid-September. Wilkinson requested IDOT to pave a portion of 70th Ave, between the Railroad and Hwy 7, which would be an approximate cost to the County of \$15,000. Huseman commented that it would be good to have that section paved, that it would be a wise investment, as this road had a lot of truck traffic.

Motion by Merten, second by Ringgenberg, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the <u>underground utility permit</u> for Iowa Lakes Regional Water, Spencer, IA, for a 1 ½" water line run under 580th St., between Sections 20/29 of Grant Township, to service 1420 580th St. Carried.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson informed the Board of the consensus of the Secondary Road guys regarding a <u>4-day work week</u> during the summer. The Secondary Road employees are not in favor of a 4-day work week, for various reasons. Currently they have 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour days per week, and they discussed going to 4-10 hour days, or 4-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour days, but they were not interested.

<u>Secondary Road Report</u>: They are still hauling gravel and blading the gravel roads; shouldering machine is out of the shop and the retrievers are on the motor graders; they have a list of entrances that citizens want done and a list of tile to look at.

Early Childhood Iowa Director Annette Koster stated that April is Child Abuse Prevention Month, and requested that the Board sign a Child Abuse Prevention Proclamation and approve planting of pinwheels around the Courthouse. RESOLUTION #2016-03-29-A A PUBLIC NOTICE DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS & FINES ASSESSED

TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS:

Be it resolved, by action of the Board of Supervisors of Buena Vista County, Iowa, that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317.13 and 317.14 2011 Code of Iowa, it is hereby ordered:

1-That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any land in Buena Vista County shall cut, burn, or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this chapter, at such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth of any other weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut or otherwise destroyed on or before the following dates and as often thereafter as is necessary to prevent seed production:

Group 1. June 1, 2016, for Leafy Spurge, Perennial Pepper Grass; Sour Dock; Smooth Dock, Sheep Sorrel, Tall Thistle and Musk Thistle.

Group 2. June 20, 2016, for Canadian Thistle, Russian Knapweed, Buckthorn, Wild Mustard.

Group 3. July 1, 2016, for Horse Nettle, Perennial Sow Thistle, Quack Grass, Butter Print, Puncture Vine, Cocklebur, Bull Thistle, Marijuana (Hemp), Sunflowers, Wild Carrot and Buckhorn Plantain.

2-That each owner and each person in possession or control of any lands in Buena Vista County infested with any noxious weeds including Quack Grass, Perennial Sow Thistle, Canadian Thistle, Field Bindweed, Horse Nettle, Leafy Spurge, Perennial Peppergrass, Russian Knapweed, Poison Hemlock, shall adopt a program of weed destruction described by the Weed Commissioner to destroy and will immediately keep under control such infestations of said noxious weeds.

3-That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Buena Vista County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work, including costs of serving notice and other costs, if any, to be assessed against the real estate upon which the noxious weeds are destroyed.

4-That the County Weed Commissioner be and is hereby directed to cause notice of making and entering of the foregoing order by one publication each of the Official Newspapers of the County.

5-Anyone wishing not to have noxious weeds sprayed in any given area, he or she shall sign an agreement at the County Conservation Office and receive official signs to be posted on each side of the area designated and shall be responsible to destroy such weeds, all season.

PENALTY

Be it further Resolved, that failure to comply by the date prescribed in an order, pursuant to Chapter 317, for destruction of weeds, the weed commission may have the weeds destroyed with the costs assessed back to the owner, or may impose a penalty of \$10.00 per day for each day the owner of the land fails to comply.

Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to accept the necessity of annexation and approve the Engineer's Report on Annexation on DD #35, annexing 448.9 acres of land and right-of-way in 29 parcels. Carried. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to direct the Engineer to proceed with a full reclassification on DD #35 to create new assessment schedules. Carried.

The Chair opened the **Public Hearing** on the **DD #98 Annexation** of 80.6 acres of land and right-of-way in 9 parcels, with Engineer Brian Blomme, I & S Group, Drainage Clerk Kristina Konradi, 7 landowners, and one media present. Blomme reviewed the information on the proposed annexation, and stated that DD #98 is entirely within the boundaries of DD #35, then opened it up for questions. Auditor Lloyd stated that the required notice was published, and no objections were received. Merten asked why there needed to be two drainage districts, #35 and #98, couldn't they be combined? Blomme stated that the Code used to be too cumbersome and very expensive, but that the laws have changed. Blomme stated that in his opinion, there was no

benefit to the added cost of combining the districts, and would not recommend combining districts. Blomme stated that he is willing to review the Code and report back to the Board at a later date. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to close the public hearing. Carried. Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to accept the necessity of annexation and approve the Engineer's Report on Annexation on <u>DD #98</u>, annexing 80.6 acres of land and right-of-way in 9 parcels. Carried. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Merten, to direct the Engineer to proceed with a full reclassification of <u>DD #98</u>, in connection with DD #35. Carried.

I.T. Director Tyler Van Houten requested that the Board allow changing his cell phone reimbursement, rather than coming to him, to having his monthly charge deducted from his paycheck, and the County paying the remainder of bill. Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to approve changing the I.T. Director's <u>cellphone</u>, going from personal to County phone, with \$25 deducted from Van Houten's paycheck, and the County paying the remainder of the bill. Carried.

There being no further business, motion by Huseman, second by Altena, to adjourn the meeting at 12:14 p.m. until Tuesday, April 5, at 8:30 a.m. for a regular session.

A full investigation with survey and an Engineer's Report for the open ditch from the M50 crossing to the bulkhead structure. This portion of the main open Ditch is upstream from all 9 lateral ditches of the District. Their investigation found approximately 10,195 acres of landing draining to DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch. Their investigation has confirmed the drainage capacity of DD #34 Upper MOD is impaired and that the overall condition of the ditch banks, surface and tile outlet pipes is poor. Therefore, they recommend a full cleanout of the open ditch to restore the capacity of the channel to its original efficiency and maximize the outlet capacity of the existing tile systems outletting to this open ditch facility. Annexation and reclassification is also necessary. The estimated cost of construction, improvement, right-of-way acquisition of 33.21 acres, annexation of 8,524 acres, reclassification, and project warrant interest is \$643,654.00. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to tentatively approve the Engineer's Report on DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch, and to set the date of time of the Public Hearing for July 19, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in the Storm Lake City Council Chambers. Carried.

Also noted, a portion of DD #106 is contained within the watershed of DD #34 Lat 6, however, the Commissioners Report only establishes the assessment schedule for DD #34 Lat 6. The assessment schedule is set at \$327,000, and the actual cost of repairs is \$366,994.00. Blomme recommends a 1.2 levy factor. Blomme read the objection letter from Randy McKibben, stating that his parcel is last to drain, when there is a rain event, and stated that he has a tile issue. Blomme informed McKibben that he will investigate the tile issue. The other two letters were receive from Linda Boettcher and Karla Fegley, who are additional owners of land with McKibben, and they are not receiving notices. Konradi and Blomme stated that the current software will only allow 1 address for mailing notices and taxes, but are hoping that the new real estate software will allow multiple addresses to be listed. McKibben also asked Blomme about how his assessments would be on DD #106 compared to DD #34 Lat 6, and Blomme stated that they are two different assessment schedules, and that McKibben's assessment would be a lot less on DD #106 compared to DD #34 Lat 6. They have had 38 clients served at the Crisis Stabilization home in Sac City; they have successfully implemented jail diversion in 6 of the 7 counties, and have served 68 persons; they started multi-entity supported employment program, with 33 persons having found community employment, and 3 enclaves have been developed; the transitional services have started at the Vail Rectory, with the Region paying the start up costs, renovating the facility, and covering the costs of administration and operating expenses, with plans to open August 1, 2016.

Pastor Howard Avery met with the Board to discuss the 99 County Bible Reading Marathon and the Proclamation that was signed by Governor Branstad. The plan is to have individuals read the Bible out loud, on the Courthouse grounds, in 15 minute increments, from 8 a.m.-4 p.m., from June 30 – July 3. Avery has asked the Board to waive the \$200 application fee, and stated they won't be needing electricity. <u>Section 4</u>. If at any time during the 2016-17 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriation she shall immediately so inform the Board and recommend appropriate corrective action.

<u>Section 5</u>. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amount charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers monthly during the FY2016-17 budget year. The Auditor shall also provide a summary report of all departments to the Board monthly.

<u>Section 6</u>. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business June 30, 2017.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETIN THIRTY-FIRST MEETING, 2016 SESSION (31) JULY 19, 2016

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in special session on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at 8:30 A.M. in the Boardroom with Vice-Chairman Merten presiding, and the following members present: Arends, Huseman, and Ringgenberg, and with Auditor Susan Lloyd as clerk for the meeting. Absent: Altena.

Unless otherwise indicated, all of the following <u>motions</u> offered at this meeting were carried with the following vote: Ayes: Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays: none. Abstentions: none.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson informed the Board of a <u>Cooperative At-Grade Crossing Surface</u> <u>Repair Project Cost Agreement</u> with the Railroad fixing the crossing on 70th Ave, by Hubbard Feeds, with the County cutting the asphalt for their work to be done, and then the County replacing the asphalt, and reimbursing the Railroad for the enhanced crossing materials at a cost of \$17,682.00. The Board wanted Wilkinson to ask the railroad if this project could get done now, while the road is already closed.

<u>Secondary Road Report</u>: They started on road pull-ups last week; they are blading, and struggling north and west of Alta due to the Hwy 7 closure and drivers using the gravel roads; mowers are going, they are most of the way through the second mowing of hard surface; they are working on entrances, entrance pipes, and tile repairs;

The Board moved their meeting to Storm Lake City Hall Council Chambers for their public hearing on **DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch**.

The Vice-Chair opened the Public Hearing on the DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch Engineer's Report for proposed repairs/improvements, with Engineers Ivan Droessler and Brian Blomme, I & S Group, and 51 landowners present. The Auditor confirmed that the notice was published as required. Several objection letters were received, and these letters will be kept with the DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch drainage records. Blomme reviewed the history of DD #34 Upper Main miles long, and benefits 10,195 acres. Blomme stated that the Open Ditch, which is 9.9 Supervisors had received a petition for cleanout from landowners in the north portion of the watershed around Marathon. The Engineer has recommended a separation of the facility. Only those property owners, owning land which will drain through the proposed repaired facility will be asked to pay for those construction repairs. In conjunction with the repairs, the Board will also consider annexation of parcels currently not on the assessment schedule and reclassification for the drainage district. An evaluation of the district schedule found many parcels draining to the open ditch which have never paid a drainage assessment since the establishment of the District in 1917. The cost of these proceedings will be assessed back to the entire DD #34, which is approximately 149,700 acres. One landowner stated that he worried about having their drainage districts shut down due to the Des Moines Water Works lawsuit. Droessler stated that the landowners still have the obligation to pay for maintenance of existing tile systems. The total estimated cost of the project is \$644,504, which includes acquiring an additional 33.21 acres of right-of-way, which would be removed from the benefit acres on the assessment schedule. The average cost per assess acre would be \$63.22, with the average cost per watershed acre for 10 years being \$6.32. The average cost of reclassification, which would be paid by all landowners in DD #34, would be \$4/acre. Storm Lake water drains to the North Raccoon River, which is DD #34. A separate discussion has to take place with the City of Storm Lake about their storm water management assessment. One landowner was complaining about drainage coming down from Clay County to BV County, causing tile issues. Several objection letters were read, pertaining to this project, with the Board addressing each objection separately: Robert Raymer filed an objection for a financial burden. Droessler recommended the Board dismiss the objection. Motion by Huseman, second by Arends to dismiss the objection of Robert Raymer, on the basis that the repair is within normal financial burden. Carried. Diane Rettig filed an objection based on financial burden. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to dismiss the objection of Diane Rettig. Arends stated that the Board is charged by Code as Trustees of these districts, so when they become aware of repair, they do it. Carried. Roberta Paguin filed an objection based on financial burden. Motion by Huseman, second by Arends to dismiss the objection of Robert Paguin. Carried. Daryl Gengler filed an objection based on financial burden. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg to dismiss the objection of Daryl Gengler. Ringgenberg commented that the objections will be noted, but the Board is required to make the repairs by State Law. Carried. Merten commented that this isn't the first time to do this process, they don't have a crystal ball,

that the return will come back to us with better yields with better drains. Tim & Kathy Heuton filed an objection due to financial burden. Motion by Arends, second by Huseman to dismiss the objection of Tim & Kathy Heuton. Carried. Doris Fondroy filed a comment letter, not an objection, so it will be kept on file. Others that filed objections, but are outside of the construction area included: Greg Porter, Helen Porter, Joe Jensen, Gail Moore, Bill Mason, Ann Jorgensen, Beverly McMcGriff (withdrawn as her issues were addressed), Cynthia Martinek, Lillian Leonard, and Dane Bogaard. These letters will all be kept on file, and will be addressed at future hearings. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to close the public hearing. Carried. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Huseman, to accept the DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch Engineer's Report, as filed. Carried. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to adopt the repair plan on DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch, and to direct the Engineer to proceed. Carried. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to direct the engineer to prepare the necessary plans and specifications, obtain the necessary permits, and proceed toward a bid letting on DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch. Carried. Motion by Arends, second by Huseman, to adopt a Resolution of Necessity for the annexation of additional lands in to DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch. Carried. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to initiate acquisition of additional right-of-way for DD #34 Upper Main Open Ditch. Carried. Motion by Huseman, second by Arends, to initiate reclassification proceedings. Carried.

The Board moved back to their Boardroom to continue their meeting.

The Board placed a phone call to Calhoun County Board of Supervisors, to discuss the application from DAPL for construction of a hazardous liquid pipeline over, across, or beneath County drainage districts. Present from Calhoun County were Supervisors Mike Cooper and Gary Nicholson, and Auditor Judy Howrey. Calhoun County stated that they would like to see the crossing fee stay with the County where the crossing is, and not split it amongst the Joint Counties. Motion by Gary Nicholson, second by Mike Cooper, to approve and authorize the BV County Board to sign the DAPL application to cross <u>Jt. DD #16-30-92</u>, and to allow BV County to keep the crossing fee. Carried. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends to approve and authorize Calhoun County to sign the DAPL application to cross <u>Jt. DD #181</u>, and to allow Calhoun County to keep the crossing fee. Carried.

The Vice-Chair opened the public hearing on a new <u>MMP</u> for E & A Livestock Farms, LLC, in Section 13 of Barnes Township with Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson. Johnson stated that Ehlers were here, but since the public hearing was late, Kevin, Adam, and Eric Ehlers left. This is for a 250 animal unit or 100,000 chicken pullet facility, which is under the Master Matrix. Motion by Arends, second by Huseman, to close the public hearing. Carried.

Unless otherwise indicated, all of the following <u>motions</u> offered at this meeting were carried with the following vote: Ayes: Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays: none. Abstentions: none.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to <u>amend today's agenda</u> by adding an additional action item, to void and reissue a lost stamped drainage warrant. Carried.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson presented the <u>underground utility permit application</u> for Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative, Estherville, IA, for a single phase line, bored under C49, between Sections 27 and 34 of Coon Township. The Board questioned the application, since a previous one had been approved for the same location. Wilkinson will check on this, and let the Board know later in their meeting.

Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to approve the <u>underground utility permit</u> for Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative, Estherville, IA, for a single phase line to replace the overhead with underground, bored under 540th St. in Section 33, Elk Township. Carried.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson discussed the **<u>Hudson Street property</u>**. Wilkinson received information from Webster County on their most recent bid letting for two buildings to be built. The Webster County bid came to 3.8 million dollars, approximately \$100/sq foot. Wilkinson is waiting for information from the Assessor's Office on the current shop on Hudson St.

Secondary Road Report: The hard surface roads have been mowed twice, and they still have two townships left to mow on gravel roads; they are blading, doing driveways, and tile repairs; Wilkinson attended the pre-construction meeting on C63, and there is an August 15 date to start the cold-in-place, which may start the week before; while the company is here, and the cold-in-place is done on C63, they will do the same to the road by Truesdale and the Marathon Park Road; they are driving pile on the bridge project in Grant Township.

GIS Coordinator Eric Chase discussed the <u>HIPAA compliance agreement</u>, with Compliancy Group, that was previously brought to the Board by I.T. Director Tyler Van Houten. The cost would be \$3,000 for the first location and an additional \$600 for each additional building to be covered by the HIPAA agreement. Chase suggested setting up a webinar with this company, so that the Board could hear directly from them what they can provide for services. The Board requested that I.T. Director Tyler Van Houten contact the HIPAA compliance company that is working for the Rolling Hills Region, and see what their costs would be. No action was taken today on the agreement.

Motion by Merten, second by Arends, to accept the Assessor's recommendation for allowance of the **2016 Homestead/Military Credit List** and the **2016 Disabled Homestead Credit List**, and the disallowance list of 14 **2016 Homestead Tax Credits**, as per Iowa Code Section 425.3. Carried.

Motion by Arends, second by Huseman, to **void and reissue** stamped warrant #185435, issued 5/17/15 to Dean's D & G Corporation, for \$889.02, as it has been lost. Carried

Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson introduced her <u>**new employee**</u>, Jason Butler, who started today.

Captain Marty DeMuth informed the Board that the Sheriff's Department is still not sure what Albert City is going to do, regarding their <u>law enforcement contract</u>. Captain Rob Danielson was also present for the discussion. Albert City has questions as to whether they would still get service if they went over the 30 hours, and the Sheriff assured them they would, the hours are not a problem. Two supervisors attended the Albert City Council meeting last night, but no action was taken.

Captain DeMuth asked the Board for permission to take sealed bids for the airboat. Motion by Merten, second by Ringgenberg, to declare the Sheriff's <u>airboat</u> as excess property, and allow the Sheriff's department to dispose of the property as they see fit. Carried.

Engineer Brian Blomme, I & S Group, informed the Board that after last week's public hearing on DD #34 Upper Main, one of the landowners informed him of Clay County's DD #32 that drains 2,700 acres into BV County's DD #34 MOD, in the SW-NW, Section 4, Poland Township. The DD #34 BV records do not have anything pertaining to DD #32 Clay, and the BV Drainage Plat Book does not show the facilities of DD #32 Clay, or its outlet. However, the Clay County DD# 32 Tile District outlets to DD #34 MOD. Clay County produced an agreement on DD #32, dated August 5, 1975, that outlines the financial responsibilities of DD #32 Clay County to DD #34 BV

County, for maintenance and repairs. Blomme is considering surface drainage, as he doesn't want to be short on sizing. Blomme would like to see a cost estimate of the 1 ½ miles of ditch, and to get separate bid items to get a cost split of the 1 ½ miles of the open ditch. According to the agreement, there is a 50% cost share on the 1 ½ miles of Clay County DD #32 outletting into DD #34 BV County. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to authorize Drainage Attorney Gary Armstrong to prepare notice to Clay County, of the DD #34 MOD project that was approved last week. Carried.

Blomme mentioned to the Board that the tile investigations on the **Dakota Access Pipeline** project will start today in the SE corner of Calhoun County.

Dave Mortensen talked to the Board about **DD #132**, he thinks that it needs work done to it. His land is in Section 22, Nokomis Township. Also present was Pat Stokes, Deb Mortensen, Allen Fredericksen, and Keith Geyer. This drainage district is 96 years old. Engineer Brian Blomme, I & S Group, was also present for the discussion and answered questions. Mortensen would like to put in a waterway, and asked if that would be an improvement to the District. Blomme stated that anyone can put in a waterway, with the landowner maintaining it, not the drainage district. If someone files a petition, for an improvement, and if the Board approves putting in a waterway, then it will be a facility of the District. Mortensen asked if terraces could be included in the improvement, and Blomme stated that it typically isn't included. Mortensen was in favor of putting in an intake to the county tile, which Blomme stated is typically the responsibility of the landowner. The Board gave Mortensen the authority to put in his own waterway and terrace in, along with an intake, if that is what he wants to do. If he doesn't want to do the work himself, then the process will have to start with an improvement project that will be a 2-2 ½ year project. Blomme stated that the group works well together and would be better off doing the work themselves, than to spend a lot of money for an improvement.

Ayes: Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, Ringgenberg. Motion carried. A conference call took place with Sac and Calhoun Counties to discuss outstanding legal bills for the Des Moines Water Works lawsuit. In attendance by telephone were as follows: from Buena Vista County, Tom Huseman, Dale Arends, Paul Merten, Rhonda Ringgenberg and Don Altena, Supervisors, Sue Lloyd, Auditor and Gary Armstrong, Drainage Attorney; from Calhoun County, Mike Cooper, Scott Jacobs and Gary Nicholson, Supervisors, Judy Howrey, Auditor and Dave Wollenzien, Drainage Attorney; and from Sac County, Dean Stock, Rick Hecht and Ranell Drake, Supervisors, Renee Roland, Deputy Auditor and Colin McCullough, Drainage Attorney.

Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to go out of **closed session** at 11:40 a.m. Carried.

Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to authorize payment to the Belin McCormick Law Firm in the amount of \$250,000.00 to be paid from the <u>Sac County Legal Defense Fund</u>. Ayes all. Motion carried. It was noted that Sac and Calhoun Counties will both pass an identical motion in their board meetings today, as well. Gary Armstrong stated that he was pleased to have the amount paid to Belin, that the amount is due, and that part of the amount has been reduced by Belin McCormick, and that they are doing their part in helping the tax payers of the three counties.

There being no further business, motion by Huseman, second by Arends, to adjourn the meeting at 11:44 a.m. until Tuesday, August 9, at 8:30 a.m. for a regular session. There will not be a meeting on August 2.

The Buena Vista County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, August 9, 2016 at 8:30 A.M. in the Boardroom with Chairman Altena presiding, and the following members present: Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg, and with Auditor Susan Lloyd as clerk for the meeting.

Unless otherwise indicated, all of the following <u>motions</u> offered at this meeting were carried with the following vote: Ayes: Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays: none. Abstentions: none.

Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the <u>utility</u> <u>permit</u> of MidAmerican Energy, Fort Dodge, IA, for an overhead primary conductors and poles from the intersection of 620th St. and 170th Ave., 2,122' east on the north side of 620th St. to the new pipeline. Carried.

Engineer Bret Wilkinson received information from the Assessor's Office regarding their two lots on the **<u>Hudson St. maintenance shed</u>** location. The two lots are contiguous, and the Assessor

would value the property at \$212,840. Arends asked Wilkinson to come up with a proposal of what would be needed at the location, so the Board can determine whether to move forward or not.

Roger Radke, representing the <u>Alta Trails Committee</u> presented a map of the proposed route though Alta. Pam Henderson, Chair of the Committee was also present for the discussion. They would like to use County road ROW along 2 ditches. The Chairman opened the **Public Hearing** on the new **MMP** for Glienke Turkey Farm in Section 11 of Maple Valley Township with Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson and one media present. This is for 5 buildings, for 972 animal units, or 54,000 turkeys, which is under the Master Matrix. Motion by Merten, second by Arends, to close the public hearing. Ayes: Altena, Arends, Merten, and Ringgenberg. Nays: None. Abstain: Huseman. Motion carried.

Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson asked the Board to appoint Brian Blomme to the Board of Health, replacing Jason Butler, who is her new employee. Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to appoint Brian Blomme to the **Board of Health**, replacing Jason Butler, with his term expiring 12/31/17. Ayes: Altena, Arends, Huseman, Merten. Nays: None. Abstention: Ringgenberg. Motion carried.

Storm Lake City Administrator Jim Patrick, discussed the <u>North Raccoon River Watershed</u> <u>Management Authority Informational Meeting</u>. Patrick would like to have the County's support and act as an inviter for Counties, Cities, and Conservation Districts, to attend the informational meeting scheduled for September 8th in Lake City. The purpose of the meeting is to put together a WMA (Water Management Authority). The Board gave their approval to be listed as an inviter on the invitation.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to approve the <u>minutes</u> of 7/26, as corrected, today's <u>claims approval list</u>, and the following <u>reports</u>: Recorder's Report of Fees Collected (Apr-June), FY'16 Report of Activities for Veterans Affairs, July Sheriff's Report of Fees Collected, FY'15 Rolling Hills Region Audit Report, August Safety minutes. Carried.

Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to correct the minutes of the 7/19/16 DD #34 Hearing, and the motions that were made for the Resolution of Necessity for annexation, to initiate acquisition of additional ROW, and to initiate reclassification proceedings, which should have all been for <u>DD #34 MOD</u>, and not DD #34 Upper MOD. Carried.

Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to declare a desk at Public Health as <u>excess</u> <u>equipment</u>, and allow them to dispose of the desk. Merten questioned whether it should be taken to the warehouse, and kept for an auction. Carried.

Motion by Merten, second by Arends, to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the **Drainage District Consent Agreement with IDOT and DD #34**, regarding their IA Hwy 3 bridge project over the Raccoon River. Carried.

DHS Social Work Supervisor Tom Jorgensen, presented <u>security issues</u> @ DHS. Bldg/Grounds Supt. Steve Hammen was also present for the discussion. Jorgensen stated that they had an issue a month ago, with threats made to some DHS personnel, and so Jorgensen was asking what could be done for more security. Hammen stated that there are alarms in place, panic buttons, and they are tested to be sure they are working. Hammen mentioned putting a camera in their front office, so in case there was an incident, it would be recorded. Merten commented that maybe the security officers could also make a presence at DHS and walk through once in awhile.

Conservation Director/Weed Commissioner Greg Johnson gave a <u>department update</u>. For the <u>Conservation Department</u>, they are working on general maintenance; the Linn Grove shower house will be the next thing to work on; they hosted a 4-county float from Linn Grove to Peterson, it was well attended, and people really enjoyed it; August 27 is the open house for the cabin, with a ribbon cutting at 1:00 p.m. For the <u>Weed Department</u>, they received 8 formal complaints this year, and sent out three letters to people; they held the District Weed Commissioners meeting in BV County. Johnson mentioned that his employees paid for their meals, inside the County, and so he was asking if the Board would approve their meal reimbursement for this meeting. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to approve the employee <u>meal reimbursements</u> for the Weed Department employees who attended the District Weed Commissioners meeting. Carried.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the letter to Citizen's First National Bank, listing the departmental <u>VISA credit cards</u>, with their limit amounts. Carried.

Motion by Huseman, second by Ringgenberg, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the FY'17 pledge letter to **NW IA Regional Housing Trust Fund, Inc.** in the amount of \$9,410. Carried

Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to approve the <u>ISG Field Services</u> invoice for inspection services for the DAPL project, in the amount of \$69,600.41, with payment to be made after receiving the funds from DAPL. Carried.

Hear the Public: Bldg/Grounds Supt. Steve Hammen informed the Board that he plans to **retire** this year, and will be giving his notice September 27th, with his last work day being December 2nd, and taking vacation until January 5, 2017. Hammen would like to have someone hired by November 14 or 21, so that he has some time to work with them.

The Board took up the discussion of action taken by the Board of Health, granting an additional raise to the **Public Health Department** Sheriff Elston, Treasurer Sherie Elbert, and Deputy Auditor Leigh Madsen were also present for the discussion. Merten asked for this to come to the table. He talked with the County attorney to see what the Board's role is, which comes down to the budget. Timing is a concern, with this being the 2nd pay raise for Public Health in the first two pay periods since the start of the fiscal year. Ringgenberg, who is also a member of the Board of

Health, informed the Board that this increase of salary and benefits amounts to \$21,824. A wage review was completed by the Nurse Administrator and Ringgenberg, and reviewed with data collected from other agencies and county departments. After review, the Board of Health approved a \$1 per hour increase for nurses, 50 cents per hour for the Family STEPS workers, 50 cents per hour for the Home Care Aides, \$1 per hour for the Fiscal Manager, and 50 cents per hour for the Assistant Administrator. Ringgenberg commented that the additional cost to the agency can be absorbed into several different line items and also by the three new grants, two that have started and one that will start in October. Ringgenberg also noted that a large portion of the grants are for salaries, due to the extra work that is created. Merten didn't like the way that this happened, stating that if other departments want to raise a salary, they come to the Board of Supervisors first before it happens, but Board of Health didn't do that. Ringgenberg stated that the Board of Supervisors isn't in control of the Health Department salaries, only the budget. Merten stated that all departments have increased duties, but don't get extra, as sees this as problematic, he is not in favor of widening the gap. Arends stated that in the case of giving the assistant county attorneys raises, the County Attorney didn't get a raise, only his assistants, and that this is different, as they are giving a raise to the Nurse Administrator too. Altena commented that he doesn't like the timing of the raises, and stated that the pay variations cause ill feelings. Merten stated that the Board of Supervisors are stewards of the public dollars, and he will remember this at budget time.

<u>Supervisor Meeting Reports:</u> Merten updated the Board, stating that he and Dean Stock (Sac County) requested money from IDDA to go to the Sac County Defense Fund, to pay for more bills. IDDA will be sending \$70,000 to Sac County for the Defense Fund.

There being no further business, motion by Huseman, second by Altena, to adjourn the meeting at 12:05 p.m. until Tuesday, August 23, at 8:30 a.m. for a regular session. (No meeting is planned for August 16)

Secondary Road Report: They are continuing to mow and blade roads; they are hauling rock to the gravel roads; hauled rock to the Mackay stockpile; there is less traffic on the County roads since Hwy 7 is now open; the railroad crossing at Hubbard Feeds didn't get done before the State finished Hwy 7, now it won't get done until the end of September or first part of October; they are still working on driveways; they are going to work on pulling up the shoulders on 50th Ave. for 1 mile south of C65; the Dakota Access Pipeline hasn't started digging in Calhoun County, but the permit has been approved for the boring machine, and it will start in Calhoun County first; and the Pipeline has started building their temporary driveways.

Vice-Chairman Merten stepped out of the meeting, and Chairman Altena conducted the meeting.

Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to approve the <u>minutes</u> of 8/9, as corrected, and the following <u>reports</u>: July Clerk of Court Report of Fees Collected, July Solid Waste Commission minutes, July Auditors Compilation Report for Solid Waste Commission, August Department Head minutes, June Storm Lake United minutes and August Business Recruitment Committee minutes. County Attorney Dave Patton reviewed with the Board, the 28E Agreement with the City of Storm Lake on collection of delinquent court debt. They have been collecting on the City's behalf, but there wasn't a document giving them the authority. Out of the fines collected, the State gets 90% and the City gets 10%, and of that 10%, the City will pay the County 20%. Carried.

The Board tabled the review of the job description for the Bldg/Grounds Supt. position.

Motion by Merten, second by Huseman, to appoint the following members to the <u>BV County</u> <u>Wellness Committee</u>: Mona Mason, Jen Hemmingsen, Rhonda Ringgenberg, and Dale Arends, with Leigh Madsen being the point of contact between the Wellness Committee and Rock Valley Health. Carried.

Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to declare the DYMO LabelWriter Twin Turbos, in the Auditor's Office, as **excess equipment**, and allow them to sell them to other counties for use in their Election Departments, or to offer to other offices in the Courthouse. Carried.

<u>Hear the Public</u>: Richard Marshall stopped in to urge the Supervisors of BV, Calhoun, and Sac Counties to stick together in the DMWW lawsuit

Motion by Huseman, second by Arends, to approve the <u>Law Enforcement Contract</u> with the City of Albert City for FY'17. Carried.

I.T. Director Tyler Van Houten presented two quotes that he has received for <u>HIPAA compliance</u> <u>consulting services</u> and training. Midwest Compliance Associates is currently working with

Rolling Hills Region on their HIPAA compliance, and they proposed a flat fee of \$17,500 for the first years, and billed on an hourly basis for subsequent years. A phone call was made to Jim Glidden, of Compliancy Group, for a slide presentation of their proposal, using an online system called The Guard. Nurse Administrator Pam Bogue, was also present for the presentation and discussion. The proposal of Compliancy Group, to work for BV County in the HIPAA policy and training work, would be \$3,000 plus \$600 for each additional location. It is an online program, providing the tools to identify gaps and put remediation plans into action while simultaneously tracking progress. The Board would like to wait until next week, and in the meantime, Van Houten will send the contract to the County Attorney for review, and check with other counties to see who might also contract with this company, and will also verify the final contract price.

Engineer Brian Blomme, ISG, introduced their newest employee Ross Tuttle, who will be helping out in the drainage field. Blomme was present to update the Board on the <u>DD #34 Upper MOD</u> project. After the public hearing, there was a gentleman that stated that there was a drainage district in Clay County that drains in to DD #34 Upper MOD. Blomme discovered the agreement, from 1971, which states that Clay County DD #32 would pay for 50% of the cost of district repairs in the mile and a half that comes in to DD #34 Upper MOD. DD #32 Clay County has approximately 2,700 acres that drain in to DD #34 Upper MOD of BV County. Blomme reviewed the sizing that he is using for the district, but stated that it isn't known what the sizing is of the private crossing. Blomme is recommending a single 84" tile, and stated that it is in the best interest to have the district remove the pipe. Normally the responsibility of replacing the pipe is with the landowner, but recommends that the Board consider that the District participate in 50% of the cost with the landowner to replace the pipe, which would be \$6,000-\$7,000 to each.

Engineer Brian Blomme, ISG, asked the Board for permission to contact the City of Storm Lake, proposing that the assessment of DD #34 MOD be paid for by the Storm Water Agreement for all of the residents of Storm Lake. Motion by Arends, second by Huseman, to authorize Engineer Brian Blomme, ISG, to start having discussions with the City of Storm Lake about using their Storm Water Agreement to pay for the **DD #34 MOD** assessments for the residents of Storm Lake. Carried.

A drainage petition for DD #73 Lat 1 was filed in the Auditor's Office by Lance Wedeking (operator) and Delphine Demers (owner) for the NW ¼ in Section 18 of Grant Township, stating that the area is subject to overflow, or too wet for cultivation or subject to erosion or flood danger. Motion by Arends, second by Ringgenberg, to appoint Engineer Brian Blomme, ISG, to perform a field investigation of <u>DD #73</u> and report back to the Board. Carried. Env Health/Zoning Director Kim Johnson informed the Board that she received a construction permit application for a confinement animal feeding operation expansion for the Rod Wells Finishing Site (Timberline Farms), in Section 25 of Newell Township, which will be a Master Matrix. Motion by Altena, second by Arends, to set a public hearing on the **Master Matrix** of Rod Wells Finishing Site (Timberline Farms), for a confinement animal feeding operation expansion, in Section 25 of Newell Township, or Tuesday, September 13, at 9:00 a.m. Carried.

Agent Steve Stille, Stille Pierce & Pertzborn Agency, presented the <u>cyber liability insurance</u> <u>policy</u> quote to the Board, and reviewed each of the sections. Stille also introduced Michael Pertzborn II and Tony Pertzborn, who will become partners in the Agency in January, when he retires. Michael Pertzborn II will be handling the County's property and casualty insurance after Stille's retirement. No action was taken on the cyber liability insurance quote, but it will be on the agenda for August 30th.

There being no further business, motion by Arends, second by Altena, to adjourn the meeting at 11:30 a.m. until Tuesday, August 30, at 8:30 a.m. for a special session.

Johnson reviewed the Master Matrix, explaining the points. There are 440 points needed to pass, and Nokomis Finisher Farm received 445 points, and is above the minimum requirements for air, water, and community. There was one written comment received from Ricky L. Peterson, stating that this will do substantial damage to his property, due to the odor. Peterson's family raises show pigs and is concerned about the risk of disease to these show pigs. Steve Carlson commented that he has asthma, and also stated that there is a culvert that the water goes directly in to the creek. Chris Niehaus had five points that he covered: air quality, with large fans sending fumes in to the air constantly; the enormous growth of fly population in that mile; the possibility and probably of water quality issues; the high truck traffic on the county roads; and the impact on property values. Niehaus stated that there have been other counties that have sent a "no" recommendation the DNR, due to the opposition. Niehaus stated that if this was a family operation, he might feel differently, but they are only doing this for the manure. Chuck Ryherd owns land in the area and wants to be there for a number of years, but doesn't like the confinement when there is no interest in hogs, only for the fertilizer. Ryherd would like the farmer to reconsider relocating the confinement to their own area. Merten commented that this is a service to the County, even though the ultimate decision is up to the DNR. Carlson thanked the Board for having this public hearing. Motion by Ringgenberg, second by Arends, to close the public hearing. Carried. Motion by Arends, second by Merten, to recommend disapproval of the construction application, due to the public input and the road, bridge, and water table issues. Carried. Johnson will prepare the resolution for the Chairman to sign, and present it later for signature approval.

When a structure is that close to the waterway and has deep pit storage concerns half to arise at to the quality of water and what impact these structures will have on the quality of water.

Truck Traffic, these roads are narrow and sharp corners, with little gravel on them. The cost of maintaining these are going to be significant. There are several bridges in the area that have weigh limits, and to add semi-truck traffic at one to three times a week will add tremendous burden on the roads.

Impact on the neighbors' property values. It has been shown that property values decrease 30 to 40 percent when a new confinement is added.

Changes to the contract included: when there is an orphan spill, the County will no longer be charged an hourly rate, only charged for expendable supplies; Sioux City will now direct bill the spiller; Sioux City will come four times per year, for 4 hours, to teach a class, have a refresher class, or meet with responders and facilities. The negative side of the contract, the price is going up. The County is currently paying .85 per capita, and with this new 10 year contract, it will go to .90/capita for two years, .95/capita for the next two years, and then going to \$1.00/capital for the remaining six years. Motion by Merten, second by Arends, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the <u>28E HAZMAT Agreement</u> with the City of Sioux City, pending review from the County Attorney. Carried.

Conservation Director/Weed Commissioner informed the Board that they have received a **<u>Community Foundation Grant</u>** for \$15,912, to be used for the Linn Grove shower house project.

This would include hiring a full-time employee, insurance and benefits, a pickup, and hydro seeder. <u>Secondary Road Report</u>: The crew was out late Friday moving snow, but not on Saturday, Sunday, or Monday; the rain cleared the snow off of the gravel roads; they are cleaning off equipment today, changing blades and hauling gravel; the shop is very busy with equipment services and breakdowns.

Motion by Huseman, second by Arends, to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the gravel site **<u>stockpile lease</u>** on M27, formerly called Archie Mackay stockpile, with Lori Discher, for a 3-year period, from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019, at \$125/year. Carried.

The time arrived for the bid letting on <u>Project #LFM-B-M50(5)--7X-11</u>, for a bridge on M50 between Sections 33/34 of Lee Township.
